## Red China Warned U. S. Will Protect Formosan Islands

NEWPORT, R. I., Sept. 4 (AP)—President Eisenhower today solemnly warned Red China he will not hesitate to commit American armed forces to defend the Nationalist Formosan Islands if it finds that necessary to the security of Formosa. The President's statement was made by Secretary of State Dulles in a statement authorized by Eisenhower after they had conferred at the summer White House for an hour and 45 minutes.

Dulles said Eisenhower will not hesitate to conclude that Formosa is the main Chinese Nationalist stronghold. He threatened an attack on Quemoy, Matsu and other offshore islands. Dulles stressed that Eisenhower did not yet make any such finding of authority, conferred on him by congressional action. He said presidential determination, if made, would be followed. Wayne Hest, 21, June Bremer, 17, and Del Ross Tucker, 21, all from Idaho Falls, were killed in the crash.

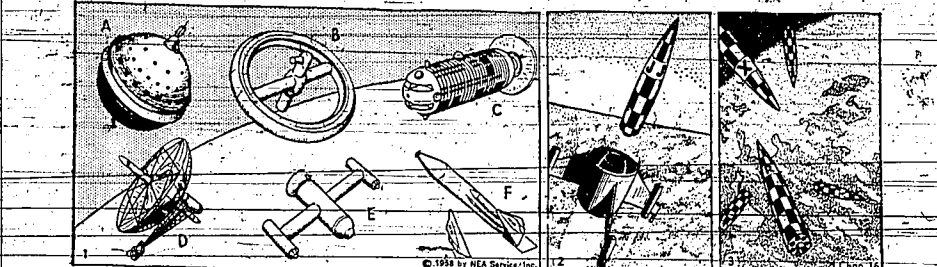
Leon P. Johnson, 20, Pocatello, was killed in a single car crash. The car smashed into a dirt embankment on highway 20 east of Pocatello.

### Japanese Probes Of Law to Start

TOKYO, Sept. 4 (UPI)—Three officials of the government's constitution deliberation council will leave for the United States soon to conduct a probe into the circumstances under which Japan's "no war" constitution was drafted, it was disclosed today.

Prices are relatively stable, although in some areas there are signs of a change. A recent government survey showed that the average American family spends 41 percent of its money on beef, 39 percent on pork, 10 percent on veal, 10 percent on chicken and 10 percent on lamb.

The survey showed most consumption-highest in the north central and water-poor, lowest in the south. In the north central, family spent 25 percent of its food money on meat.

Butter prices are marked up to three cents a pound in many areas. Prices for eggs are also higher. Peaches and watermelons still rank as the best buys in many areas.

More red apples are coming to market, just in time for school lunches. Turkey, chicken and lamb are among varieties starting now.

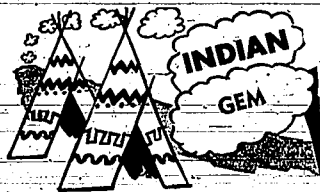
