## Recession Policy Is Reversed

WASHINGTON, Aug. 15 (AP)—The federal reserve board, following a reversal of its policy on the threat of inflation, has reversed its recession policy and moved toward tightening the money supply. The change came with the announcement that the board would raise the discount rate from 4 to 4 1/2 percent to help curb inflation.

The board also announced that it would raise the reserve requirements for member banks to 10 percent. A boost in the normal rate goes hand in hand with a general increase in the discount rate.

# Farm Agency Official Sees Happiness For Wheat Growers - Until Big Boom

WASHINGTON, Aug. 15 (Special)—"Wheat farmers are happy now unless they continue that way for another year or so when, boom, the whole thing blows up in their faces," said a top USDA official, who puts wheat at the top of a long list of products being produced this year in increasing quantities. This includes corn, oats, barley, flaxseed and dry beans.

As this official sees it, the price of buying and storing surplus wheat will reach a point at which the consumer, who still pays quite a bit for his bread, will feel. Price-propping outlays for wheat alone are expected to jump from 500 million dollars in the past year to well over the billion-dollar mark in the coming 12-month period.

This official foresees only one way out of the forthcoming (according to him) wheat debacle: Sharp reduction in planting and a lowering of the price support level, which is now pegged at 75 per cent of parity, guaranteeing to a farmer about 42¢ per bushel.

Corn production this year is forecast by USDA at 3,587 million bushels, up two per cent over last year and well above the 1927-28 (1927-28 average of 3,144 million bushels).

But it's the wheat crop—and the complex from the country about inadequate storage facilities—that worries USDA officials most. Wheat's estimated output is 1,241 million bushels, highest in history, up a third over last year and well above

### Efforts of "Humane" Groups Result in New Slaughter Act

WASHINGTON, Aug. 15 (Special)—The care and handling of livestock during the slaughter stage has long been the subject of protest by various "humane" groups. Their efforts appear to have culminated this year in the prospective passage of a "humane slaughter" bill by congress.

Representatives of the meat packing industry have publicly recognized the need for a new law, and are endeavoring to "bring" with the new slaughtering techniques. Privately, however, they charge that the anti-humane movement got the bill through congress and that soon it will start on matters of direct concern to farmers — castration, branding, dehorning. Further, that the use of animals in rodeos will be prohibited.

Here's the outlook for application of the new law:

1—USDA has until next summer to come up with specific techniques to be used in killing livestock. It will conduct extensive experiments in several stockyard areas, including Chicago.

2—A bill for final approval of

### already is used on about half of the cattle slaughtered.

At any rate, the day of the slaughter house is gone. The knife, of course, will continue to be used but only after animals are rendered insensible. The sole exception will be for animals slaughtered under traditional Jewish kosher rites, which are exempt from terms of the law. In the process, animals are killed by severing the carotid artery in the neck with a sharp knife under prescribed conditions.

The meat industry issues this overall warning to farmers: until a "cheap" method is evolved for slaughtering animals under the new law, some of the cost must inevitably be borne by producer.

### Bolt Kills One

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 15 (UPI)—A touch of squally weather with thunderstorms and gusty winds lashed southern California yesterday and one U. S. forest service worker was killed when struck by lightning.

The forest service said Don West, 27, was on a routine fire patrol near the San Geronimo mountains when the lightning bolt struck a rock and ricocheted 25 feet to strike him.

### New Building Ups State Cash Value by '82 Million Dollars

BOISE, Aug. 15 (UP)—The Idaho tax commission tentatively estimated yesterday that new construction and growth have added cash value of more than \$82 million dollars in Idaho property during the past year.

In a report to Gov. Robert E. Smylie, the commission said its figures were based on a review of real and personal tax rolls from counties as well as tentative assessed valuations on railroads and utilities.

Smylie commented the report allowed "further evidence of the sound and steady growth of the state."

The commission said the greatest increases were due to construction of new buildings.

The jump was achieved despite the lowest net profit of mines in 1928 of any one year during the past decade, the commission said.

The review of real and personal tax rolls showed increases in 32 counties as decreases in valuations in 12 counties. Lemhi county showed the heaviest loss of more than 20 per cent in its valuations, and Blaine county, another heavy mining area, showed a decrease of slightly more than seven per cent. Kootenai county gained by 157 per cent and Butte with 1383 per cent.

Leading counties with increased valuations were Filer with 1844 per cent and Blaine with 1383 per cent.

The commission has been meeting here this week as a state board of equalization to hear requests for adjustments in 1928 tentative assessed values from railroads and public utilities. Estimated valuations is the figure, generally a fraction of full cash value, on which taxes are levied for a property.

The report submitted by Harold Johnson, executive commission secretary, said the commission set tentative 1928 valuations on railroads and utilities at \$172,000,000. This was an increase of \$10,735,124 or 6.5 per cent, over valuations for the same category in 1927.

Reductions from 1.1 per cent to five per cent were granted as a measure of relief to the major railroads, Johnson said, resulting in a

### Total decrease of \$692,000 in these figures.

The commission said its estimate of \$82,000,000 in the cash value added to Idaho property was reached by projecting the figures on increased valuation, in terms of cash value.



You don't need it and you have cause to fear it, so a beg of you to have courage to fear it when others doubt you are using it and asking you to do so.

Lately and not unusually we have had some terrible accidents on the roads. The drivers and their parties stopped to get gas and drinks. The driver thought he was quite in control of himself but at the end was disaster and death. There, right off, is one reason for fearing the stuff.

There is another: Some of you are allergic to alcohol and for you it is suicidal. Leave it alone, don't use it, and have the courage to say so.

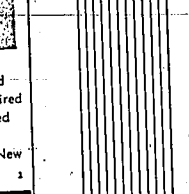

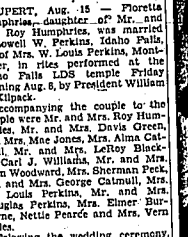

# U. S. Is Given 50-50 Chance On Moon Try

WASHINGTON, Aug. 15 (UPI)—A top air force general said today the United States has a "50-50" chance of blinding an instrument-carrying robot in the vicinity of the moon in the first lunar probe launching expected next week.

Lt. Gen. Samuel E. Anderson, commander of the air research and development command, gave his first evaluation of the lunar rocket mounted at Cape Canaveral, Fla., Roy W. Johnson, research project manager, advanced research project agency, previously had estimated the chance of success was "no better than a ten to one."

Anderson, who is the air force's overall boss for both Cape Canaveral and the ballistic missile command at Fort Belvoir, Calif., discounted the fact that the 100-foot lunar rocket's third stage has never been fired.

He said in an interview the third stage has "exceeded innumerable past records" and is "a good rocket."
