National guard armories for Twin Falls and Jerome were one step closer Wednesday with the authorization by the senate of funds for local construction. The funds are contained in a military construction authorization containing \$2,314,000 for Idaho installations, including \$2,138,000 for the Mountain Home air force base, \$90,000 for a Twin Falls armory, and \$176,000 for an armory at Jerome. Although the projects and project funds are now authorized by the senate, the actual construction of the projects will still require the approval of the House. In the House, the appropriation of the funds for the projects is expected to be approved in the next few days.

Macmillan Urges Russian Leader to Attend Confab
LONDON, July 31—Prime Minister Macmillan today asked Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev to attend a summit meeting on the Middle East Aug. 12-13 in New York or elsewhere. He proposed discussions both informally and under United Nations auspices. He said he would personally attend the Aug. 12 meeting and added that the President of the United States would not be willing to go either to Geneva or New York. The prime minister's request to the house of commons the text of a letter which he had arranged to have delivered to the Soviet premier in Moscow only a short time before he had returned to London. Representatives on the security council which would include national capitals should come to the meeting place.

Price Boosts Prepared by Steel Groups

NEW YORK, July 31 (UPI)—A new round of price increases in the steel industry, the smallest in recent years.

Three major steel companies—Republic Steel, Jones and Laughlin Steel Corporation and Armco Steel Corporation—have announced price increases of about \$1.50 a ton to an average price of about \$45.75.

The increase in Washington where the reaction in the steel industry is expected to be less than in the steel industry, which is recovering from a one-year recession.

Iron Age, an authoritative steel trade magazine, predicted that by the end of the week all steel prices except those for tin plate that goes into cans will have been raised.

The new round marks the first in recent years that U. S. Steel has not raised its price for steel. The company, which produces more than 2 million tons of steel a year, has not been the price leader.

Iron Age says it is "still studying" the situation.

The companies say a \$1.50 per ton increase is designed to offset higher wages that have taken effect since the last general increase in steel prices of \$1 a ton on July 1, 1957.

However, they emphasize that the increase will enable them to recover less than 30 per cent of the higher wages. They say they must work the balance.

The increase originally had been expected July 1 when steelworkers were given an additional 20 cents a hour under a three-year union contract.

Steel industry experts note that a \$1.50 a ton increase is about \$1 earlier than had been expected and is smaller both dollarwise and in per cent than increases in recent years.

Among the reasons for this are pressure to hold the price line and customer opposition to anything more than a nominal increase under current competitive conditions.

Iron Age speculates that the companies also may be thinking of steel as a commodity in 1959 when present contracts expire. A less-than-expected increase now could be used as an argument against another steel wage boost next year.

GI Cleared in Korean Death

SEOUL, Korea, July 31 (UPI)—The U. S. army cleared today a sergeant who shot and killed a Korean man he caught stealing in a trench division compound.

Abused from blame was Sgt. Eric W. Blinn, 25, of Cicero, Ill. Sergeant Blinn was acting in the performance of his official duty as an army spokesman. He was on guard duty at a trench division storage area on July 29 when he saw two Koreans behind the area with two water pumps. He fired three warning shots. When the Koreans did not stop, he fired again.

Sgt. Blinn, 25, was fatally wounded. The other Korean escaped.

Peace Completely Restored in Haiti

PORT AU PRINCE, July 31 (UPI)—The government said yesterday that it has completely restored peace in Haiti after a year of civil war.

Forty persons including four Americans died in the pocket revolt that was set off Monday night and ended throughout Tuesday. Seventeen persons were wounded.

Port Au Prince was calm Wednesday. Business went on as usual. The influx into the capital was resumed. Censorship of foreign news agencies was lifted.

