Group Giving Alarm on U.S. Water Supply

WASHINGTON, Aug. 6 (U.P.)—A group of scientists and engineers today issued a warning that the nation's water supply is being depleted at an alarming rate.

The public works and resources committee of the House of Representatives today issued a report which says that the nation's water supply is being depleted at an alarming rate.

The report said that with U. S. water use soaring from 40 billion gallons a day in 1900 to a predicted 200 billion by 1980, bold action is needed.

The United States will, within the next generation, face economic stagnation and resulting impairment of our national strength to an almost catastrophic degree.

The report by the subcommittee under Rep. Robert E. Jones, D. Ala., has not yet been made public officially. It was prepared for approval by the parent government operations committee Wednesday.

Congress has authorized a 10-million dollar, 14 year research program, started in 1952, to find a water conservation method cheap to be practical.

New Dam Starts

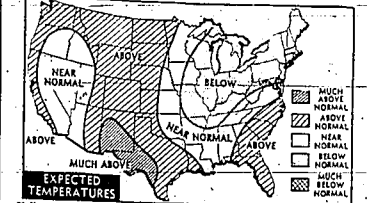

Vice President Chen Cheng officiated at a ceremony yesterday marking the beginning of construction of the 410-foot arch dam, scheduled for completion in 1961.

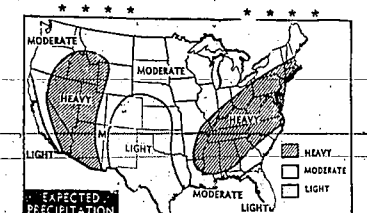
The dam is designed to boost Formosa's power output and to increase rice production through better irrigation and flood control.

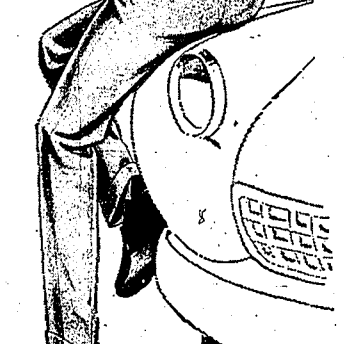

Plane Engine Developed in Use of Atoms

IDAHO FALLS, Aug. 6 (UP)—The prototype for a nuclear aircraft engine being developed west of here uses what is called the "direct-cycle" approach.

It was disclosed officially for the first time in the atomic energy commission's current semi-annual report.

The semi-annual report of January 1957, said that for the first time—late in 1956—a nuclear-turbine engine was operated "solely on nuclear power" at the national reactor testing station in eastern Idaho.

But it did not say how the engine worked. There is more than one way to hook up the atom to a turbine.

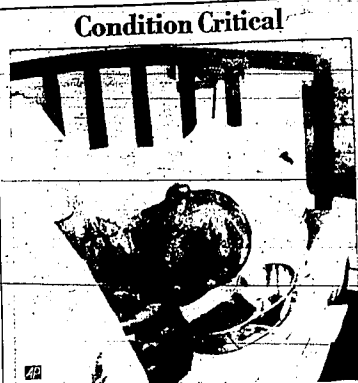
For instance another system is the "indirect-cycle" aircraft engine. Pratt and Whitney of United Aircraft corporation is working on the method at its laboratories in Middletown, Conn. But the whole engine has not yet been successfully operated, although the atom is used as a nuclear reactor part of it was first put into operation last month.

The General Electric company at Evendale, O., developed the direct-cycle engine that is first to be tested at this work at the testing station some 45 miles west of here.

The "indirect-cycle" operates like this: Incoming air is compressed, heated and re-circled; it enters the heat exchanger with turbine, the more heat the more force. This pushes the plane forward. The burning of gasoline provides the heat.

A reactor provides the heat in a nuclear turbine, takes the place of a gasoline combustion.

In the direct-cycle nuclear turbine the incoming air is compressed and goes directly to the reactor where it gets its heat. But in the indirect-cycle method the heat is taken from the core where fission occurs by some medium—perhaps liquid metal—and the metal runs through a sort of radiator which heats the incoming air.
