### Steel Leaders Say Business Is on Way up

NEW YORK, May 22 (AP)—Steel leaders generally agreed yesterday that business is on the way up from its recent recession.

They said they gathered at a luncheon of the American Iron and Steel Institute, a steel trade research organization, and orders had picked up from the low point of mid-winter.

Most predicted the upturn will continue except for the normal summer lull.

Some of the big companies were very cautious about discussing a possible steel price increase July 1, possible industry wages will be boosted.

See Better Demand  
Roger Blough, chairman of United States Steel corporation, said, "The demand for steel has a very good chance of moving upward from now on except for the summer months."

The head of the world's largest steel company said it was his feeling that inventories of consumer goods and producers were too low, "and more are going to have to come to the market very soon."

United States Steel was the first steel company to raise prices last year but though said no conclusion had been reached on whether it would raise prices after July 1, it said it will have risen 25 cents an ton this year.

Most put steel operations were low, many steel customers will have more competition in July and August, he said, "are weighing very heavily on the price situation at the present time."

One of the most emphatic speakers was Gray, president of American Steel corporation, who declared, "We will have to raise our prices, but we will do so gradually."

Ex-Bishop Faces Charge of Theft  
LOS ANGELES, May 22 (AP)—A former church leader surrendered to police on an indictment accusing him of theft of \$100,000.

Benjamin J. Summerhays, 64, formerly a LDS church bishop, was arrested in superior court Tuesday. He was released on \$10,000 bond pending a hearing June 4 at which he will enter his plea.

The grand jury indictment naming Summerhays accuses him of leading his flock, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, into a series of investments that resulted in heavy losses because of inside sources in Wall Street.

Summerhays was a bishop in Los Angeles' Brentwood area where he formerly lived.

Polish Reds Set For Kremlin Rap  
WARSAW, May 22 (AP)—Polish communists expect the Kremlin to rebuff their appeal that Poland will soon be reborn against them.

They are both worried and puzzled by the Red summit meeting now going on in Moscow. They think it is a pressure on Polish party boss Wladyslaw Gomulka to toe the Kremlin line against Yugoslavia's President Tito.

Pravda, the Soviet communist organ, published yesterday the Polish contribution to the argument over Tito. Within the next day, or so, something is ranking communist score. Pravda can be expected to reply with an attack on the Polish position.

Cardinal Is Said To Be Improving  
ROME, May 22 (AP)—Samuel Cardinal Stritch has made "marked improvement" in his speech and muscles affected by the stroke he suffered Monday, his doctors reported today.

A medical bulletin issued by the 70-year-old cardinal's physician from Chicago, Dr. Ralph Berger, was the first solidly optimistic report on the prelate's condition.

"I am satisfied with the cardinal's condition," the bulletin said. "There is marked improvement in his speech, in the movement of his right leg and in the muscle tone of the right side of the face."

Bank Rate Takes Drop in England  
LONDON, May 22 (AP)—The British government today dropped the bank rate from 6 per cent to 5 1/2 per cent. It was the second reduction in a month.

Just a month ago, the bank rate—the rate of interest given big borrowers—was dropped from 7 to 6 per cent. At 7 per cent, the rate was at the highest point in 37 years.

Financial observers interpreted the cut as more a response to the strength of sterling and declining interest rates abroad than as a sign the government intended to resume economic expansion.

Nevertheless, financial sources said the government wanted to remove expansion as soon as it felt it would not cause inflation.

Henry P. Pierce, Wilmington, Del., passed the good word to the Chesapeake Specialties Manufacturing Association yesterday. He said the U. S. department of agriculture which developed it, calls it the best all-purpose insect repellent so far made.

It is known by several brand names, Pierce said, adding that a special supply will be available this summer.

Resistance to rubbing is one of its best features, Pierce said. Clothing also can be treated effectively to repel biting insects, he added.