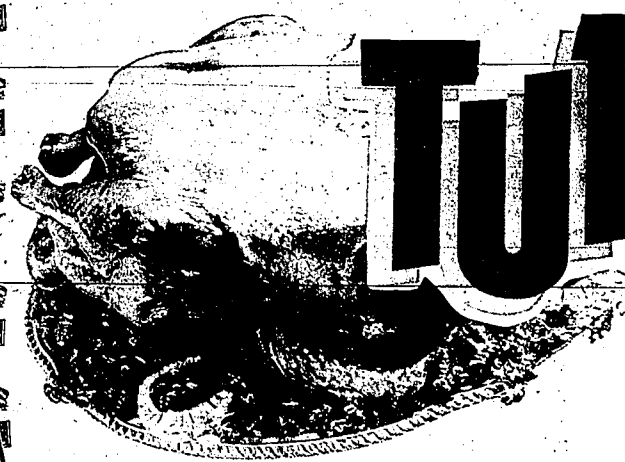

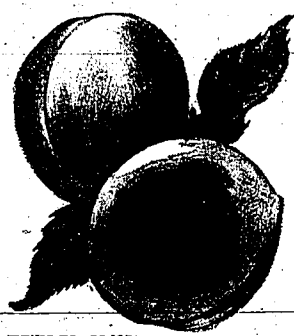

Surplus Setup Full-Time Job, Admiral Notes

BOISE, July 31 (AP)—The director of Idaho's surplus property distribution program has developed a full-time job for a retired naval officer.

Rear Adm. William C. Specht, California, for the past three years has been Idaho's civil defense director.

But he said yesterday the job of supervising the distribution of the increasing volume of surplus property made available to governmental units and agencies in Idaho has developed into a full-time job. He resigned Tuesday as civil defense director and Lieut. Col. James G. Keel, a national guard officer, was named to succeed him.

The surplus property program is developing into something tremendous," Specht said. "It is making available to Idaho school districts, hospitals and civil defense organizations usable material at a fraction of the original cost."

The merchandise is made available to the program by the federal government. It is provided without cost but the receiving agency must pay for any transportation costs involved in getting it to the spot where it can be used.

Agencies receiving the merchandise also must pay the overhead costs of operating the program. Specht said the cost averages out at about 5 to 10 per cent of the original cost of the merchandise involved in most cases. In some instances where materials must be transported a long distance the cost goes up to 20 per cent of original cost.

Materials varied. Agencies receiving include all types of office supplies and office machines. There are vehicles of all types and all kinds of shop equipment.

"In fact," Specht said, "we are handling almost everything except groceries and livestock."

He estimated the volume of merchandise now being handled in Idaho would cost—at original prices—an average of \$100,000 per month.

Specht emphasized the expense of administering the program are paid by recipients of the materials. He said the program is involved in the state level.

KIRKUK, Iraq, July 31 (UPI)—This is where it all begins and this is where it all may end some day.

Here of Iraq lies—the fabulous Kirkuk oil belt. Here are a maze of wells, pipelines, tank farms, generators and pumps—all incredibly quiet in their movement under the three summer heat.

And from here spider out the pipelines to the Mediterranean across hundreds of miles of desert. A little more than 750,000 gallons of oil an hour are now passing through the 16-inch and the 10-inch arteries westward.

It goes at a pulsating 45 miles an hour, represented when impinged by isolated desert pumping stations with names such as K2, K3, K4, K5, K6, K7, K8, K9, K10, K11, K12, K13, K14, K15, K16, K17, K18, K19, K20, K21, K22, K23, K24, K25, K26, K27, K28, K29, K30, K31, K32, K33, K34, K35, K36, K37, K38, K39, K40, K41, K42, K43, K44, K45, K46, K47, K48, K49, K50, K51, K52, K53, K54, K55, K56, K57, K58, K59, K60, K61, K62, K63, K64, K65, K66, K67, K68, K69, K70, K71, K72, K73, K74, K75, K76, K77, K78, K79, K80, K81, K82, K83, K84, K85, K86, K87, K88, K89, K90, K91, K92, K93, K94, K95, K96, K97, K98, K99, K100.

