Deadline Set On Return of Spin Ballots

Magie Valley potato growers were reminded Wednesday by John S. Peltushen, Sr., Kimberly, that ballots in the referendum on the proposed potato marketing agreement and order program must be mailed so as to be postmarked by May 5.

Peltushen, a member of the Idaho and Eastern Oregon potato committees, stated, with urge all potato growers to vote on the amendments. "There are some very important changes proposed in the order which should be very beneficial to the potato industry in Idaho."

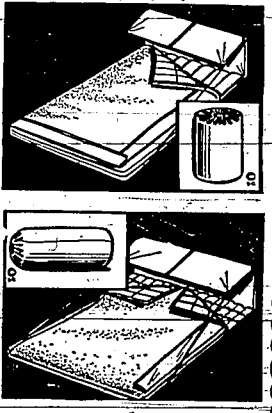

12 Years in Hospital Haven't Changed Ezra Pound's Ideas

WASHINGTON, May 1 (AP)—The poet Ezra Pound, may be free to change his address from St. Elizabeth's Hospital, but 12 years there haven't changed his opinions.

He hopes to return to Italy where he lived for almost 40 years before being brought back here for a trial that never came off.

Pound now is 72, and in his open-necked shirt, his green cotton trousers and his half-foxed brown hair, he was hard to visualize as the man who many critics think had the most profound and helpful influence on this nation's literature.

"This is a historic occasion," Pound said, as he grasped Burdick's hand.

Then in a rambling disjointed 75-minute, Pound touched on such subjects as:

Those Italian broadcasts—Here Pound hit into Franklin D. Roosevelt. "The mildest judgment of Roosevelt is that he was a fool."

A traitor—"Darned lies, I never told the troops not to fight."

Robert Frost, the poet who worked hard to get Pound free—"He ain't been in much of a hurry."

The biographer, Catherine Drinkwater Boone—Her lives of John Adams and of Sir Edward Coke, the British

Just, are worth all the history that is being taught in all the universities."

"Dwight D. Eisenhower — I know. He invited me to dinner once. Yes, when he was president of Columbia. I was a member of the Academy of Social and Political Sciences. He didn't know what he was signing. I was in the hell-hole when Pound's term for St. Elizabeth's—"at the time."

His own health—"I can hold my breath. I'm tired. Overholser, Elizabeth's superintendent is absolutely correct. I was too exhausted to think."

As for Burdick, he disclosed he

never had read a line of Pound's poetry. His own taste, he said, ran more to Edgy Allan Poe.

"But I'm against people being railroaded in these affairs," Burdick said. "There's no question the fellow was off, but that was no reason to lock him up without letting him talk."

Car Output Is 750,000 Less Than in 1957

DETROIT, May 1—Passenger car output in the first week of the year was 750,000 less than in the same week of 1957, according to figures released today by the U. S. Department of Commerce.

Last week's car assemblies numbered 53,814 units, lowest weekly total in six years, excepting for holiday and model changeover periods. In the same 1957 week the industry built 123,033 cars. Output for the week ending April 10 in 1957 was 57,111. The Chevrolet division at sharply reduced levels, General Motors 21,722 cars last week against 46,968 the preceding week and 35,266 in the same 1957 week. So far this year GM has built 832,894 cars compared to 1,062,722 in 1957.

Chrysler made 10,900 cars last week against 11,600 the preceding week and 12,200 in the same 1957 week. So far this year Chrysler has made 292,093 cars against 473,211 in 1957.

American Motors, continuing to work contrary to industry trends, built 4,000 cars last week against 3,330 the preceding week and 2,238 in the same 1957 week. So far this year the company has built 24,029 cars compared with 24,029 in 1957.

Studebaker-Packard made 45 Packards and 915 Studebakers last week.

A hearing of the petition is set for 10:30 a.m. May 14.

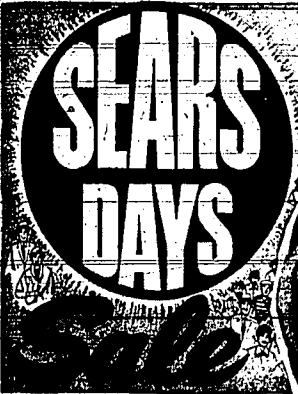

Men Bag 21 Bobcats in Hunts Over Little Wood River Area

HAILY, May 1—Jerry Sherman and Del Nicholson have combined plenty with business the past several months as hunters of cougars and bobcats. While they have not been lucky enough yet to get on the trail of a cougar, they have bagged 21 bobcats and two raccoons on their week-end jaunts into the Little Wood River and Fish creek country.

Trapper, Duke and Kiner, Walker hounds from Tennessee, belonging to Sherman and William Shipp, Del-nichols, have been used to trail the cats. They have run them from one to three miles before trapping them. The deep baying of the hounds can be heard for miles.

With a lot of afferce following these hounds one foot through the aspen and lava rock, Nicholson states, "The dogs really get restless when we can reach them."

"Sometimes the dogs will corner a cat and attack him. They will attack a hound."

"I've been pretty lucky with our dogs," Sherman notes. "King got badly scratched up on one trip when they cornered a cat in the rocks and couldn't wait until we got there. We have to be pretty careful

about shooting a cat out of a tree. If you only wound him and he falls in every time and they can get pretty badly wounded."

