### Senator Sees No Change in Defense Bill

WASHINGTON, June 13 (UPI)—Sen. Richard D. Russell, D. Ga., today told the senate, like the house, that he will not support a bill to change the defense reorganization plan without changes that would be satisfactory to the military and the public.

Russell, chairman of the senate subcommittee which held hearings on military reorganization last week, said the bill approved by the house "will be satisfactory to the military with a few adjustments."

The house passed its bill (H.R. 102) by only one vote, 317-316, in a vote on June 10. In the senate, the bill was rejected by a vote of 54-46.

Russell said he did not believe the senate would vote "abdication" of its constitutional defense responsibilities.

He said President Franklin D. Roosevelt, Harry E. Truman and now Dwight D. Eisenhower have all favored defense reorganization bills. "But we have not yet given the military the right to participate in the decisions," he said.

### Russia Won't Help Release 9 Americans

BERLIN, June 13 (UPI)—The Russians refused today to help release the nine Americans held captive in the Soviet zone of Germany, insisting that the U. S. government must first release the East German regime for their freedom.

U. S. officials had made it a condition of the release of the nine prisoners that the East German government should release the nine prisoners.

Today's Soviet rejection, after the U. S. appeal had been ignored for nearly a week, presumably opened the way for talks with the East Germans. U. S. authorities insist that negotiations will not imply any measure of recognition of the East German regime.

The communists are holding the Americans, captured when their helicopter strayed over the Iron Curtain border, as hostages in an effort to force U. S. recognition of the German "sovereign" satellite state.

The West Berlin newspaper Der Abend reported today that the Americans are being held at a red police station in Robinson Strasse, under constant interrogation but not otherwise ill-treated.

Western officials said the Abend story is "very probable."

### Confidence Rises in Advance Of Forces Against Recession

NEW YORK, June 13 (UPI)—Confidence is rising today that the business soundness of the economy is winning the fight against the forces of recession.

Upturns in some industries this month and the official figures on May show gains in many sectors of the economy are helping to dispel the gloom.

At the same time, more soothsayers are stretching out their time tables when guessing the date of a general upturn. What they see just ahead is a long stalemate.

With employment and personal incomes gaining in May over April, with 64 million Americans having jobs and total wages and salaries increasing for the first time since the slump began, with retail sales rising from their March lows, some are asking now: "Where is the recession? How can anyone say there is one?"

The same official figures give the answer. Total employment went up in May. But employment in manufacturing plants continued to slide, off 67,000 from April. Total wages and salaries rose by 700 million dollars at an annual rate. But in the manufacturing sector of the economy the long downturn continued.

That is where the recession is. Manufacturing, especially the making of durable goods for consumers and capital-goods for industries, is where the recession has concentrated.

"If you don't work in a factory affected by the slump, if you don't live in a community where factory payrolls are the major item in the area's economic life, then you may well say, 'We see no recession.'"

But the overall picture is a bit brighter today. The May and June figures show that the economy is still in a state of flux.

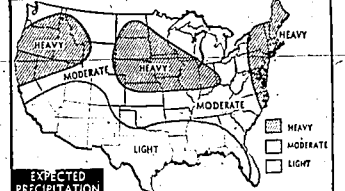

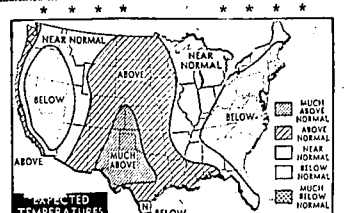

"The communists are going to pass the world unless American youths are willing to dedicate themselves to Christ and march in his footsteps," Graham told an audience of 2,000 persons at a luncheon here.

"Life in America, he said, has become one of 'softness, ease and comfort.'"

"The communists are out-dedicated," he said. "They have been teaching Christian lessons in disguise."

"These people in Russia aren't lazy. Millions of them are dedicated. They're out to change the world, 'are you willing to change the world for Christ?'"

At one point in his sermon, Graham asked all those under 25 years of age to stand up. Most of those in the audience rose. Thursday night is the "young people's night" in Graham's church.

Graham predicted the communists might take over the world for a short time. But, he added, "The King of Kings will come back."

### Rocket Group Urged to Quit In Blast at Department Head

IDAHO FALLS, June 13 (UPI)—The attorney for the Idaho Falls Rocket Research society, urging the group to disband, described state aeronautics Director Cliff Moulton yesterday as a "rocket czar."

Members of the society were polled on whether they wish to disband. William Byron, a scientist at the national reactor testing station and founder of the group, said he felt it should suspend activity.

Reginald Reeves, the attorney, said in a statement to the members that he felt the group should be disbanded because of what he called Moulton's "unreasonable restrictions and lack of cooperation."

"There is serious doubt that Moulton has statutory authority for becoming a 'single rocket czar,'" Reeves said.

Moulton, who has decided not to be drawn into a public argument with Reeves, is seeking to establish special sites at which supervised rocket firings could be conducted at specified times, probably once a month. He has stressed that it is difficult to find sufficiently wide-open spaces so that rockets can be safely fired over land.

It came one day afternoon with a double-header between Boston and Cleveland. In the first game, Williams couldn't be stopped. He pitched three towering home runs.

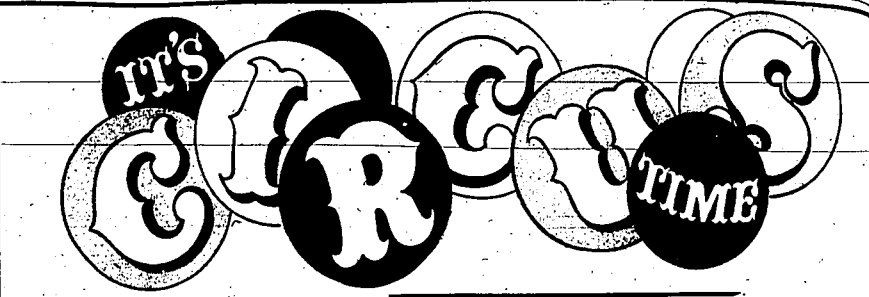
