Kansas Tornado Deaths Increased to 4; More Than 50 People Injured

EL DORADO, Kans., June 11 (UPI)—A quick-striking twister that sounded "like a thousand jet planes coming in at tree-top level" raved down tornado alley yesterday, carving a path of death and destruction. Fourteen persons were killed, authorities said. Their bodies were taken from a temporary morgue, set up in the 4-II club building in this southeastern Kansas town, to two mortuaries. Authorities said at least 60 persons were injured.

The inquest is slated for Thursday or Friday pending the condition of the sole survivor in the car, Walter J. Kulp, 71, Denver, who remains in a critical condition at Gooding County Memorial hospital. Smith said the attending physician had refused permission to see Kulp who is in a semi-conscious state. Cypriot Shot After Curfew Rule Is Over

NIKOSIA, June 11 (UPI)—British Gov. Sir Hugh Foot today lifted the daylight curfew and almost immediately a Turkish gunman shot and killed a Cypriot in Nikosia. Cypriots waited tensely to see whether the incident would spark a new wave of inter-communal fighting, which now has taken seven lives since Sunday.

Ready for Curfew
Foot was ready to snap the curfew back on at the first sign of mob riot.

British troops and colonial police stood ready on every corner of Nikosia. About 10,000 of them were on alert throughout the island.

Last night, the curfew was enforced in all major towns.

Officials confirmed that large stores of explosives were found Monday in the cellars of a Turkish mosque and a Greek church in Larnaca.

Meanwhile, the Greek government appeared to be backing away from its stance in relations with Turkey.

Says With NATO
Prime Minister Constantine Karamanlis pledged that Greece would remain a faithful member of the NATO defense alliance despite the difficulties between Greeks and Turks on Cyprus. Both Greece and Turkey are members of the alliance.

Greece called the Cypriot situation to the attention of the NATO council when it met in Paris yesterday, but there were no reports from the secret session of any dangerous debate.

Only "Summit" Meets in Sight To Involve Only West Leaders

It looks as if any "summit" conference held within the next few months will be those among the big four western allied leaders. This prospect could change, of course, especially if Soviet Russia gave evidence that it really was ready to negotiate with western powers.

It is just possible also that French Premier Charles de Gaulle and Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev might meet either in Paris or Moscow.

But right now, the only summit conferences in sight are a series of meetings of United States, British, French and West German leaders, with de Gaulle as the central figure.

Secretary of State John Foster Dulles said, in discussing the diplomatic situation with the senate for-

mer for a number of years. Soon after he returns home, Macmillan is expected to go to Paris to see de Gaulle.

This meeting, too, will be most important. Macmillan will report to de Gaulle the results of his talks with Eisenhower. He also will be able to sound out de Gaulle on foreign policy and seek his attitude on various issues, including the East-West summit conference, allied relations with Russia generally, and the North Atlantic Treaty organization.

Next is likely to be a meeting, probably in Paris, between de Gaulle and West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer.

The future of French-German relations is second only to that of allied relations with Russia in importance.

There is talk in Washington and Paris of a possible meeting between Eisenhower and de Gaulle. Such a meeting, most probably would be held in Washington.

Any Soviet-U. S. Agreement to End Atom Tests Looks Distant

WASHINGTON, June 11—Any agreement between the United States and Russia on ending nuclear tests will not be made until the technical experts have agreed on the details, a State Department spokesman said today.

The spokesman was speaking at a news conference after the United States and Russia had agreed to discuss ways of policing a ban on nuclear testing to prevent cheating.

He said the United States and Russia would be just a first step. There would still have to be formal agreement between governments. All this would take time, he said.

But shortly after Eisenhower's letter to Khrushchev on the subject was released Tuesday, Dulles indicated American technical experts had advised that the United States would not agree to a system against nuclear tests unless it could be sure that Russia's cheating, if it were an official world, would be the likely place for the French to hold nuclear tests, if they had nuclear weapons. So far as is known, they don't.

That they want them, there's grave doubt the French would agree to a ban on nuclear testing before they have time to develop nuclear weapons and try them out.

