### Cabinet Aides Outline Policy To Governors

MIAMI BEACH, Fla., May 21 (AP)—President Eisenhower's cabinet aides today gave an optimistic picture of the economic outlook and three anti-recession measures as an anti-recession measure.

Another raised the threat of a recession to a possibility of a "cold war" budget should get out of hand.

The two were Secretary of Treasury Robert H. Anderson and Secretary of Defense Neil H. McElroy, who discussed administration policy for the 50th annual meeting of the National Governors' Association.

The wide assortment of ideas presented to governors who have gathered for the 50th annual meeting in Miami Beach, Fla., today, included a rise in consumer spending up from 1957, a rise in the rate of durable goods to down most "major consumer areas" with no "substantial personal areas," readily available bank credit, signs of strength in the housing market, decline in interest rates and a general improvement in the balance of new orders.

From the point of view, therefore, of free, private enterprise economy, the most important development is the widespread confidence in the government.

They will have to be made in the light of the specific economic situation and both the full evaluation of both the economic and business conditions.

### Crew Begins Bug Control Tree Project

FAIRFIELD, May 21—An insect control project on Little and Smoky in now in force to combat the mountain pine beetle which kills trees by tunneling into the wood.

A crew of 20 men and a cook have moved into the Big Smoky guard station. Craig Papp is the district forester in charge. Walter C. Cull, entomologist from the Boise research center, is the technical director. Forest Service district men who will live at the Big Smoky station, is project director.

Approximately 2,000 trees will be sprayed at a cost of \$750 per acre. Each tree must be thoroughly sprayed from the ground. Five gallons of ethylene dibromide are required for each tree.

If a tree is not sprayed, four new infestations for every one will be in evidence the following year. If more than 3 per cent of the crown reach the adult stage, an epidemic is in progress.

Stinging lines are run and each tree is spotted and tagged. In this manner there is 100 per cent coverage of the area. The project must be finished before beetle emergence about July 1.

A survey was made last fall by the Boise research center.

### Jupiter Cone Has Room to Contain Man

WASHINGTON, May 21 (AP)—The Jupiter cone recovered after a flight into space last Sunday apparently was big enough to contain a man.

And the next such full scale cone to be launched may house a chimpanzee.

But the army probably will require at least two successful consecutive launches with monkeys aboard before it attempts a manned missile flight in its Jupiter space research program.

There were impressions gathered in an initial press showing by Cook Electric company, Chicago, yesterday of colored motion pictures of the recovery of the cone.

The filmed model, launched in a Jupiter-C research vehicle using the Army Redstone rocket as a main stage, was four feet in diameter. That's about half the size of the full scale nose cone recovered last Sunday.

The special levy raised to 20 mills the amount available for school operations in the coming year.

### Baltimore Mayor Wins Nomination

BALTIMORE, May 21 (AP)—Mayor Thomas D'Alesandro swept to victory over paving contractor George P. Mahoney and five others last night in Maryland's bitterly contested primary for U. S. senate.

The Baltimore mayor's victory, his third straight in a colorful 32-year career, set up a November contest between him and Republican Sen. J. Glenn Beall, who was easily re-nominated after token opposition.

### Flags Will Fly at Half-Staff 3 Days

WASHINGTON, May 21 (AP)—President Eisenhower has decreed that U. S. flags be flown at half-staff on all government buildings and military bases throughout the world on May 21, 22 and 23.

The President, in a proclamation, also urged all Americans to observe Memorial day as a day of "prayer for permanent peace."

### Court's Vote Kills Utah Rate Ruling

WASHINGTON, May 21 (AP)—The supreme court has set aside an Interstate Commerce commission order for increased railroad freight rates on intrastate transportation in Utah.

Justice Clark delivered the 5-4 decision. Justice Frankfurter wrote a dissent in which Justices Burton, Harlan and Whitaker joined.

ICC ordered railroads to establish Utah intrastate rates reflecting increases granted by IC on corresponding interstate traffic to and from Utah ports.

ICC found existing Utah intrastate rates caused unjust discrimination against interstate commerce.

### Non-Aviation Airport Unfair Called Unfair

Members of the Boise chapter of the Air Force Association criticized the Air Force association's proposed expansion of the airport as an "unfair and unwise" move toward encroachment upon established airports by non-aviation enterprises.

