### Foreign Flier Aiding Rebels Held Prisoner

**JAKARTA, Indonesia, May 23 (AP)—**A daily spokesman reported today the capture of two rebel fliers, one a navigator, who bailed out of a Mustang B bomber in east Indonesia.

The identity of the foreigner was not disclosed on the ground that it might be embarrassing to his country.

The report by the U.S. government of export licenses to ship arms, ammunition and spare parts to Jakarta was one factor, signaling of a barter for U. S. rice shipments was made.

If an American was one of those captured, the Indonesian government presumably would not risk the present friendly atmosphere by revealing it.

### Bangkok Man, Irked by Slow Taxi, Kills Self With Grenade

**BANGKOK, Thailand, May 23 (AP)—**Among Bangkok's hundreds of green-topped canals and golden-splashed Buddhist temples anything can happen.

"Take the case of the young soldier turned part-time taxicab driver. A prospective customer handed a hand grenade in his face and demanded to be taken to a hospital. When the driver hesitated and tried to abandon the cab, the would-be customer pulled the grenade pin. This explosion killed him and seriously wounded the driver.

"Taxi drivers, who make every dime seem like a dash to a maternity ward, have been prominently in the news in Bangkok recently. Only a month ago, 1,000 cabbies engaged by a gasoline price increase marched on government house and almost forced Premier Thanon Kittachorn and his cabinet to resign.

"Thanon bowed and said the taxis of Bangkok could buy their gasoline on government-controlled stocks at old prices.

"In this strangely exotic land of 22 million people, including 250,000 monks, a military dictatorship has reigned almost continuously for 25 years with only a few face changes, primarily because it has been responsive to public opinion.

"Despite the generally high cost of living, Thailand continues to be a favorite spot for foreigners. Almost 75,000 people visited Bangkok last year. Airlines and travel agents expect the influx to double or triple with the introduction of jet commercial airlines in 1960.

"The Thais so far have done little to prepare for the anticipated increase of visitors. There are only about a half dozen adequate hotels and they are usually full.

CHICAGO, May 23 (AP)—Harry S. Truman declared last night the GOP handling of foreign affairs was "one of the greatest foreign policy disasters in its history."

"The free world alliances, on which our security depends, are threatened," the former President said in an address in which he accused the Eisenhower administration of the greatest foreign policy disaster of our history.

Truman was billed as the featured speaker at a \$100-a-plate fund raising dinner in the Conrad Hilton hotel sponsored by the Cook county Chicago Democrats.

"The Republicans are making a mess of things in Washington, and we must do something about it before it is too late," he said.

The principal answer to the what-to-do question, he suggested, is to increase the Democratic majority in Congress in the elections this fall and to elect a Democratic President in 1960.

He also wrote this criticism into a typical give 'em hell speech: "We may be on the brink of one of the greatest foreign policy disasters of our history."

Even more important, the naval base there has fully adequate office and housing facilities for the White House staff, including secret service agents. They can get by on the government per diem expense allowance of \$12 living on a military base. But even with a special reduced rate, it probably would be impossible to do so at a resort hotel.

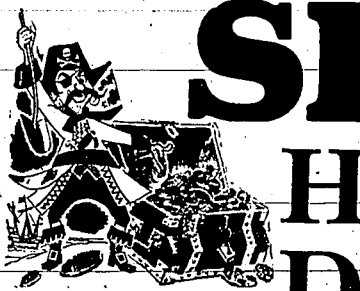