To do otherwise would be to leave only the United States, Russia and Britain with, tried and true nuclear weapons. That's an almost impossible position for the French to consider themselves a major world power.

By injecting Red China into this

of the possibility Russia might run tests on her Asian neighbor's territory. This is where the problem lies.

This country officially doesn't even recognize the existence of the Red Chinese government. This is a fiction, of course, and one for which this country has been criticized.

Red China is now known to have nuclear weapons. Therefore, it might reasonably be expected to object to inspection posts within its borders, so a whole new problem was introduced by Dulles into any attempt at ending nuclear tests.

It's possible Red China might agree—but certainly not in a hurry.

Such a move would open the way to getting Red China the recognition it wants and setting this country off a back with its allies. For example, this was.

If Congress were persuaded the only way to cut an end to nuclear testing would be to let Red China into the U. S. permissively American opposition might stop. All this probably has done is to make the question of inspection in the Sahara desert.

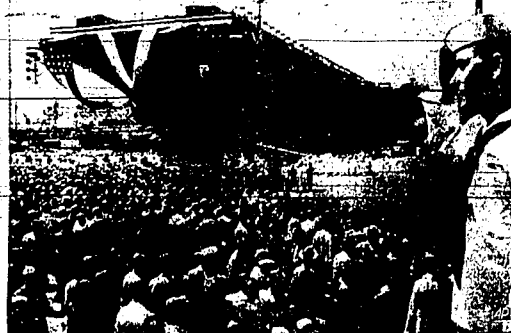

Good Harvest Is Forecast in Crop Reports

WASHINGTON, June 11 (AP)—The agriculture department reported yesterday spring crop prospects—featuring a wheat crop estimated up more than 10 percent from last year—were good to excellent.

It said the situation points to a high if not a record harvest.

In the only major product for which a forecast was given, the department said a wheat crop of 1,271,000,000 bushels was indicated. Such a crop would be the fourth largest of record and 14 per cent more than the 10-year average.

Surplus Seen

If such a crop develops, it would probably be about 200 million bushels more than markets will take. The extra grain would move into government price support stocks to create the largest surplus of wheat on record. The bountiful outlook for wheat reflects the fact that moisture supplies have been very good in major producing areas of the great plains plagued in other recent years by drought.

In pointing the big crop outlook, the department cautioned that there is plenty of time for the situation to change. It said one immediate threat is a severe infection of grasshoppers in parts of north Texas, western Oklahoma, western Kansas and eastern Colorado.

Still Risk

Also, maturing and harvest of the huge wheat crop, except in earliest sections, remains subject to important although decreasing weather risks.

The indicated wheat crop included a prospective record winter wheat yield of 1,000,000,000 bushels, compared with 707,000,000 last year and a spring wheat estimated of 202,000,000 bushels compared with 205,000,000 bushels last year.

PORTLAND, June 11 (UPI)—The National Hells Canyon association said today it was not giving up in the battle for a high, federal dam at Hells canyon.

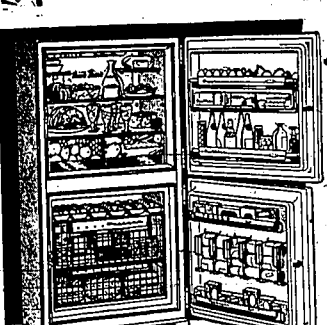

Loss of Mace Is Blamed on Spliced Film

HOLOGRAM AIR FORCE BASE, N. M., June 11 (AP)—A splice of a 35-millimeter film was the cause of the loss of a Mace today in one of the most important tests in more than 1000 tests that destroyed itself shortly after launch here yesterday.

The missile, using a new and all-time reliable guidance system called ATLAS—containing terrain and navigation—was to be brought down by an parachute after its successful launching in the first public demonstration of the recovery means.

Shortly after the big "bird" disappeared from view following a successful launching and when it was still in the air, the F100 chase jet lost contact with it.

This happened just as the ground stationing of the missile was changing from one radar station to another.

At this moment, the missile started falling off course to the left.