Ranchers in the community are anxious for the men to hunt the predators have given them a lot of grief the past few years. While the

cats live off cottontail and snow-shoe rabbits a good part of the time, they also hunt around the sheep and kill lambs. On occasion they will kill chickens.

On one hunt a cat ran through Scotch Hunt's backyard not 150

feet from the back door of his home in the Little Wood river country.

The men have completed their hunt but are still hunting for cougars along the Yankee fork and east fork of the Salmon river. The largest cat they bagged weighed 46 pounds. Most of them were in good condition, although they have not been as fat as the past several weeks.

"The pets will be tanned and hung into jars by Sherman, who is a taxidermist. The skins will be exhibited around the huge fireplace the trappers have just completed in the living room. The pelts' skins rocks in this fireplace were picked up, for the most part, by the men while they were on hunting expeditions the latter part of the season.

WASHINGTON, May 1. (Sp.)—The administration's 5-year plan for the development of domestic minerals from controlled areas is being met with varied notices from congressional critics Monday. Most said they were waiting for the second year of the plan before committing themselves to a decision.

Many congressmen tended to favor tariff and quota relief, as proposed by the tariff commission last week, over the proposal.

Interior Secretary Fred A. Seaton suggested a \$100,000,000 program to subsidize payments to domestic producers of lead, zinc, tungsten, fluorapatite and copper. The subsidies would make up the difference between market and stabilization prices for a limited amount of mine production.

Senator Wallace F. Bennett, R-Utah, said he welcomed the plan but believed that we should still search for other possible solutions. Seaton's statement, he said, questions unanswered.

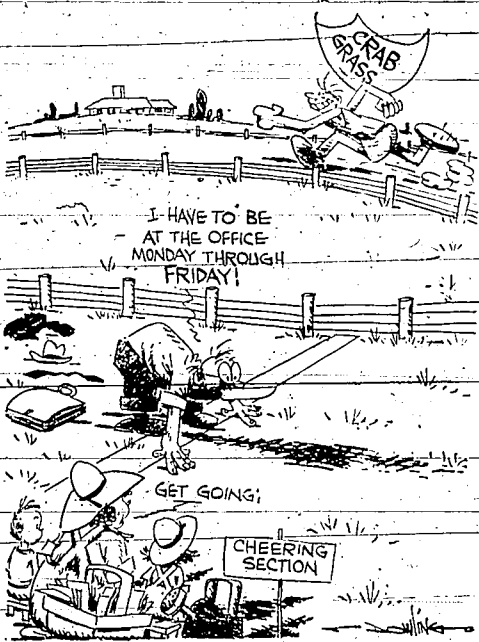

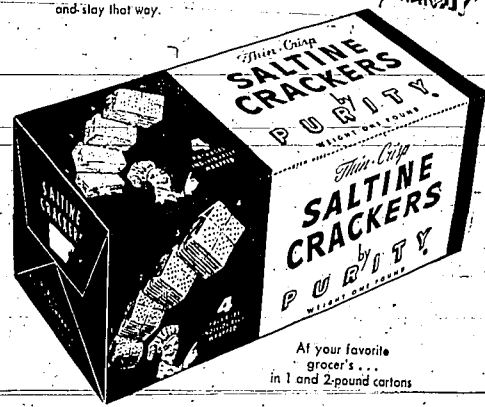

Radio-Phone Service Near In Minidoka

RUPERT, May 1.—The Rupert area will soon have another service, according to an announcement by Donald Dickson, manager of the Project Mutual Telephone company.

Approval of the company's request for a radio-phones frequency is expected by July 1. Plans for expansion of the system by the addition of exchange at Minidoka has also been approved and staking on the work has begun.

A representative of the Motorola corporation was in Rupert recently conducting tests for the possible coverage of radio-phones in the area. In all locations, the strength was good with no blind spots, Dickson said.

As soon as approval for a frequency comes through, the company can begin installation. The equipment is mounted in a subscriber's car, and with a few exceptions, is used as an ordinary telephone.

By means of "lock out" equipment, all conversations are strictly private. Subscribers will be able to dial any number that a regular subscriber can dial and will be able to use long distance service. It will be possible to dial the mobile units just the same as a regular installation.

Costs will run between \$30 and \$25 per month.

The expansion at Minidoka calls for an exchange to be located in Minidoka with 70 lines running in all directions to 4,475, the surrounding area.

Further still A. west of Paul, will soon be getting telephone service, Dickson said. Lines were completed some time ago, but the central office equipment for the Paul exchange has not been delivered.

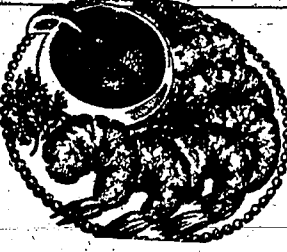

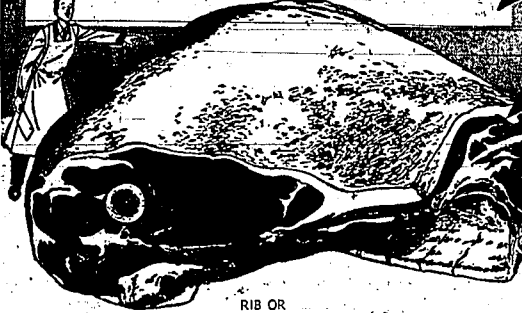
