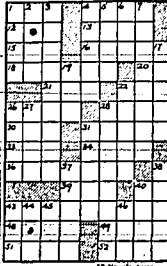

Nixon to Spell Out Views on Latin America

WASHINGTON, May 19 (AP)—Vice President Richard M. Nixon is cautioning against any United States retaliation against the South American nations because of attacks made on him during his recent tour.

Despite the cheering incidents, Nixon has been stressing since his return that it would be wrong to assume, he said, that Latin America are "Venice haters."

He also returned with a strong feeling that U. S. newspapers and radio should pay more attention to Latin American news.

The vice president today began a busy week in which he will have ample chance to spell out what he believes are the underlying reasons for the surge of anti-American feeling he encountered and to outline what might be done about it.

To Speak in New York

Nixon has a routine schedule of activities today. But tomorrow he will go to New York City to introduce President Eisenhower at an economic mobilization conference of the American Management Association. The President's speech at 9:30 p. m. will be nationally televised and broadcast. Nixon also will serve earlier in the day as chairman of a panel discussion.

On Wednesday, the vice president will address a National Press club luncheon in Washington. An aide said last night the speech will be broadcast live by at least one network and most of Nixon's time will be devoted to answering questions from the assembled newsmen.

On Thursday, he is scheduled to dedicate a statue here in honor of the late Simon Bolivar, a national hero of several South American countries including Venezuela, where the lives of Nixon and his wife were endangered by rioting mobs.

Policy Change Needed

Nixon plans to make a confidential report to President Eisenhower on his visit. Informants said the report would call for a drastic re-examination of state department policy toward countries like Venezuela, Argentina and Colombia which have recently emerged from dictatorship.

The vice president warned today during his tour that the department had antagonized many people by its apparent apathy toward the new governments in those nations in their struggle for political and economic stability.

Informants said Nixon may look into charges that certain U. S. officials have gone out of their way to publicly praise dictators.
