## U.S. Moves at Top Speed to Equip European Sites With Long Range Missiles

WASHINGTON, June 4 (UPI)—The defense department today moved at top speed to equip European launching sites with its new long-range ballistic missiles.

Defense officials said a decision had been made for "full scale" operation of both the 3,500-mile weapons to be sent to Britain by the end of the year. The United States, they said, is "on the way" to the 5,000-mile intermediate range ballistic missile (IRBM) and the 5,500-mile intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM).

## Jobless Number Is Down to Less Than 5 Millions

WASHINGTON, June 4 (UPI)—Unemployment in May dipped below 5 million for the first time since January, the government officials reported today.

The officials said figures to be released Friday by the labor and commerce department would show a more-than-seasonal drop in the jobless total between April and May. The April total, 5,120,000—was 78,000 below the postwar peak of 5,200,000 jobs lost, recorded in March. Friday's figures also will indicate that a number of persons holding jobs was considerably higher than the 62,907,000 total for April.

Officials warned, however, that unemployment totals for June may not show up close to a million when students enter the job market in search of summer work.

The unemployment drop in May was due to a larger increase in outdoor work such as farming, construction, and amusement in June.

Employment increased by 600,000 in April to 62,900,000.

## De Gaulle Plea Gains Equal Vote Rights To Algerians Soon

ALGIERS, June 4 (AP)—Premier Charles de Gaulle today promised elections in Algeria within three months with equal voting rights for all. Arriving from Paris to a tumultuous welcome, de Gaulle praised the insurgent leaders whose revolt against Paris May 13 started him on the road to power. He spoke from the balcony where the uprising was proclaimed. The crowd cheered him repeatedly. But his proposal to abolish the separate colleges or voting systems for Muslims and Algerian French was violently opposed by French civilians.

The French, outnumbered 10-1 by Arabs and Berbers, have managed to retain control of the territorial legislature by limiting the number of seats the Algerian natives can hold.

De Gaulle went from the airport through streets filled with cheering crowds to conferences with the ruling junta. Two members said he was making his last public appearance.

"De Gaulle fulfilled all our leaders," said an official of the junta that seized control May 13 and demanded the general be brought to power in France.

De Gaulle said he would lead his country to a new movement here.

A tumultuous news welcome greeted de Gaulle as he was brought back to power by the French colonists and military chiefs in Algeria.

Gen. Raoul Salan, the top insurgent commander, and all the other leading military men and civilians of the public safety committee now ruling Algeria, were at the airport to greet de Gaulle.

An 11-year-old Filer boy died at 7:35 p.m. Tuesday in Twin Falls Clinic hospital shortly after he was accidentally shot with a .22-caliber rifle on the back porch of his home.

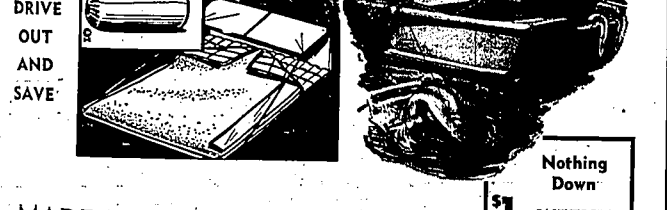

### Chamber Group Urges Letters To Congress Asking Tax Cuts

WASHINGTON, June 4 (AP)—The Council of State Chambers of Commerce called yesterday for a public outpouring of letters to persuade congress to cut taxes as an anti-recession measure.

Rejecting the administration's view that tax reductions would cause insupportable budget deficits, the council said live of the last six tax cuts have paid for themselves quickly by generating new profits and income.

President Eisenhower maintained no general tax cut is necessary at this time to restore the country to economic health. The leadership of both parties in congress is supporting this point of view. But the council argued:

"Incentive tax relief will do more to create jobs with less adverse effect on the budget than any spending action the government can take."

Its report held that although Eisenhower may be right in judging that the recession is approaching bottom, "the end of the decline does not assure an early resurgence of economic activity."

Some members of congress are still pushing for tax relief. Sen. George Smathers, D. Fla. in a Senate speech urged repeal of the 3 per cent excise on freight shipments and the 10 per cent levy on passenger travel imposed in 1948 as a war measure.

Sen. Paul H. Douglas, D. Ill., renewed his call for a six-billion-dollar-a-year tax slash.

# EARLY RETURNS HINT DODGERS MAY GET CHAVEZ STADIUM

## Ex-Brooklynites Ahead in Close Ballot but O'Malley Won't Claim Victory Yet

LOS ANGELES, June 4 (UPI)—A bitterly contested referendum election on the Los Angeles Dodgers' Chavez Ravine stadium site today favored the baseball club but the Los Angeles voters still have a long way to go before the city will have a new stadium. When the returns from the semi-official tally returns from 1,008 precincts out of 4,619 in the city stood: yes, 47,471, no, 43,453.

The crowd favoring the Dodgers started with the very first election bulletin last night which stood 29 to 12 in favor of approving the city's contract with the club for 315 acres in Chavez Ravine.

As men returned poured in, the margin was not 2-1 but the proponents of the Dodgers maintained their lead throughout the evening.

Dodger President Walter P. O'Malley at a news conference early today said he was not sure of victory. At that time he said, "I think the returns are quite inconclusive. I am most appreciative of the sponsorship given major league baseball in Los Angeles by civic groups, sports fans and press and radio."

But O'Malley recalled the 1951 major league fight when the Dodgers had 2-1 on the issue. He said that the city had a 2-1 vote in favor of the club when the final count ended shortly after midnight.

"It is difficult to say at this hour," commented Holland when asked if he felt his forces had been beaten. "I don't feel that decisive tallies are in yet. I'm a little disappointed but I'm still hopeful."

O'Malley said it was up to the people but too early before full returns were in to say that they had been beaten.

So intense was the interest in the Dodger referendum that 623 per cent of more than a million voters in the city went to the polls, a record for a primary election in a non-presidential year.

## Washington Quits PCC to Form Loop With Californians

SEATTLE, June 4 (AP)—The University of Washington shucked the Pacific Coast Conference Tuesday after 43 years to join California schools in a new athletic pact. The move left the crumbling PCC dazed if not dying amid walls from the remaining schools and cheers from those which already have announced they are departing. The action was taken by the university's board of regents in response to features it said were received from the University of California, UCLA, and the University of Southern California.

Left behind in the reshuffle are Washington State, Oregon State, Oregon, Stanford and Idaho. Stanford has kept quiet about joining the other group in formation of a "Big Five" pact. The present conference is expected to exist until July 1, 1958, date set by the California schools for their departure.

The date of Washington's withdrawal from the PCC apparently is contingent on the formation of the new alliance.

The action climaxed expressions of resentment which started with heavy conference penalties assessed on the incident four in 1954 for failure of recruiting and 10 for non-athletic rules.

At that time California was fined \$25,000. Washington and USC were fined and placed on probation for two years and UCLA for three, during which they were barred from football championship contention.

In its judgment, the Pacific Coast will be dead after the California schools withdrawal because it will reduce the circuit to less than its constitutional minimum of seven.

Dr. Henry Schmitt, president of the university and present at the meeting which led to the withdrawal decision, was authorized to join "a new association on a pro basis."

The regents said, however, they still wanted to maintain "traditions of athletic relations with the State College of Washington and the other Northern institutions."