Because of the lack of contact between the ground and the chase aircraft, an automatic safety device was triggered. The unmanned vehicle spun into the San Andres mountains.

Every Planned

The first report was that an automatic "destruct" safety device on the missile had blown away.

The air force reported that this was a research missile, not a recovery one.

The missile first released a small parachute which slowed it to recovery speed and allowed it to recover.

At an altitude of about 2000 feet, it had released three large parachutes which would lower it gently to the ground. However, the altitude at that time was over 2000 feet higher than 2000 feet and struck a peak.

Alarms Captain

Capt. William L. Schneider, pilot of the F100 chase plane, said "The missile started to turn into me and I saw it. Then I saw the day chute and I got out of there."

Schneider said he saw the missile hit the peak and explode.

The air force said that the automatic destruct was a partial failure, the functioning of the automatic destruct system and the reliability of that safety device.

The Mace started "recovery" at the 2000-foot frame of the 35-millimeter film strip that is part of the ATLAS guidance system. Each frame covers two minutes of flight.

The air force officer said the 32nd frame had been exposed when the film and there was a possible cause of the difficulty.

COLUMBIA, S. C., June 11 (UPI)—Gov. Ernest F. Hollings led virtually all the way in returns from yesterday's three-way Democratic primary race for governor, but it appeared today he was headed for a runoff with former educator Donald B. Russell.

Hollings had won commanding leads in the primary but he would not have the necessary majority. The third candidate, Anderson Mayor William C. Johnston, trailed the two runners by a considerable margin.

WASHINGTON, June 11 (AP)—The fifth announced nuclear detonation in this year's test series in the mid-Pacific took place at 2:30 p. m. yesterday, the government disclosed.

The joint announcement by the atomic energy commission and the defense department said merely "a nuclear test detonation took place at 5:30 a. m. June 10, MST, at the Bikini atoll. The test is part of the Hiredack nuclear weapons test series underway at the Eniwetok proving ground."

The first announced test in the series, officially designated "Hiredack," was officially conducted May 7 after Rep. Charles O. Porter, D., Ore., made public the April 28 explosion.

The second announced test shot was May 11, the third May 12, and the fourth May 24.

The AEC and the Pentagon said at the start of this year's nuclear tests that some of the detonations would be announced.

U. S. Still Not To Recognize Chinese Reds

WASHINGTON, June 11 (UPI)—American officials said today the United States has no present intention of recognizing Red China even if it is forced to negotiate with the communist nation on a nuclear test ban.

The United States has steadfastly resisted all pressure to grant diplomatic recognition to the Peking regime even though some of its chief allies have done so. In view of domestic political factors, there was virtually no likelihood either way Democratic or Republican parties would approve recognition soon.

The issue arose yesterday, however, when Dulles hinted at a news conference that the United States might have to deal with Red China any future ban against nuclear testing.

He said East-West scientists scheduled to meet soon to discuss ways of reducing a test suspension might recommend that inspection stations be established in Red China to check on cheating of such a ban.

President Eisenhower originally suggested such a meeting be held in Geneva. Premier Nikita Khrushchev and Soviet Foreign Minister Gromyko agreed. In a new letter to the Soviet leader made public yesterday, Eisenhower proposed the talks be held in Geneva starting about July 1.

The President said the West would be represented by scientists from this country, Britain, France and perhaps other nations. He said he did not object to Khrushchev's proposal that Poland and Czechoslovakia also be represented.

Hagerman Visits

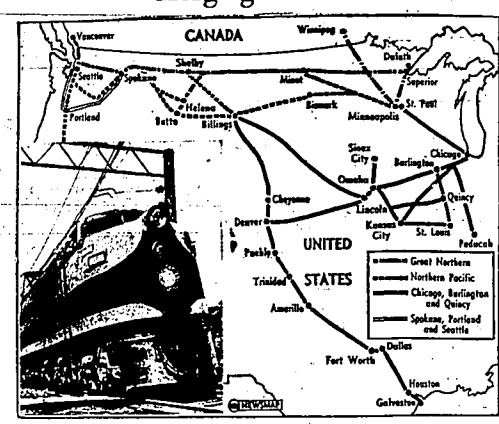

Students May Raise Jobless Lists in June

WASHINGTON, June 11 (UPI)—Students' luck in finding jobs across the country this week will be the up-off on how much of a June boom in unemployment will be recorded this year.

