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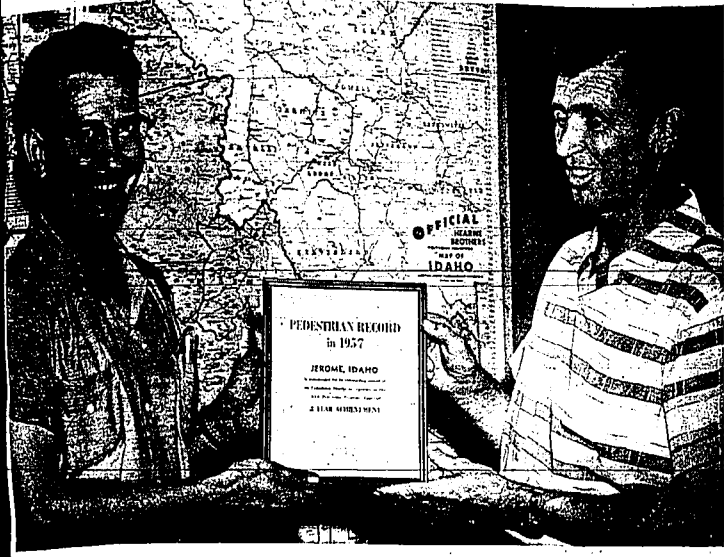
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Award Presented to Jerome for Safety Record

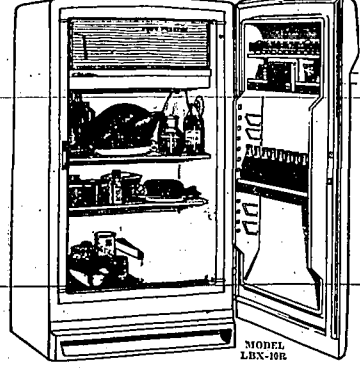
Camp Sessions in South Hills Come to End for This Season

33 Herds Get Top Butterfat Testing Count

JEROME, Aug. 8—Of the 30 herds on test in the Gooding-Lincoln-Jerome Dairy Herd Improvement association testing unit number two, 33 herds averaged over 30 pounds of butterfat for the month of July, according to the report of Ben Russell, tester for this unit.

Three top herds were all from Jerome. Lynn Jensen, Jerome, with 14 grade Holsteins, averaged 1560 pounds of milk and 49.8 pounds of butterfat. Gordon Martin, Jerome, with 13 registered Holsteins, averaged 1381 pounds of milk and 49.2 pounds of butterfat, and Archie Malone, Jerome, with 19 registered Holsteins, averaged 1474 pounds of milk and 49.2 pounds of butterfat.

Top 10 cows for the three counties were Maggie, registered Holstein, owned by Claude Bernard and sons, Hazelton, produced 2,820 pounds of milk and 115.6 pounds of butterfat. Bonita, registered Holstein, owned by Jack Edwards, produced 2,790 pounds of milk and 102.4 pounds of butterfat. Bobbie, grade Holstein, owned by F. C. Wentworth, Shoshone, produced 250 pounds of milk and 93 pounds of butterfat. 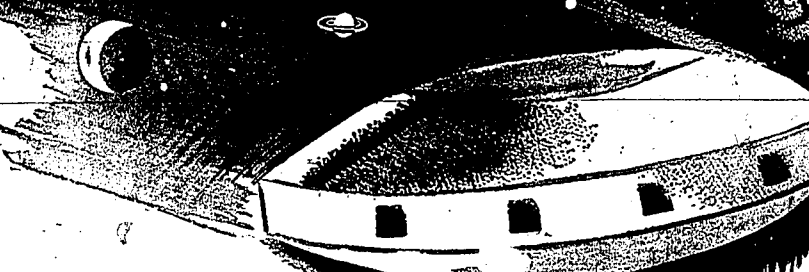