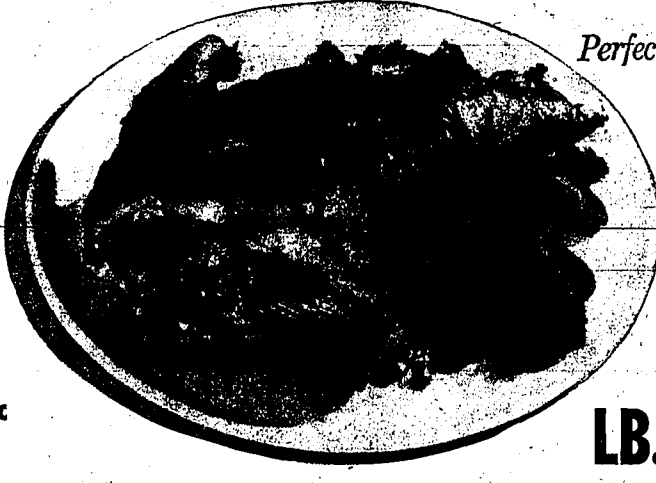

"We were brought here to teach Frenchmen the oil business but no one listens to us," is a standard complaint of American oilmen here. All complain of a bitter anti-American feeling throughout the area.

Francis's dream of becoming an oil nation.

"They Can Have It!"

They act as if we were here to take over their oil fields," says Tom Miller from Los Angeles who asked that his name not be used. "All I can say is they can have it. They way they run things here, there won't be anything left here in a year but sand and abandoned derricks."

Many Americans working here believe that the oil companies of the Hassel Messaoud field have been exaggerated for political purposes. One American supervisor Paul R. Downs, Bakerfield, Calif., says "It's an oil field that can produce."

There is a lot of bitterness toward the U. S. oilmen among young French engineers and technicians, many of whom fear that their lack of experience is too obvious alongside veterans from Texas and California.

"They (Americans) act as if they were supermen," complained one Frenchman. "They can't believe anybody can do anything better than they."

"The French are jealous of our skill and experience," said an American technician. "After all, we've been in the oil business for 100 years and they only five. And they refuse to understand this."

Reds Declare French Setup Dictatorship

PARIS, July 31 (UPI)—French communists and leftwingers today accused Gen. Charles de Gaulle of setting up a "author mode" constitution to keep himself in power as a dictator.

The attack on the 67-year-old president was led by the official communist newspaper, *L'Humanite*, following publication of the proposed new constitution yesterday.

De Gaulle, the nation to whom the constitution is a referendum this fall, ending the fourth year of his setting up the fifth republic and setting up the fifth republic.

The proposed constitution would give sweeping powers to the French president for the first time in modern history and sharply trim the power of parliament, which has been able to break governments. Since 1946, France has had 25 governments.

The draft constitution, on which a committee is now working, would give the president, now a figurehead, all the powers of a monarch, including the power to designate a candidate for the job as he deems necessary. There will be no investigation by the national assembly, which many believe has been unable to make a candidate.

The president will be elected for a seven-year term by an electoral college.

Canada, U. S. Concerns Vie In Insurance

NEW YORK, July 31 (AP)—The insurance salesman is playing a two-way street across our northern boundary. The busy financial thought between Canada and the United States shows a traffic increase today in insurance as well as in capital investment.

Sales both here and there have increased despite the recession. Auto life insurance policies of all types, foreign and domestic—by companies, savings banks, fraternal and investment organizations and the government's veterans kind—now come to more than 500 billion dollars and involve 121 million Americans.

Canadian companies sold nearly a billion dollars of life insurance to Americans last year for a gain of 90 million dollars over 1955. U. S. companies peddled more than 1 1/2 billion dollars in policies to our northern neighbors for an increase of almost 200 million dollars.

The Canadians are particularly strong in selling annuities to Americans. U. S. salesmen at selling ordinary life policies.

