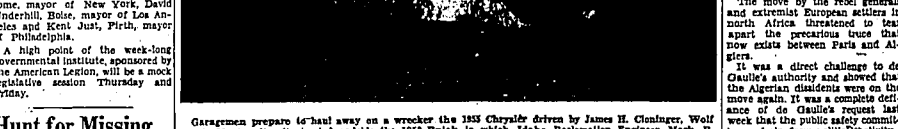

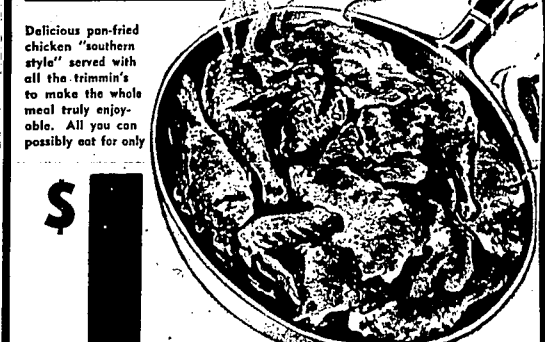

Senate Labor Bill Opposed By Ike Aides

WASHINGTON, June 10 (AP)—The Eisenhower administration came out yesterday against the senate labor bill which charges corruption in unions.

Two of the bill's co-sponsors, Sen. Irving L. Riss, N.Y., and John F. Kennedy, D., Mass., promptly announced the action as due to "appearance of the measure or its administration."

The administration position was presented by Secretary of Labor James H. Aronson. He said the bill would weaken, not strengthen, labor union curbs.

Mr. Aronson is attending a meeting in Geneva, Switzerland. His office said the statement represents the administration's viewpoint.

Said Mr. Aronson: "The labor committee bill, which has the endorsement of Chairman John McClellan, D., Ark., of the senate labor committee, follows President Eisenhower's recommendations in some respects."

Mr. Aronson said, "The proposal as a whole would provide completely ineffective legislation, which would cause the workers of this country and the American public they just and protection they did not in fact have."

Ike and Kennedy, co-sponsors of the pending bill, said in a statement that the person who wrote that bill had not read it, did not understand it, and did not understand it. As stated by Senator McClellan last Friday: "The present bill measure will give important protection to the rights of management and the workers, it represents a non-partisan effort to carry out the recommendations of the McClellan committee on which we both serve."

To Curb Abuse

The measure is designed to curb abuses by giving rank and file members greater control over union affairs and by requiring public reporting of financial dealings.

No date has been set for the bill to go to the floor. It is expected that the measure will be introduced by Sen. B. Johnson, D., Tex., the senate majority leader, has said it will give high priority.

Metals Search Benefit Plans Being Pushed

WASHINGTON, June 10 (AP)—Facing the clock, a Senate Interior subcommittee yesterday approved a bill to continue a minerals exploration program.

The subcommittee approved amendments proposed by the department of interior and sent the bill to the full interior committee which plans to consider it in a day or two.

The program under which the federal government paid up 75 percent of the cost of mineral exploration projects expiring June 30 unless it is extended.

Approval Unanimous

Subcommittee members unanimously approved the extension bill, sponsored by Sen. James E. Murray, D. Mont., interior subcommittee chairman.

Sen. Arthur V. Watkins, R. Utah, said it may take "some herculean efforts" to get the bill through committee to the White House within three weeks.

The Murray bill would authorize the interior department to set up and operate a program for minerals exploration by private industry, with the government putting up money on a participating basis.

Now Discontinued

A similar program has been carried on for six years by the defense minerals exploration administration under authority of the defense production act. It is being discontinued on grounds it is no longer needed for national defense.

Getting any bill through congress and signed by the president in three weeks—all the time left until the end of the fiscal year—would be an unusual achievement.

However, there is enthusiastic support for, and little known opposition to, the Murray bill.

Mining industry and administration spokesmen testifying at hearings last year on mineral legislation, and on the government's proposed long-range minerals program last year, called for continued and expanded exploration.

Secretary of the Interior Fred A. Seaton testified his department recommends that a program of financial assistance to private industry for exploration be authorized and made a responsibility of the department of the interior under new legislative authority.

The new guidance system was tested during a series of experimental flights from Holloman to Wendover air force base, Utah, a distance of 650 miles.

The air force said that during six Atran flights in a test vehicle at altitudes below 1,000 feet, as many as six jammers were used to simulate enemy countermeasures.

"In no case was the guidance system 'confused' and the vehicle continued on its course with a high degree of accuracy," the air force said.

Jammers were unable to prevent perfect Atran tracking results at accuracies within a few feet of course.

