



### New Services Listed by Bus Firm for T. F.

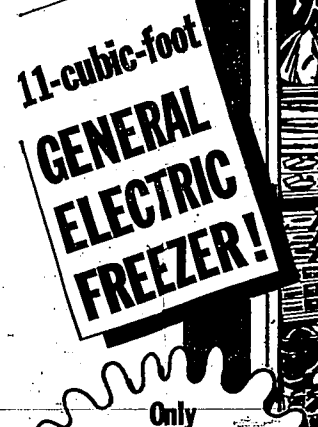

## Modest Increases Looming in U.S. Acreage of Sugar Beets

WASHINGTON, June 16 (Special)—Look for some further modest increases in coming months in the present tight acreage restrictions on U.S. mainland production of sugar beets. There also may be some increase in sugar cane, although supplies of sugar from cane are relatively larger than from sugar beets. The U. S. department of agriculture recently raised the acreage from which sugar beets can be harvested this year from 815,000 to 825,000. Sugar cane acreage this past winter totaled 40,000 acres in Florida and 250,000 in Louisiana. Reason for the increases is pessimistic outlook in Hawaii and Puerto Rico for any sizeable sugar in output until the end of next year. The USDA already has announced that both Hawaii and Puerto Rico will fall about one-third short of their market quotas this year. The total deficit is some 300,000 tons for each. This has been distributed as follows: U. S. beet sugar, 253,000 and mainland cane, 27,800 or 13 percent increase in quota for each and Cuba, 225,000 (10 per cent increase in quota).

In mid-June Hawaiian sugar planters finally signed a three-year contract with union labor on terms generally favorable to the union boys, notorious lethargic Harry Bridges. The settlement followed a 129-day strike during which the irrigation plantations were damaged heavily. Crops are harvested every two years, so this means injury to both 1933 and 1934 crops. Puerto Rico this year was plagued with a drought. Last year, it fell 1933 and 1934 crop. The balance of the rollover, \$1,115,251,000, went into a 14 per cent certificate.

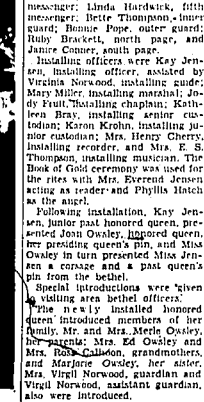

More Aid for Producers of Metal Slated

WASHINGTON, June 16 (AP)—A better deal for lead and zinc producers may be in the offing as a result of an announcement by the Eisenhower administration's mineral subsidy proposal.

The mineral subsidy proposal is holding hearings on the administration's price stabilization plan. The plan would provide price supports for copper, lead, zinc, tungsten and silver.

Copper will be stricken from the bill as a result of an announcement by the administration is recommending a purchase-subsidy plan for copper.

Opposition Falls Off The announcement came as the house debated a reciprocal trade bill, which passed without opposition from western congressmen who favor high tariffs on copper imports.

One of the congressmen, asking that the mineral subsidy plan be a new lead and zinc plan is being studied at the White House and it is expected to be announced soon.

The new plan reportedly calls for higher prices and subsidies for lead and zinc. It would be financed through a new tax on the interior department. This would eliminate the necessity for annual appropriations by congress.

Plan Criticized Mining industry witnesses announced that they are not in favor of annual appropriations, saying uncertainty from year to year would restrict expansion and development of new reserves.

### Fund Hearing Date Is Set by Area Council

SHOSHONE, June 16 — Public hearing on proposed budget for the city of Shoshone is set for 8 p.m. July 1 at the city hall by the city council.

The levy will remain the same as in 1957 at 25 mills on the dollar or \$2.50 for each \$10,000 of assessed value for the fiscal year runs from May 1, 1957, to April 30, 1958.

The tax levy will raise \$21,418 on the \$81,858 valuation of property in the city limits. Revenue from other sources expected to raise water, beer and liquor licenses, state highway allocations, state and municipal liquor, entertainments and miscellaneous items.