The government count of the nation's jobless for this month will start next week when interviewers begin making the rounds of 35,000 sample households.

An outpouring of youngsters from the schools and colleges is expected to boost the unemployment total, but many government economists doubt seriously that it will reach 6 million as Labor Secretary James P. Mitchell indicated.

There is little doubt, however, that unemployment will again soar past the 5 million mark. It dipped to 4,900,000 in May.

The federal fact-finders will not count as unemployed those youngsters who are loafing this summer and not actively looking for work. Children under 18 are not counted at all.

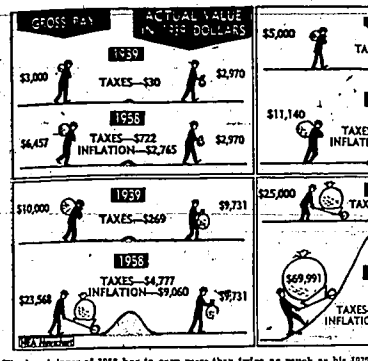
"They've got to make some effort to find a job at some time—and not find one—to be classified as unemployed," a census bureau statistician said.

Unemployment usually goes up by 15 per cent from May to June because of the rush for jobs by teenagers. Economists doubt that it will rise by that much this year considering the high level of unemployment now.

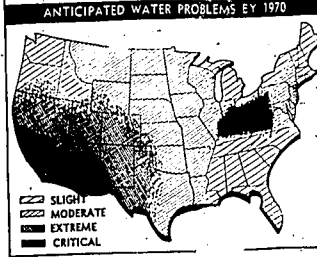
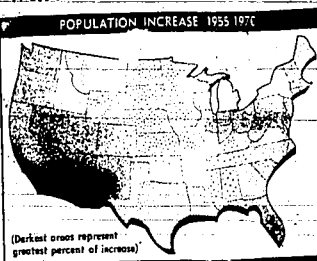

Henry Wallace Says Chinese May Dominate Next Century

KIAMESHA LAKE, N. Y., June 11 (AP)—Former Vice President Henry Wallace, who once called this the century of the common man, told both Russia and the United States last night that the next one may be "the Chinese century."

Wallace also said he has "no illusions about the common man" and believes that "this century can be one of cruelty and the most extreme violence and suffering."

In a speech before a convention of the Jewish organization B'nai B'rith in New York, Wallace also said the United States should fight if Russia moves into Turkey.

Wallace appeared there to receive a "world peace award" from the organization, attended by delegates from 200 lodges across the country.

The onetime new deal cabinet member, who ran a poor third in the 1948 presidential campaign amid charges his Progressive party was dominated by the communists, said that he believed Russia, to save herself, must join the Western nations in solving the problem of the "population explosion" in the world's backward areas.

"The Chinese people with their very great abilities and their rapid population increase will swamp Russia in the East and make the 21st century into a Chinese century if prompt and constructive action is not taken by the West, including Russia."

Senator Raps GOP Attacks At Labor Bill

WASHINGTON, June 11 (UPI)—Senate Democratic whip Mike Mansfield accused the administration today of playing "political football" with the senate labor reform bill.

The Montana lawmaker said Republicans should get behind the moderate measure approved by the senate labor committee "instead of throwing roadblocks in its way."

Mansfield suggested that some Republicans were more interested in building up an election issue than in stamping out evils exposed by the senate fact-finding committee.

At the same time, he rebuked Labor Secretary James P. Mitchell, who is attending an international labor meeting in Switzerland, for pontificating from 2,500 miles away.

Mitchel Starts Now

Mitchell teased a match into a politically-inflammable mix at a 4 1/2 hour session of the international labor meeting today, and urged adoption of the administration's more stringent proposals.

The administration bill would require all unions to file reports on finances and hold democratic elections, but it would exempt unions with less than 200 members and less than \$25,000 annual gross receipts.

