Cantaloupes and strawberries are rated as good buys. Southern cherries and western cherries are somewhat more plentiful, but are a little higher priced.

Hungarian AP Reporter Tells Of Last Meetings With Nagy

(Editor's note: Editor Martin, for 10 years an Associated Press correspondent in Budapest, spent 18 months in a detention camp in Hungary in 1952, in time to report on the trial of the Communist leaders at the risk of his life. He is now in the United States, and his report on the last meetings with Nagy is the most complete and accurate yet. Martin tells of his last meetings with Nagy, the exiled Hungarian leader.)

WASHINGTON, June 19 (AP)—Imre Nagy was a veteran, hard-core Communist. I was a Western newspaper reporter, and I had warm feelings toward this hard-core Communist.

"I achieved something unexpected," he said. "Thought a Communist, he was the leader of an anti-Communist revolution, a symbol followed by a nation that had been oppressed for a long time."

I met him several times in July and August 1952, four months after Joseph Stalin died—Hungary's great leader. Nagy was in the Hungarian parliament and Nagy took over dramatically.

The new premier proclaimed the most far-reaching New Look program of the post-Stalin period. It remained unique because the other Red satellites followed it only halfheartedly.

I hurried out from the foreign correspondents' box that day to file the story. I bumped into Nagy in the corridor.

"Mr. Premier, this is a sensation," I said.

"It is?" he replied. "Well, maybe it is. But don't make it bigger than it is."

Eighteen months later Budapest announced Nagy was "ill" and would be inactive for several months. It was also reported that Georgi Malenkov, Nagy's opposite number in Moscow, had resigned.

On Feb. 24, 1953, I was arrested. For weeks the Communists secret police grilled me. They tried to get me to testify that Nagy was a tool of American imperialism. That has now been refuted by Christian M. Havndal, U. S. minister to Hungary.

gary at the time. I refused to give any such testimony.

Im Nagy was in a revolutionary ferment when I was released. Nagy was expelled from the Communist party. I met him again, on a bus. He greeted me warmly. He knew my story.

Such things should never happen again," he told me.

In 1952, the body of Laszlo Rakl, the Tislat foreign minister, executed in 1949 was exhumed and returned with great pomp. Nagy made a dramatic appearance at the ceremony.

It was the dress rehearsal of the revolution. Against government wishes, hundreds of thousands demonstrated openly against the regime at the cemetery.

Nagy was late. He did not join the row of Communist politicians. Instead he stood behind the haggard figure of Mrs. Rakl, the widow. She had been released from prison.

After the ceremony, Perenc Munch, now prime minister of Hungary, went over to Nagy and embraced and kissed him publicly. It was the kiss of Judas.

Then after the revolution, I heard from Nagy again. He was a refugee in the Yugoslav legation, Humon, in Budapest. He was negotiating with the puppet regime of János Kadar.

One day a note reached me from Nagy. Somebody had smuggled it out of the legation.

It was only a few scribbled lines: "I want the world to know that there can be no compromise. I do not negotiate with Kadar. The Soviets have to respect the agreement I made with Mikoyan. I trust you will tell this to the world."

I did. And that was my last contact with Nagy.

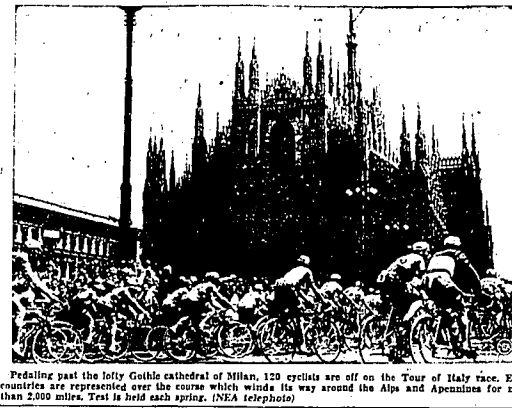

Prisoner May Gain Fortune On New Toys

CHESTER, Ill., June 18 (AP)—A convict serving a 100-year term in Edward G. Penitentiary stands to make a fortune from "Konzo Safari," a child's toy.

The toy was designed by Clyde Wagner, 42-year-old murderer. Wagner has submitted toy ideas to manufacturers. He holds 70 patents and since 1941 has invented more than 750 items, ranging from a new type coffee pin to jet aircraft.

His "Konzo Safari," a push-pull elephant train, was accepted by a toy manufacturer who reported he displayed the toy at an industrial show in New York this spring and received 700,000 orders.

Wagner's royalty is 3 cents on each toy. He could get \$30,000 from this toy alone if 700,000 are sold.

It was convicted murderer for the slaying of an Alton, Ill., policeman during an argument. He won't be eligible to seek parole until he serves a third of his 100-year term.

What would Wagner do with such a bundle of money?

He said he'd spend it to keep working on still other ideas.