There is a balance of about \$20,000 and the three total \$78,301.50 for the year's expenses.

The budget is set higher than actual cost for each item of last year, to allow for emergency.

The levy by departments. Includes 2 1/2 mills for general fund, 3 mills for library, 1 1/2 mills for the fire department, 6 mills for street lighting and 1 mill for recreation fund. In dollars and cents, the levy should produce \$20,418 for the general fund, \$1,833.57 for the library, \$917.78 for the fire department, \$471.15 for the street lighting and \$202.24 for the recreation fund.

The city will use most of the cash balance for operation expense until the taxes are levied in December for the first half of the 1958 tax year.

### LDS Aide Says Mankind's Duty Is to Be Happy

SALT LAKE CITY, June 16 (AP)—Richard L. Evans, member of the Council of Twelve Apostles of the LDS church, said yesterday that mankind has the "duty to be happy" and God gave mankind commandments by which to be happy.

Evans' address concluded the 50th annual conference of the LDS church, which is being held at the Salt Lake Tabernacle, drew a large gathering of young members and leaders of the church.

Evans said "I have a conviction that we are to be happy. But God knows our natures, so he gave us the commandments, for we can't have happiness unless we keep these commandments."

### Adams' Judgment Was Faulty In Taking Goldfine's Favors

WASHINGTON, June 16 (AP)—The best that can be said for Sherman Adams, the President's No. 1 assistant, is that his judgment was faulty. Some Republicans want him thrown out. Democrats will use him as a campaign issue in the 1958 election.

Any man in public office, like Adams, must decide about accepting gifts or favors from individuals whose interests may conflict with the public interest. Adams accepted favors from Goldfine, a newspaperman, which Adams left himself open to suspicion of using his influence to repay the gifts or favors, although no one knows better than Adams that the man around a president can ill afford to be in debt.

It was this same highly moralistic New Englander who helped heavy supplies on the farm around President Truman in the 1952 campaign when the main Republican theme was "throw the rascals out."

Many men who feel they have a public trust have a simple rule of life: "I will not accept anything from anyone unless I can give him from my present embarrassment."

It's this: Never accept a gift or favor if it can remotely affect your private conscience or public interest or even give an impression of doing so. Some members of congress feel that way.

Take newspaperman Smith. If Jones, a public relations man, comes around later with a story, Smith would be confronted with this problem:

If he used the story, he might ever afterwards feel he had been influenced to do so, even though only subconsciously, by a sense of gratitude for the gift; if he threw the story away, to avoid such a feeling, he might be unfair to Jones.

So, such a newsmen would reason, he never should let himself be in position of having to worry about judging a story on anything except its merit.

Adams took free hotel accommodations, amounting to \$2,000, from a man he called an old family friend: Bernard Goldfine, a Boston businessman. The White House has refused to confirm or deny reports that Adams accepted a \$700 Vienna coat and a \$2,400 rug. On Goldfine's behalf Adams made inquiries to two government agencies—the federal trade commission—with whom Goldfine was having trouble, and arranged for an interview with the FTC chairman.

Adams denies any impropriety he used his influence—and he has tremendous influence in the government—with the two agencies to benefit Goldfine. But the fact that Adams President Eisenhower's No. 1 man, even inquired about Goldfine's troubles raises a question: Is Adams influential? What is the commissioners consider such an inquiry from Adams pressure for Goldfine to do a simple routine query? The commissioners depend on the White House for their jobs, since it's the President who appoints them.

They know Adams doesn't inquire about every businessman in trouble. It seems pretty certain comparatively few businessmen in trouble can get within a mile of Adams, much less get him interested in their case.

—This was the first time Adams has figured in the news for going to a government agency for some special group or individual. It's because of his job as assistant to the President, he enjoys a sanctuary most citizens don't have.
