Rubber Chain Uses Urged to Improve Spud

Potato quality can get a bounce out of rubber, mimes Twin Falls County Agent C. W. Daigh. "Better spuds come from the field if there is rubber on the chains of the digger, bulker, combine and piler," he notes.

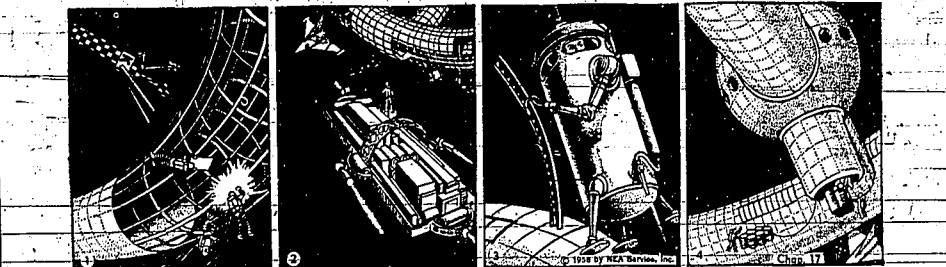
Daigh points out that Richard Ohma, University of Idaho extension service potato specialist, estimates that 15 per cent of the hard bruises on potatoes are caused by diggers. Rubber on the digger chain reduces the bruises to five per cent.

Reduction of hard knocks pays the producer because severe bruises account for about 45 per cent of storage rot.

Two types of chain rubber are used. One is saved when the links wear out and the other is discarded with the battered chain. If the tubing is to be reused, it should be one thirty-second of an inch larger than the chain. Use a soap solution as lubricant and coat the rubber to the link with rubber cement to prevent slippage, Daigh advises.

If the tubing is not to be used again, it should be the same size as the chain. It is worked onto the link with a screw driver. In either case tough tubing with one-eighth inch sidewalls is recommended.

Many Firms Keep up Work On Research During Season

NEW YORK, Sept. 5 (AP)—The resumption of business will find many companies in a position to cash in on one phase of their far-reaching research.

As a study of the budgets of 833 companies, the American Management Association reports today that 510 have increased their allocations for research, 275 have maintained last year's pace, and 198 have cut their spending.

In 1957 the 833 spent an average of 2.8 per cent of their sales take on research and development.

Breaking the returns down by industries, AMA reports the biggest increase this year was by 14 makers of transportation equipment other than autos and aircraft. Their budgets are up by an average of 26 per cent. The aircraft industry averaged a 28 per cent increase, while auto spending was down by 10 per cent.

Marked increases in budgeting for research were reported by service machinery, up 12.9 per cent; chemicals, up 10 per cent; food and beverages, 8.3 per cent; and stone, clay and glass, up 7.1 per cent.

As a group the nine construction machinery companies showed the biggest drop, down 15 per cent, with engines and turbines next, off 9 per cent. Other decreases include autos, miscellaneous machinery, rubber and miscellaneous manufacturing.