But the recent report on the part of American salesmen hasn't had such much effect yet on the overall exchange of American and Canadian dollars in premiums and benefits.

fits, both of which are in pretty close balance. This could be changed in the future if the American gains of the last two years fall into a definite trend.

Capital investment by Americans in Canadian securities and in development of Canadian resources has fretted some Canadians who fear it might lead to financial influences over Canada. President Eisenhower and Prime Minister Diefenbaker discussed this trouble spot in the President's recent visit there.

In the case of the insurance companies, however, total outside investments are still in favor of the

Canadians. The 12 Canadian companies doing business in this country have invested 1 1/2 billion dollars here. The 25 U. S. companies doing business in Canada last year had 1 1/2 billion dollars in assets there.

Speech-School Well Attended

STATE COLLEGE, Pocatello, July 31—Patients from Idaho, P.A. Butley, Malad and several other south and east Idaho communities have been commencing to take State college for therapy at the college's speech and hearing clinic this summer.

Dorris H. Breitenfeldt, acting director, said the clinic has given much therapy to 42 patients during the summer session. Most of them have four half-hour appointments each.

However, he said, primary mission of the clinic during the summer month is leading school teachers in speech correction techniques. Enrollment for the 1958 summer program, much of it, was an all-time high. The students work in pairs as part of their training.

Most of the summer patients were children. Their problems included soft palate, deafness, cerebral palsy, brain injuries resulting in impaired speech and delayed speech. The former students, with up to 15 years teaching experience, do especially well in working with children patients, Breitenfeldt said.

Temperatures were up near 100 degrees when the storms hit and there was little relief in the heat afterwards, said residents. A number of sudden fires had occurred around southwestern Idaho during the past few days of hot weather, but no previous structural damage had been reported.

Lines Blown

Telephone lines were reported down in the area. Power failed in the city of Payette for about an hour. Radio station KPFD reported power failures interrupted its broadcasts for 10 minutes.

Three limbs were blown down including one that nearly hit a house and another that blocked 12th street.

Center street, one of the main streets in this town of more than 4,000 persons, was still blocked by water after the storm.

