Benson Raps Congress for Slow Actions

WASHINGTON, June 6 (AP)—Secretary of Agriculture Benson believes farmers should have a voice—but not the complete or final say—on what kind of farm program the federal government should put up with.

He made this point at a news conference yesterday in criticizing what he called congressional delays in acting on new farm legislation. Benson objected to proposals being considered by the house agriculture committee that grant a veto, but not the complete or final say, to farmers. He said some other crops be allowed to decide—at referendum—among other alternative programs for the crops.

Dangerous Plan "I believe it is dangerous to give farmers a veto, just because the people directly interested in it are for it," he said.

Such farmer decisions, he said, might be against public interest and not in the long-range interest of agriculture itself. Responsibility for determining farm programs he said rests with congress.

The secretary also criticized steps taken by the committee to the various farm legislative proposals together in one bill. "The simplification was undertaken, he said, to use non-controversial proposals to help carry controversial ones through congress.

Program Delayed Each farm proposal, he said, should stand on its own feet.

Benson said that in tying the agricultural trade development program to other actions, congress was delaying export of surpluses.

He said his department was losing out on export sales while waiting for the house to act on a senate-approved bill to extend the program, now scheduled to expire June 30.

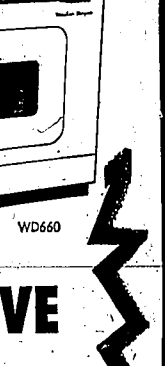
