Workout Seen for State's Recount Law as Democrat Governor Race Undecided

BOISE, Aug. 14 (AP)—Idaho's second straight extra-innings primary election could provide a workout for the state's new recount law. Statehouse observers speculated Thursday that the loser in the tight race for the Democratic nomination for governor might seek a recount of votes. With unofficial returns in from all but seven of the state's 898 precincts, State Sen. A. M. Derr had a lead of 169 votes over State Sen. H. M. Hanson, the Republican, with 25,696; Derr, and advocate of legalized gambling, and 25,437 for Hanson.

Derr's Hanson on Derr said anything about a recount. "If Max wins by five votes I'm for him," said Derr. "If for him it's five votes I'm for him." Hanson, declining to concede, said he supports any Democratic candidate who wins.

Both candidates said they felt it was too early to predict the outcome of the race. Derr said he would wait until the official canvass before making any claims.

Hanson left with his family yesterday for a three-day vacation at Yellowstone national park. Derr said he would wait the final outcome at home.

Opinions Varied on Legalized Gambling

BOISE, Aug. 14 (AP)—If the legalized gambling platform becomes State Sen. A. M. Derr's springboard to the Idaho governorship, opinions vary. It could happen next year. 50 Americans Are Listed Passengers; Survival Hope Dim

SHANNON, Ireland, Aug. 14 (AP)—A giant Dutch KLM airliner with 99 people aboard plunged into the stormy Atlantic 130 miles off the west coast of Ireland today. A communique issued by the airlines said there was little hope of survivors but a French trawler reported sighting survivors on liferafts. Three British air force planes circling the crash scene reported signs of life among the wreckage. These reports were still not completely clear. A list given out by the airline listed about 50 American passengers were among the passengers.

Home addresses were not available in many cases but most were listed were from the East and Midwest.

Planes and ships, including the 24,183-ton Cunard liner Caronia, sped to the scene in the hope that there may be survivors.

The four-engine Super Constellation vanished at dawn, 55 minutes after leaving Shannon airport, New York. It had left Amsterdam last night.

The Super Constellation was in radio contact with the shore at 2:40 a. m. that was the last heard of her.

The crash happened up as possibly the worst single airplane disaster in the history of commercial aviation.

There were 50 passengers—5 of them children, including 2 babies—aboard the plane when it crashed.

Some concern is felt here over the possibility of a Middle East armistice at a time when Egypt and Syria are loaded with Russian weapons and Iraq has a simple arsenal of arms supplied by the Baghdad pact. Israeli observers said such an embargo would leave Israel's disadvantage.

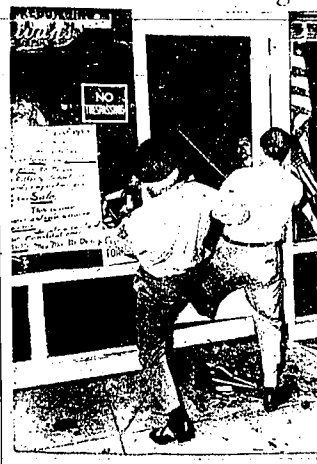

Child Expert Stresses Love In Area Talk

BURLY, Aug. 14—Dr. Charles A. Tompkins, Omaha, Neb., a medical doctor who specializes in pediatrics and family counseling, Tuesday told members of Burley Rotary club and their wives that love fits its simple, parent and yet, strongest expression in the child through its first few years of life.

Speaking on the subject, "Human Creativity, Our Greatest Natural Resource," the noted mid-west authority on children's diseases, lecturer and author, stated that the adding of 20 years to man's life expectancy has created many problems, child abuse which are mental disturbances.

The speaker deplored the practice of confining great numbers of persons in "mad houses" more for the keeping than for their care. All these institutions, he maintained, could be closed "if all individuals could maintain the love of a newborn babe through life."

In answering his own question, "How have we missed the boat?" Dr. Tompkins said, in part, that mental disturbances, later, hostility and feelings of inferiority are implanted in the minds of children in the cradle stage where parents who do not respect the nature of their child demands in the human life.

Dr. Tompkins was brought to the state by the Idaho conference of the Methodist church to serve as a resource leader for the conference's two family camps. The first of these was held last week-end at Shovelot camp. The second will be held this week-end at Walla Walla lake, Ore.

Plowing Them Under Doesn't Reduce Surplus

Foundation's Project, Aims

A meeting of the officers and county committee members of the Twin Falls county chapter National Foundation was held at the Rogerson hotel Monday evening, Aug. 11.

Tom Daniels, state representative for the foundation, explained the program to be undertaken by the foundation, which will include research, treatment and patient care of arthritis and congenital birth defects, in addition to work already undertaken in connection with infantile paralysis.

Daniels explained that, while polio is no longer a matter of national concern, a great deal remains to be done in the program for prevention of the disease and patient care.

"Outbreaks continue to occur when there is a shift toward the significant increase of polio cases in Missouri, which had 23 cases as of July 19, compared to four for the same period last year."

Daniels also reported that a total of 49 million Americans under the age of 40, to date have had no vaccine.

Mrs. Mary Ann Knight of the southeastern district health department, reported that the vaccine program is moving along successfully in Twin Falls county. Approximately 100 Salk shots a week are being administered at the southeastern health department and a like number at the Twin Falls county health department.

Mrs. Frankie Alworth, president of the local chapter, said the chapter will continue to assist in providing curative polio vaccine for the two clinics.

Mrs. Alworth said the shots are being given during the regular office hours each day at the southeastern health department and on each Wednesday from 1 to 5 p.m. at the Twin Falls county health department.

Mrs. Alworth noted that polio shots are available for both adults and children. The cost to adults is \$1 per shot. Children under 21 and pregnant women are being vaccinated free. The Twin Falls Grange and the Women of the Moose are furnishing clerical help at the county health departments.

Most of the finances for purchasing the Salk shots are obtained from grants made for adults. The amount received over and above the cost of the vaccine is used to purchase polio vaccines for both clinics.
