

Nationalists Report 11 Chinese Ships Are Sunk In Battling at Quemoy

WASHINGTON, Sept. 2 (AP)—The Chinese Nationalists claimed their warships early today sank 11 Communist torpedo boats and probably 12th trying to break up a convoy to embattle Quemoy island. It was the biggest naval action reported in the 11 days since the communists stepped up their attack on the Nationalist-held offshore islands. Earlier, the Nationalists announced their artillery on Quemoy in firing throughout Sunday night.

"Ella" Threat Lessens; Gale Flag Is Down

MIAMI, Fla., Sept. 2 (AP)—Hurricane Ella weakened to a 60-mph-an-hour storm today as it moved west-northwest along the southern coast of Cuba.

Gale warnings were issued today for Florida and the Gulf of Mexico. The storm is expected to reach the east coast, southward through the Florida Keys, and then to move inland and west. Cuba has the storm's eye. It is expected to reach the Florida coast in 24 to 36 hours.

Ships at the Key West naval base were alerted by possible movement out to sea. If the hurricane should strike, the base is prepared to evacuate. The base commander, Capt. J. M. Duggan, said reports from Cuba and reconnaissance planes indicated the storm was well broken up. A gale warning was issued for the area near the mountainous area near Santiago.

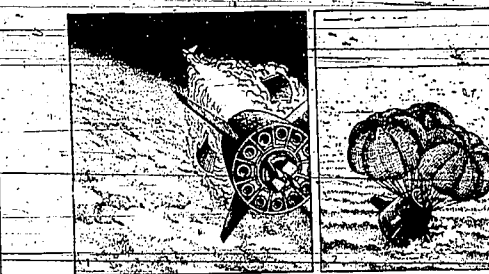

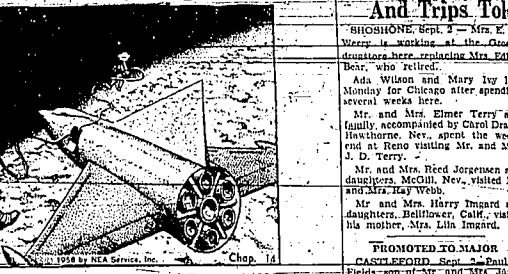

### Radar Merger Plans to Save Many Dollars

WASHINGTON, Sept. 2 (AP)—A large-scale merger of civilian and military long-range radar equipment is being planned, it was announced by the government today.

Joint use of the electronic eyes and air traffic control and air defense systems is expected to save many millions of dollars and allow an accelerated performance of both types of operations.

More Set Due Later

Civil aeronautics Administrator Grant T. Elye and Lieut. Gen. J. H. Atkinson, chief of the air defense command, announced the merger scheduled to go into effect some time this fall.

Initial plans call for "bill" use of 31 high-power radar equipment with aircraft spotting capability reported at 150 to 200 million. More radar sets scheduled for the joint service later.

The cost intends to employ the radar for its air traffic control tasks. The air force, army and national guard will use it for air defense.

The heavy radar equipment stretches across the country from Seattle to Miami.

Interference Cut Down

Besides allowing lower equipment and operating costs, the joint use is based on radar interference and coordination problems.

The OAA estimated that of the 100 radar sets planned for the air traffic control system more than half will be for joint use by the military.

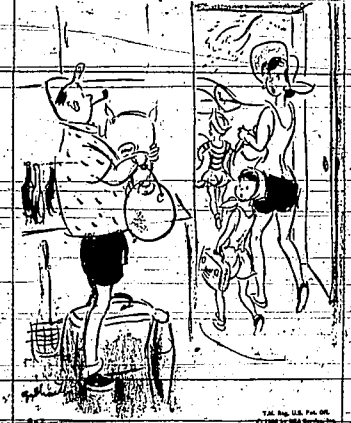