Project officers of the tactical air command said the test flights were "extremely successful."

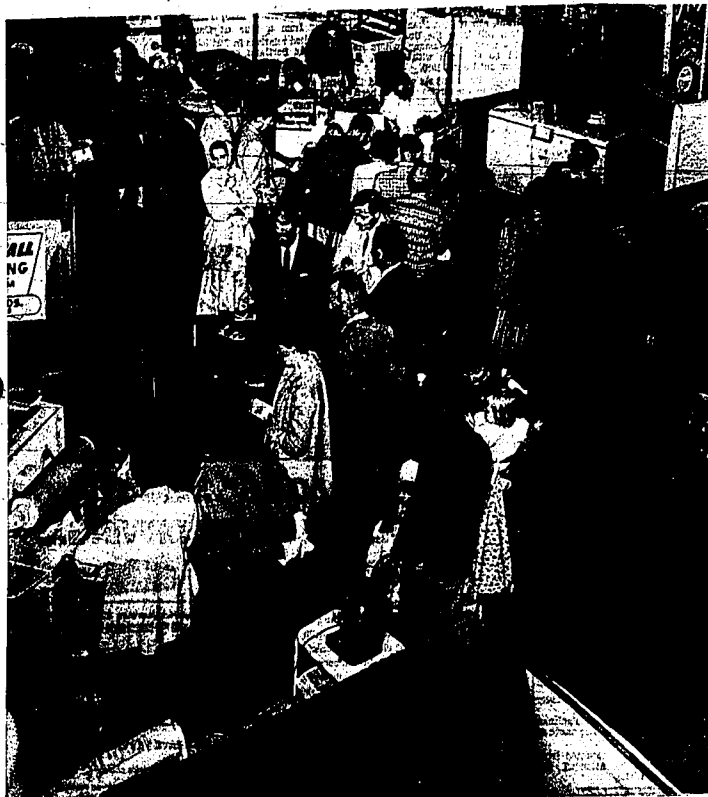

Magic Valley Home Show to Feature Innovations in Electrical Appliances

Latest features in all types of electrical appliances will be on display at the second annual Magic Valley Home Show at the Twin Falls high school gymnasium Thursday through Sunday, local dealers report.

One innovation is a complete wall unit which includes two refrigerator units and one freezer unit above the counter, and two pull-out freezer units beneath.

There is storage and full width fluorescent lighting above the counter and a convenient feature of the pull-out freezer can be replaced and cabinets or washer or dryer substituted.

In capacity this unit gives 12 feet of freezer space and 10 feet of refrigeration. One of the advantages of the unit is its flexibility and the fact it takes only 24 inches of wall space.

Another item among the appliances on display will be refrigerators with 10-foot capacity and a three-foot capacity unit below.

A magnetic latch on refrigerator doors which will make them close automatically will also be shown.

Appliances to be on display at the show include refrigerators, freezers, ranges, both free standing and built-in, and with vent fans or hoods; automatic washers, combination washer-dryers, dishwashers, both built-in and portable, air conditioners, hi-fidelity sets, as well as television models.

A model kitchen, featuring yellow cabinets and brown accent color, will also be included among the displays.

Models of automatic washers

which can be built into the wall of a bathroom will also be included in the displays. Dealers point out that since 85 per cent of the laundry comes from the bathroom and bedrooms in a home, it is logical to have the washer in the bathroom.

Matching sets of electrical lamps for various rooms throughout the house will also be shown. Ranges and Leundromat units which take only 25 inches of space will be included in the display, as well as ranges with plug out burners.

Tom Wilkins, publicity chairman of the show, points out one of the purposes of the event is to show the importance of adequate wiring to insure proper operation of appliances.

"If your television set starts acting up when your washer goes on, for instance," he pointed out, "you don't have adequate wiring."

A movie will be shown during the four days bringing out this point, Wilkins said. One part of the movie will deal with adequate wiring, another with proper lighting and the third part will be on appliances.

Other features include an electric range with a toaster oven that reduces thawing of frozen foods as much as 200 per cent; a dishwasher which washes pots and pans; lightweight portable television sets; food waste disposer, electric water heater and table and console television sets. Since their inception the three Hotpoint trailers have traveled about 875,000 miles and visited all 48 states at least twice. The "era of electronic cooking" to the American public was Hotpoint's introduction of the electronic cooking unit, which can bake a potato in four minutes and a pie in 12 minutes. The unit can be used as a free-standing appliance or as a built-in appliance. It was introduced to the public in January, 1956, and production of the cooking unit began in July, 1955.