The administration contends the committee bill would exempt 60 per cent of unions from regulation under the law.

Mansfield declined to predict whether the move to make administration-proposed changes in the committee bill would succeed.

Defeat Expected

But Sen. Barry Goldwater, R-Ariz., one of the foremost advocates of a stronger bill, virtually conceded defeat.

The outspoken Goldwater told reporters "it's the only political issue we had and I think we muffed it. I hope we can get it back."

The labor legislation issue built up almost overnight into a major battle with the issuance of Mitchell's statement.

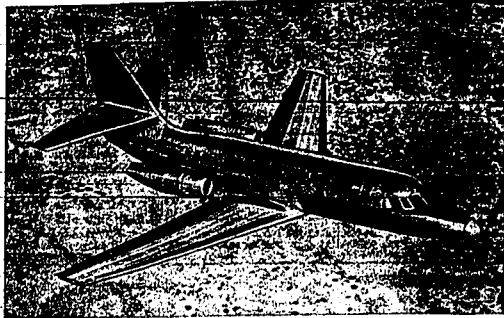

Colorado Planes Drop Poison To Save Wheat From Hoppers

DENVER, June 11 (AP)—The battle to save the state's 10-million-acre multi-million-dollar wheat crop from destruction by grasshoppers.

Eight planes loaded with poison are operating over parts of 9 million acres of cropland and pasture in 17 counties. Much of the area is planted in wheat and the crop is valued at \$10 million dollars.

The Colorado agriculture department is using its own money to spray 300,000 acres. The emergency action was ordered to kill the hopper before they develop wings and migrate to other lush grain fields. If the pests aren't killed by mid-June it may be too late. Full-scale operations are to begin tomorrow.

The hoppers now number up to 400 to the square yard, about 10 times the normal danger point. Frightened farmers have already started their own ground and aerial spray programs.

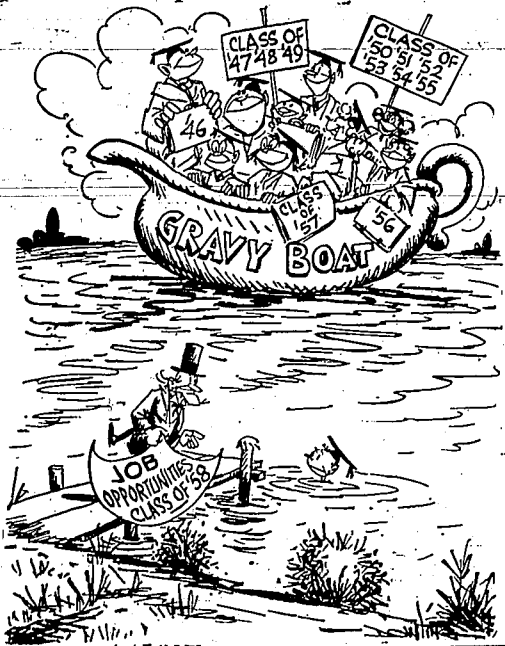

Record Fund Reported for Ads in Paper

Sears, Roebuck and company in 1957 reported a record-breaking \$46,472,000 in newspaper advertising space. A. E. Vaughn, local Sears store manager, said today.

This total marked the 12th consecutive year of record newspaper advertising expenditures for Sears and topped 1956's previous high of \$42,470,000 by 22 per cent, Vaughn said.

Sears' 1957 expenditure was spread among 993 daily and weekly newspapers located in every state and amounted to 277,231,200 lines of advertising.

Vaughn stated that his company's newspaper dollar expenditures in 1957 represented 78 1/2 per cent of Sears' total local retail advertising expenditure. The total retail media expense of \$69,810,000 was also a record high, exceeding the 1956 figure by 3 per cent.

Other local media which shared in a \$18,000,000 national expenditure last year included radio and television, circulars and direct mail. In 1957 Sears had retail and mail order sales amounting to \$3,600,882,122, the largest in the firm's 71-year history. The company added seven new stores during the year to bring the total in this country, as of Jan. 31, 1958, to 724, Vaughn said.
