Demurrer Is Filed on Suit For Damage

A demurrer to a complaint in which damages are sought by Betty Beter, an infant boy, through his guardian, Edith Decker N. Beter, was filed Thursday in Twin Falls district court by attorneys representing the Twin Falls county.

The Beters claim the damages for a burn allegedly received while the infant was a patient in Maglo Memorial hospital. The suit was filed against the county, Dr. A. Walker, Twin Falls attorney representing the Beters.

The demurrer, or objection to the complaint, states that the complaint fails to state facts sufficient to constitute a cause of action. It further states that the complaint is uncertain and it cannot be determined what is claimed to constitute "carelessness and negligence" and it cannot be determined what agents or servants are claimed to have been careless or negligent.

The demurrer states the complaint is ambiguous and unintelligible. The county is represented by F. W. Robertson and Daley, Twin Falls law firm.

The demurrer was filed against the county April 15, states that young Ricky, now three and one-half years old, was patient at the hospital on March 13. At about 4:30 a. m., the complaint charges that the hospital and its employees were negligent in their care and control of the hospital and as a result of carelessness and negligence the child was burned.

The complaint charges that the child received "first, second and third degree burns inside the front of both legs. It is contended that both legs will be permanently scarred, maimed and disfigured as a result of the burns."

Squads Labor To Hold Back Flood Waters

Disaster workers and volunteers struggled today against rain-swollen southern rivers which have forced about 3,000 persons out of their homes and resulted in millions of dollars of damage.

Several rivers were above flood stage and on the verge of overflowing their banks. Service units in the battle to contain the rising waters.

Tornadoes in Texas
Violent thunderstorms, dotted with twisters and funnel clouds, ripped north central Texas last night. One of the twisters hit at Stamford Lake, near Wichita Falls, disrupting power to Abilene, San Angelo, Big Spring, Odessa, Big Lake and McCombs. No injuries were reported.

To the east, the rampaging Big Sandy river in Kentucky was predicted to crest at 57 feet today, more than 4 feet above flood stage, at Caledonia, where the Big Sandy and Ohio rivers meet.

The Red Cross in Washington announced it was making six thousand workers to flood-periled Kentucky and West Virginia areas. In West Virginia, two Red Cross shelters cared for a total of 25 families driven from their homes.

The Ohio river was on the rise and was expected to crest at 97.5 feet tomorrow in the Cincinnati area. Officials at River Downs race track shifted 200 horses to higher ground as a precautionary measure.

In Kentucky, 200 military units appeared to be winning a fight to prevent the Red river from breaking through the levee river from over 10,000 acres at East Point. The Shreveport weather bureau predicted the river would crest today and begin falling.

The Mississippi threatened to overflow its banks in Tennessee and the Ouachita flooded farmland here. Caddo, Ark. Flooding also broke through the levee river from Jackson, Miss., to the gulf.

Rain last night fell from Oklahoma through to Kansas and extended west with Memphis, Tenn. and with a 1.5-inch rainfall in a six-hour period.

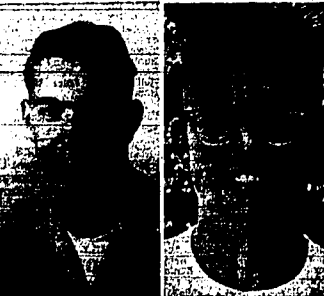

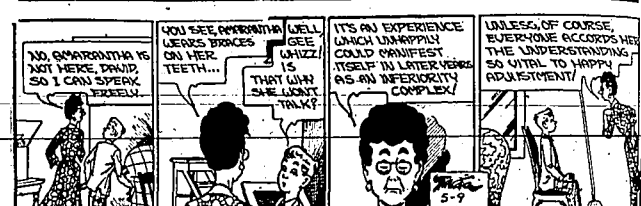

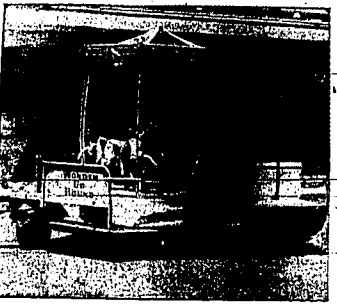