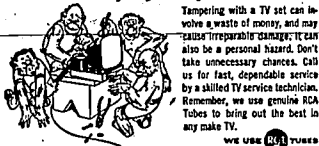

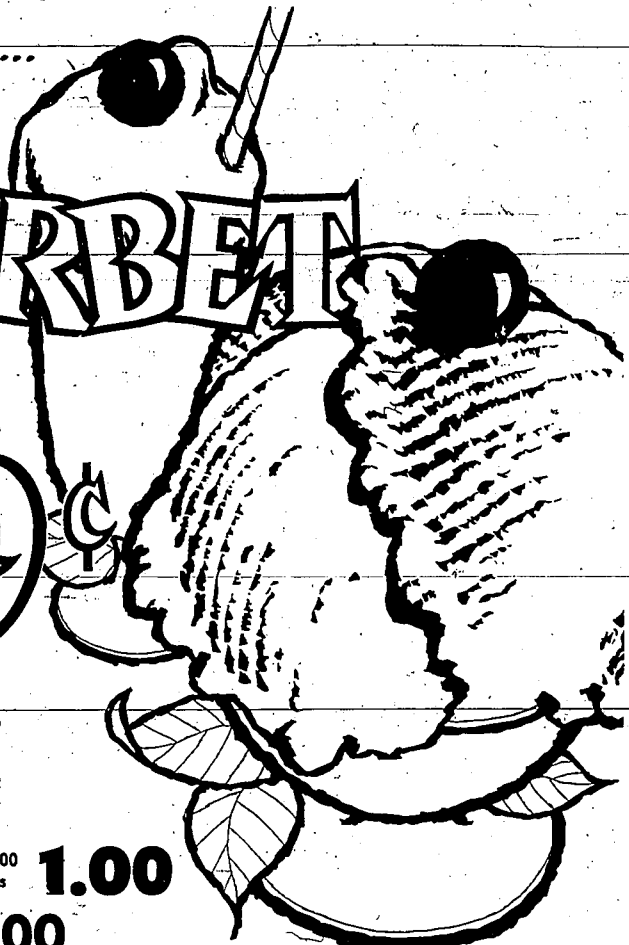

Faubus Takes Primary; Says "Ike" Helped

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., July 31 (UPI)—Gov. Arval E. Faubus yesterday credited the sending of federal troops to Little Rock in the integration crisis for a vote that gave him a third term by the biggest majority in Arkansas history. Almost complete returns from yesterday's Democratic primary gave him 59.9 per cent of the vote. The rest was almost evenly divided between his opponent, Little Rock Mayor Chris Finkbeiner, 37, and Judge Lee Ward, 51. Paragould, unofficial returns from the state's 2,330 precincts gave Faubus 59,278 votes, Finkbeiner 30,187 and Ward 58,622.

The voting was a condemnation by the people of illegal federal intervention in the affairs of the state and the horrifying use of federal bayonets in the streets of an American city and in the halls of a public school. Faubus, 48, said in his victory statement.

He meant President Eisenhower's sending of 1,000 troops of the 101st Airborne division to Little Rock last September to protect nine Negroes who enrolled in Central high school. Faubus had previously used two companies of the national guard to keep Negroes out of the grounds that integration of Central would provoke bloody violence.

Mrs. L. C. Bates, president of the Arkansas chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, declined to comment on Faubus' victory. She led the fight to get the Negroes into the school. Integration itself was not an election issue, since "wind and pine" being against it. The issue was what to do if a school were faced with integration.

Faubus said he'd call out the national guard again if he thought it necessary. Ward and Finkbeiner said they would never use the state militia to defy the government.

Harry B. Ashmore, Pulitzer prize winning executive editor of the Arkansas Gazette, read into Faubus' victory a powerful stimulant to integration. Resistance throughout the South.

He won the Pulitzer prize for a series of editorials last fall contending that the issue was not the right or wrong of segregation but defiance of the federal government. "The governor's course of resistance has been overwhelmingly endorsed," he said. "Faubus' victory has not the pattern for other southern politicians."

Tradition is so strong against a third term in Arkansas that only one other governor has "served" three terms. He was Jeff Davis, who served from 1900-1906.

Faubus carried all of the state's 19 counties, including the mountainous northwestern section of the state, where there are almost no Negroes.

An hour after the polls closed, there was no doubt that Faubus was in. The opponents conceded by 10 p.m. (CST).

Stock Protection Bill Is Approved

WASHINGTON, July 31 (AP)—The Senate agriculture committee yesterday approved legislation to protect livestock against disease from imported wild animals. The measure would prohibit importation from infected countries of animals subject to foot and mouth disease or rinderpest. The same bar already exists against domestic animals which might be carriers.

Senator Doubtful Of Forest Bill OK

WASHINGTON, July 31 (AP)—Sen. Henry C. Dworshak, R., Ida., said yesterday that despite approval of the House, Senate service he felt it was doubtful action could be taken at the current session of congress on a bill to expand a national forest area in Idaho. Dworshak introduced the bill which would add 4155 acres to the Payette and Boise national forests. The area would be intended for recreational development along the shore of Cascade reservoir. The bill is under consideration by the senate interior committee and has received approval of the forest service. Dworshak said, but added: "I fear that the lateness of the agency report and the crowded calendar may jeopardize chances of passage of the bill at this session."

Mystery Fireball Is Seen at Boise

BOISE, July 31 (AP)—Residents reported seeing a bright ball of red-dish fire fall across sides north of Gowen field about 10 p.m. Tuesday. One observer said the fireball appeared very bright and was trailing a tail of white flame. It appeared travelling from east to west and didn't look like either a falling star or meteor to another observer.

The Smithsonian observatory earlier predicted the rocket carrier for Sputnik would be visible about 11 p.m. MST in a line from northern Oregon to Florida. The sightings were reported here about an hour earlier.
