Report Shows U.S. Working Force Change

WASHINGTON, Sept. 1 (UPI)—The government says the nation's working force now includes 802,642 more men and deck hands and 2,205 male instructors.

Based on this, according to the census bureau, the country counts 2,737 women funeral directors and 4,482 male air conditioning mechanics.

These off-duty data are analyzed in "Occupational Trends in the United States, 1950-1960," which is being published by the Bureau of Economic Analysis.

The commerce department, in making public the study, says it is the first time the "striking changes" in the working force's growth from 20,000,000 in 1900 to 50,000,000 in 1950.

But in 1950 there were four million unskilled workers compared to 8 1/2 million skilled and 12 million semi-skilled workers, the report said.

Farm Workers Decrease The total of manual and service workers more than doubled in the 50-year period and the number of white-collar workers quadrupled.

But farm workers decreased by one-third to a total of seven million. As an illustration of changing times, systems and economy, the report noted that the non-farm working force made up 88 per cent of the total in 1950 and 92 per cent in 1950.

Statistics on the 1950 working force showed that 39 per cent of men were unmarried, 25 per cent of the men being single and 48 per cent of the women.

By HENRY McLEMORE Hank Lemmons—gave—them—advice—into the sea is no more of a mystery than why, on an average of two of three a month, I get letters from readers asking my advice on gardening problems.

My thumbs are about as green as blueberry pie, and I have trouble distinguishing, as I see it, between a Grace Coolidge rose from a Westling-Cole carnation.

The only growing thing that has ever survived my touch for more than a day or two is a cactus plant and only then because I got up twice a night to water it.

Once determined to have a garden of some sort, I hid out a rock garden. A pure cactus-growing rock garden. But even here I failed. I used a soft rock, and before summer had come and gone, determined woodpeckers had laid it waste.

Since then, what flowers to be found in our house are sent in by wire, or shipped from neighbors' gardens under the cover of darkness.

As I don't like to admit and short-comings, especially a horticultural one, I have been answering the letters, never hitting on that the advice given comes from a man

whose presence paper flowers droop. To make matters worse, I am sure that the misguided readers send me only their "mistakes" problems. Take this one, for example, from Mrs. Pat Risby, Bamling, Calif.

"Dear Mr. McLemore: I have been told that a certain kind of my call be made to jump through a hoop. We have quite a few abandoned hoop in our backyard and would jump through them if at all possible. Could you help me? Sincerely, etc."

What should I tell Mrs. Risby? To jump through a hoop, herself, because she is obviously sincere, and the hoop I can do to her, I can't very well tell her that, and by that jump through hoop, because I don't know. The chances are there is, I think, and there is always the possibility that a real smart variety has learned to

jump as well as climb. To my answer to Mrs. Risby I told her, yet, there was a certain species of fly that jumped, but that it was unobtainable in this country right now, as it came from Red China. Thus, I figured, should hold Mrs. Risby until she forgets about the scheme, or the hoops fall apart and were no longer suitable for jumping through.

Another typical query is this one from Tom Tubberly, Rio Springs, Ark.

"Dear Sir: Could you recommend a good ground cover for an old tennis court? The cover has fallen into decay since I broke my ankle chasing a 'lob' shot several years ago, thinking you for your kindness."

The first thing I had to do about this one was find out what "ground cover" was. As none of it sounded very attractive to me, I suggested

about tarpaulin. Tarpaulins are hard and stand heat as well as cold. Much more sensible, in my way of thinking, than sweet peas, lilacs of the valley, or any of the usual ground covers. Many of the letters I answer simply by using the two words "cut back." I am not sure what that means, but when I was trying to grow flowers almost everywhere, I looked at my garden said, "You should cut them back," and walked away.