DETROIT, May 22 (AP)—President Walter P. Reuther tomorrow will tell 600 top barbers for his United Auto Workers that the union likely must sign a contract far short of its demands in the next 10 days or meet the possibility of working without a contract.

Reuther will be the chief speaker tomorrow morning when UAW bargaining councils number 250 at General Motors, 160 at Ford and 200 at Chrysler convene to hear reports on the state of negotiations.

It will be up to the councils to decide how far the union should go in compromising its original demands. The big three auto companies so far have refused to offer anything past a two-year extension of present contracts, which expire at midnight, May 29, at GM and at midnight June 1 at Ford and Chrysler.

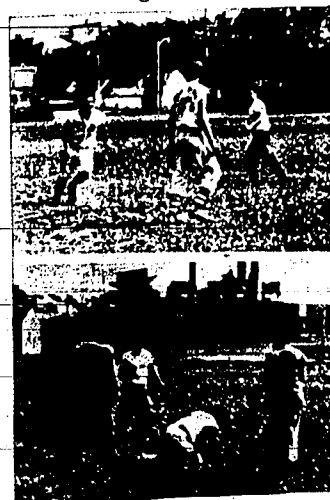

### Sputnik Is Car-Size

The latest Russian space satellite, sputnik III, is almost as big as a U.S. auto. For comparative purposes a 1958 Ford is shown in "orbit" around sputnik III. The auto is 37 inches high. The satellite is 42 inches in diameter at its base. In speed there is no comparison, with the sputnik zooming along somewhere between 17,000 to 18,000 m.p.h. Most U.S. cars are rated 100-plus m.p.h.

### Scientists Outline Six Types Of Unmanned Moon Missions

LOS ANGELES, May 22 (AP)—Six types of unmanned moon missions are being outlined by scientists at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory, Pasadena, Calif., today. The moon's pull could help a rocket escape, but it also can capture or which passes at a low enough speed to be captured in orbit. When these probes are accomplished, scientists will try to land on the moon. The probes are more complicated vehicles which must use decelerating rockets at destination.

- Landing a probe on the moon. Studies outline landing 50 pounds of "useful payload" on the visible face, half covered by radio equipment, leaving 25 pounds for data instruments.
- Establishing a lunar satellite. Studies indicate feasibility of a collapsible sphere which, once in orbit, would be expanded to about 100 feet diameter to be seen in telescopes. Weighing perhaps 200 pounds, it would require a rocket launching system with performance similar to that which the Russians needed for sputnik III.
- Establishment of space buoys. There are two points of "gravitational and dynamic balance" in the earth-moon system where objects will "float at anchor" indefinitely, neither around a major point in space.

These points are located on each side of the system as far from Earth as is the moon. Natural space buoys exist—they are called the Trojan asteroids, hid in the balance cones created by the Sun and the planet Jupiter.

### ICBM Is Said Progressing On Schedule

CHICAGO, May 22 (AP)—Major General Robert A. Schriever, air force missile chief, said yesterday work was progressing "on schedule" toward the development of a "classified" intercontinental ballistic missile.

Schriever said it might be possible to produce an operational ICBM as early as the date originally set, but he added that the problem of a missile's reentry into the earth's atmosphere.

The two-legged human society, which also inherits wherever it exists as a social caste system, does occasionally allow rebel, though tolerance is often well repaid.

The insect world is characterized by chanceless discipline. The human world is possibly changing through freedom. The insect is torn to his pieces. The man can, at his best, at least choose his doom. His possibility above the ant is that he can select how he can best serve his society. This is his total liberty.

I am optimistic enough to feel in my heart and brains and bones that a third world war isn't likely within 10 years.

Why? Because:

1. The tumultuous reach for political liberty by the submerged people of this earth is balanced by the desire of the so-called civilized people for a higher standard of living.

2. At least for another decade the powers that can now precipitate a major conflict have more to gain by landscaping their own laws than they do by trying to tear the other guy's house down.

I have a poor man's faith that the man in the street is as of now more long-sore for improvement than disaster.
