MOSCOW, July 28. (UPI)—Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev agreed today to hold a summit conference in Geneva or any other city in Europe if New York is not satisfactory from a security standpoint. ## 'Tke' Asks for Boost In U.S. Debt Ceiling

WASHINGTON, July 28 (UPI)—President Eisenhower asked congress today for a 10 billion dollar increase in the permanent national debt limit to 235 billion dollars. In identical letters to the house and senate, he also asked that the temporary debt limit be boosted to 288 billion dollars. The present temporary limit is 280 billion dollars. Authority for the present temporary limit expires next June 30, after which the present 275-billion permanent ceiling. Eisenhower, in letters to Speaker Sam Rayburn and Vice President Richard M. Nixon, said the "deficit outlook for the current fiscal year makes it obvious that the debt cannot be reduced to its permanent ceiling of 275 billion dollars." He asked congress to provide for an increase of three billion dollars to run through June 30, 1959.
