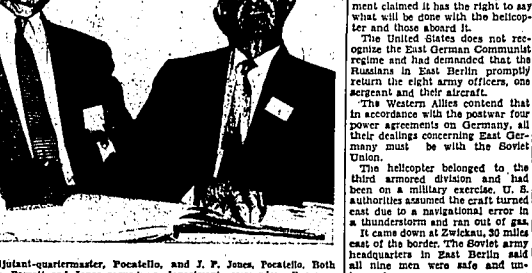

New Corsican Chief Chosen By de Gaulle

PARIS, June 9 (UPI)—Gen. Charles de Gaulle today named a new chief of the Corsican republic with instructions to re-establish the authority of the Paris government over the numerous French islands.

He also named four middle-grade politicians and one career civil servant to round out his cabinet. Information minister Andre Malraux announced the new cabinet in a 45-minute cable meeting, which he addressed in Paris.

M. de Gaulle de Gaulle decided to postpone a decision on reorganizing negotiations with Tunis until his next cabinet meeting, which he will address in Paris.

These internal developments were disclosed shortly after de Gaulle conferred with his cabinet members and after a report that steps may be under way for possible talks between President Eisenhower and de Gaulle.

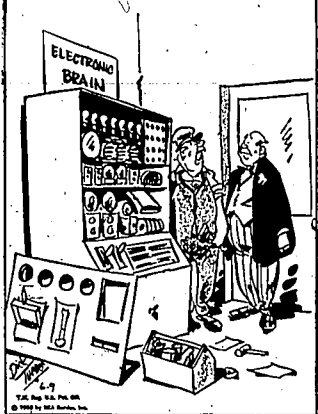

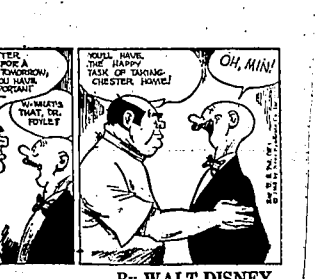

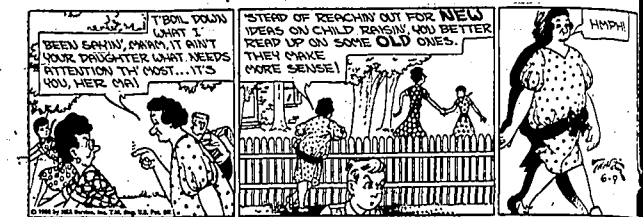

Public Works Bill Approved With Changes

WASHINGTON, June 9 (UPI)—The House appropriations committee today approved a \$1,074,067,200 public works appropriations bill prepared with extra projects not requested by President Eisenhower. The bill as it emerged from the committee carried \$104,000 less than the President asked for in his 1953 budget despite the 43 cabinet planning and construction projects.

But the committee made the bulk of its savings by slashing \$20,400,000 from the new federal loan program for construction of small irrigation projects. The President requested \$25,200,000 for this. The committee allowed but \$4,800,000, saying only one project in Cameron county, Texas, has met complete requirements.

Projects Added

The committee added in addition more than 15 million dollars in extra projects that they "would have been considered sooner or later."

It is probably possible that their ultimate cost will be less," it said.

However, the committee also pointed out that the addition of the extra projects means "a higher level of appropriations will be necessary in the future."

The committee, in a report to the house, hit the army engineers hard for "shifting up local enthusiasm for projects which, from the standpoint of local contribution and other aspects, should never be recommended favorably to the congress."

It said some corps personnel have been exercising "evident super-salesmanship."

Some Funds Increased

The committee approved \$57,035,500 for general rivers, harbors and flood control projects by army engineers. That is a net increase of \$12,415,500 over the President's budget. It okayed a separate item of \$57,250,000—\$50,000 more than Eisenhower asked—for flood control on the Mississippi river and its tributaries.

Other appropriations in the bill included: \$138,948,141 for reclamation bureau projects; a \$1,023,250 cut from the President's budget; \$46,172,285 for the upper Colorado river basin fund; \$1,810,410 less than Eisenhower asked; \$30,104,000 for the Bonneville power administration; \$872,500 for the southwestern power administration; and \$18,850,000 in payments to the Tennessee valley authority fund.

The last three items were unchanged from the President's budget request.

The CAB said it had adopted a new rule under which planes flying between 3,000 and 22,000 feet would be assigned courses at staggered altitudes. Above 20,000 feet, the CAB said, greater separation would be provided to offset increased errors in altimetry at those heights.

The new rule becomes effective Aug. 15 in all U. S. and territorial air space.