In a speech at a meeting of the association's Boise Valley squadron, Henry said the future of airports is uncertain in four of the states—Idaho Falls, Caldwell, Boise and Boise—because of "encroachment by others."

"There are others," he said, "but those provide the most general example of what we have in mind."

He said expansion of residential areas would provide the threat at Idaho Falls and Boise. "With the Caldwell and Boise commercial use of adjacent property has been permitted."

"Each building opportunity is not a hazard which exists," Henry said. "The aviation business is not a new business for this area. Airports were established years ago, and the new building activity would be a natural outgrowth of the old, but cause diminished use of the airports to the detriment of the community's access to air travel."

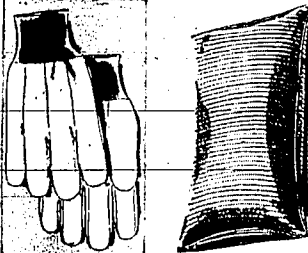

### Former Chinese Aide Battles to Stay in America

**BOZEMAN, May 21**—Yu Shuen Hsiang, a former Chinese Nationalist air force officer accused of misappropriating funds that that government has begun his fight against a U.S. immigration and naturalization bureau order of deportation.

Hsiang was arrested in February on deportation orders. The government claimed he has been unlawfully residing in this country since he and his wartime boss, Gen. Pan Tzu-mow, were dethroned as accredited officers of the Chinese government.

Hsiang, now living in Lynn, Mass., described himself yesterday as "a man without a country" in a hearing to show cause why he should not be deported.

Hsiang and Mow were accused by the Chinese nationalist government of misappropriating about 8 million dollars of the 50 million which they had for their disposal for purchase of U.S. military supplies.

### Hops Is Only Idaho Crop to Gain in Price

**BOISE, May 21**—Only the price of hops advanced in the Idaho field and with the preceding year as compared with the 1935 year, according to the report of the Idaho Agricultural Experiment Station, released today.

The report listed average hop prices at 22 cents per bushel, up from 18 cents per bushel last year. Total value of the Idaho hop crop was estimated at \$1,563,000 in 1935, and at \$1,692,000 in 1936. Average price received for all hops was 22 cents per bushel, up from 18 cents per bushel last year. The report said, although the total value of the crop was up, the local value because of increased production.

The wheat crop was valued at \$12,000,000 in 1935, and at \$11,800,000 in 1936, a decrease of 200,000 bushels. The average price dropped from \$1.84 in 1935 to \$1.82 in 1936.

The Idaho crop also increased in total value, from \$15,010,000 in 1935 to \$15,200,000 in 1936. The percentage of the total value was down from 92 cents to 80 cents.

Of the largest rotations in the state, the value was in dry peas, down from \$9,877,000 in 1935 to \$4,592,000 in 1936. The value of the hay crop increased from \$2,689,000 to \$4,515,000.

### Ike Discloses No New Anti-Recession Measures in Address to Businessmen

By JAMES MARLOW.  
**WASHINGTON, May 21**—President Eisenhower delivered a 2,000-word collection of generalities in a speech to 2,500 businessmen last night on the recession. He said there are strong indications the recession is slowing down, but he said nothing specific about any anti-recession move his administration has in mind beyond what is already known.

"We can never," he said, "open talk our way to prosperity." But his talk made in New York in the economic mobilization conference of the American Management association.

"The closest he got to revealing his administration's intentions about future anti-recession action by his administration was this: 'I am not sure that we have not done more than we should have done.'"

"After consultation with congressional leaders, certain details will shortly be taken in the field of taxation."

Did this mean he was thinking of a tax cut? Maybe. Maybe not. An examination of his sentence shows he wasn't saying yes or no to such a question. His press secretary, James C. Hagerly, was asked to throw light on what Eisenhower meant. Hagerly said the decision, when it comes, could be either for or against a tax reduction.

Eisenhower went on: "What America must do now is gather all its forces for a new effort to promote an early upturn and retarded economic growth that is vigorous and sound."

How can that be done? he said: "From this point on, the conviction determination of the American people—together with resultant actions—can make the difference in lifting the economy to higher and higher levels."

He—144—some anti-recession steps already taken by the government; making credit easier; pushing private construction; sleeping on purchases for defense needs; and the administration's proposal for extended unemployment pay.

Eisenhower suggested no further action by the government beyond the steps already taken. From then on he gave businessmen advice on what to do.

He said businessmen should: Offer the consumer something better; intensify their research into what consumers want; keep their inventories normal; and not let them get too low; buy low as an anti-recession move; have a price policy that will attract and not repel customers.

While telling businessmen to be realistic—about prices—Eisenhower's ward wants them to demand more labor to be realistic about his wage demands, but the demands for prices too high.

Events of the past few weeks—the Iranian crisis—Vice-President Nixon in Latin America, the revolt in Lebanon, the crisis in France—have pushed the recession back into the public consciousness.

This is still temporary. The recession is still here. It will return as a event a few weeks down.

### Army Reveals Fighting Force Is Alert for Action Anywhere

**PT. BRAGO, N. C., May 21**—Secretary of War was off today of the existence of the army's STRAC— the tough fighting force it has pooled and ready to fight limited "brush" wars anywhere in the world. The navy said the air force, which has the 500 army troops which were air-lifted to the Caribbean last week when Vice President Nixon was best by fighters in Venezuela.

But that was a minor matter compared to what STRAC is capable of doing with its more than 125,000 men organized into four divisions: 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th.

General Sink said that STRAC, which has been in existence for several years, was organized partly as a result of the nation's experience in Korea. It is intended to be ready in a hurry and "stop the little men" before it gets to be a great big man."

He said the force is alert for any prime target of discussion as soon as a event a few weeks down.

A reporter asked why the army was taking the secrecy wraps off STRAC.

"It might possibly be to show the American people that we do have an outfit ready to go places—with the proviso that we have someone to take us there," answered General Sink.

Sgt. R. C. Gray, assistant platoon officer, said STRAC's existence gives flexibility to the nation's policy makers because they are not confined using total force or doing nothing.

It has the capability, he added, of applying force "from the prick of a business to tactical atomic weapons."

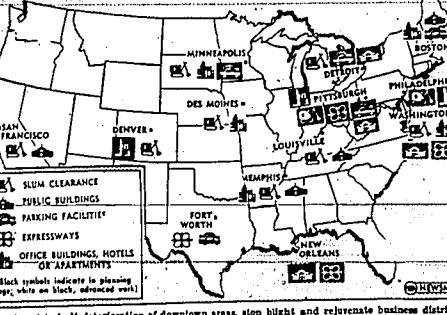

### Defense Pay Hike Approved by 'Ike'

**WASHINGTON, May 21**—President Eisenhower yesterday signed into law a \$76 million dollar pay raise for the armed forces.

The bill, passed by congress May 13, increases the pay of every serviceman and officer who has served more than two years. They would get a pay boost of at least 6 per cent.

The main objective is to induce good men to remain in the armed services, cutting down the costly loss of highly trained personnel.

The bill also provides a proficiency pay system designed to help the armed services attract and keep men with special atomic-age skills.

### Children Cry When Pony Dies After Rescue From Well Shaft

**GALENA, Ill., May 21**—Crown had plunged into a lead mine shaft yesterday when a two-man rescue team rescued a boy and his pony from a 50-foot well shaft.

Seconds later, the children turned to sobs. The pony, known as Buddy, gave several convulsive kicks, then lay on the grassy slope where it often grazed. Its three-day ordeal in the abandoned shaft apparently had been too much.

Buddy's owner, H. J. Smith, said he discovered the 3-year-old colt, gray missing Sunday, but it wasn't until Monday night that it was learned the neighborhood favorite had plunged into a lead mine shaft which was boarded up nearly 30 years ago.

Buddy fell to the bottom of the well, but miraculously survived. About 200 people gathered near the shaft yesterday as a group of miners braved the peril of falling rocks and timber.

Two of the miners, Jim Gill and Charles McDermott, were lowered into the pit from a winch truck, twice failing to loop a sling around the 550-pound shaftling.

After blindfolding Buddy, they succeeded in securing the sling and pulling him up.

The miners told disbelieving children who often had ridden on the pony's back that the neighborhood pet was dead. There was silence, then tears. As far back as some could remember, Buddy had been part of their lives.

Smith, who kept the shaftling as a pet for his 19 grandchildren and neighborhood youngsters, quietly made plans to bury Buddy and to fill in the newly-opened mine shaft.

"At least none of the miners were hurt trying to save Buddy," he said.
