### Special Aged Health Units Said Danger

NEW YORK, Sept. 8 (UPI)—A professor of medicine urges all-out public pressure for a special "community" of old-age medicine. This pressure, he says, is not a dangerous trend, "said Dr. Franklin B. Child, Western State University, Cleveland, O., at a semi-annual meeting of the Interstate Postgraduate Medical Association here today.

"If unchecked, it will lead to 'the separation of medical care of the elderly patient into a separate compartment of medicine, and, in turn, specialization."

"I believe that of all the many aspects of health care which should be managed by the family's general physician, more is more vitally necessary than the care of the older person."

Child touched on a sore point in the medical profession and the general public. It is a simple fact that the proportion of elderly people in the total population is increasing steadily.

This has led to a mushrooming of problems and many of the elderly are not getting the medical specialty of old-age medicine—geriatrics—is struggling to establish itself firmly.

Roma Urge Specialty.

Needless to say, other respected medical authority believes there is place for such a specialty. Child took issue by denying that the "old-age geriatrics" line as much reason for being as the pediatrician.

"In the case of geriatrics and a few diseases which are peculiar to children and which may require special knowledge and training," he said, "On the other hand, there are many diseases or illnesses which are peculiar to old people."

"The word geriatrics is necessary in our language, but we do not let us be led into the notion that the elderly person should in any way be separated from the great common body of knowledge of general medicine of which it is so important a part."

### 400,000 Negroes Are in School at Integrated Spots

NASHVILLE, Tenn., Sept. 8 (UPI)—Southern school officials reported today that about 400,000 Negroes were in "integrated situations" when schools opened in the Southern States and under states this fall.

The news, published monthly by the Southern Education Report, a service here, said an early September survey showed about 12 million youngsters going back to school with the desegregation picture little changed from last year.

Of the 19 of the 102 districts there are plans for extending or expanding existing desegregation programs.

The number of Negro pupils in "integrated situations" went from 375,000 last year to about 400,000 when school opened this fall, the publication said. An "integrated situation" is described one where a Negro is enrolled in school districts which have begun or completed the desegregation process.

Of the desegregiated districts, the news said, all but 15 are in border States and not one is in the deep South.

### False Births Told

BERLIN, Sept. 8 (UPI)—East German insurance salesman Hans Danau was sentenced to eight and a half years imprisonment for falsifying 42 "births" and 41 deaths, it was reported today.

The East Berlin newspaper Neuland Zeitung said Danau registered the "births" to collect Soviet zone allowances for twins and other children over the limit born in a family, and the deaths to collect life insurance.

The paper said he stole and forged certificates for presentation to registry offices.

Mary Ann Mobley Brandon, Miss, was setting up in a New York City hotel after a hectic week of competition in the oldest national beauty pageant in America.

The week ended in triumph for the 21-year-old college senior Saturday night when she was crowned the new Miss America before a packed Convention hall crowd of 17,000 and a nationwide television audience.

The 5-foot-5 Southern belle, who has brown eyes and an olive complexion, burst into tears after she was crowned by the outgoing queen, Marilyn Van Derbur, Denver, Colo.

"It might sound trite, but I had no idea of winning—no idea at all," she later told newsmen. "I'm very inadequate. It's something I can't even comprehend."

Winning the title had an special significance for Miss Ann's. She lost out last year in Mississippi's entrance in the pageant.

The new Miss America, who weighs 114 pounds and measures 37-24-32, began her reign by attending the coronation ball early morning "Tee socials" were held at the Pines Point club and Charles P. Olatof.

Two rather interested people never peek to the ball: Mrs. Ann's mother and her attorney-stepfather, Mr. and Mrs. David Williams, were tied up answering long-distance telephone calls from well-wishers.

Mary Ann is studying speech and English at the University of Mississippi and hopes to become an actress. She plans to use the \$100,000 prize money to help her family.

In addition, the new Miss America will receive a \$10,000 scholarship.

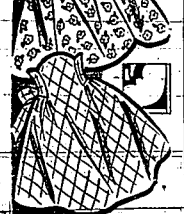

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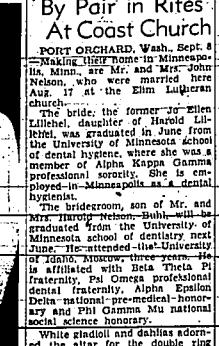

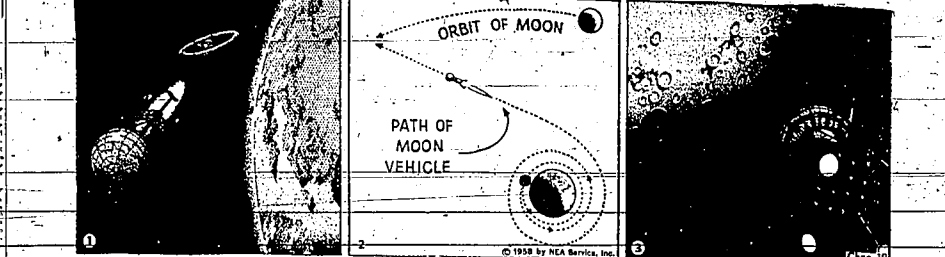

The crop reporting board estimated cotton yields this year will average a new record high of 48 pounds per acre, compared with last year's 38 pounds and a 10-year average of 41 pounds.

### Pope Tells China He Picks Bishops

VATICAN CITY, Sept. 8 (UPI)—Pope Pius XII has told Chinese Catholics that selection of bishops in Red China without his approval was an act of "rebellion" against the church.

He warned in the words of the gospel that "he who enters not by the door into the sheepfold, but climbs up another way, is a thief and a robber."

The pope's warning came in an encyclical letter to the bishops of China and Catholics of China—dated June 29 and made public today.

The pontiff formally reiterated his sole right to appoint bishops, and said the recent elections of some bishops by assemblies of Catholics in China were in contrast with the laws of the church.

### Demos Ready With Answer for Charge of Spending too Much

WASHINGTON, Sept. 8 (UPI)—Democrats are ready with their answer to Republican charges that a re-opening "democratic" conference has added the government with a record peacetime deficit.

"They will say," blame the recession—don't support their answer, with testimony from one of the chief spokesmen for the Eisenhower administration.

The Democratic argument is that the business slump is bringing a recession—recession—recession—and that the fall-off in revenue is causing most of the estimated \$2 billion dollar deficit.

When President Eisenhower presented his budget last January, it was approximately in balance. At \$10 billion dollars for this fiscal year, the treasury now estimates spending up about five billion from that figure—and that is a big figure in the 1958 deficit, with a resulting \$2 billion deficit.

With plenty of help from the President, the GOP has made it clear that the spending record of the Democratic-controlled congress will be a big issue in the 1958 campaign. Their argument is that the Democrats can't be trusted with the taxpayers' money.

The Democrats believe there is still political mileage to be gained in the recession fight, since it came under a Republican administration. "Now they will enjoy pointing to it as a major cause for the treasury's troubles."

They can quote testimony from Secretary of the Treasury Robert C. Anderson before the senate finance committee last month. He was being questioned by Sen. Paul H. Douglas, D. Ill.

Anderson over-the-top ground about the changes in budget estimates, since last January and referred to the combined two-year deficit of about 15 billion dollars for the past and current fiscal year. Then he put this question: "What is the cause of this deficit?"

"Ten billion dollars of the deficit will be created by the decline in business activity in two-thirds of the total. Only five billion dollars or one-third of the total will be caused by an increase in expenditures above those budgeted and, therefore, it has been the recession which has caused the deficit," Anderson said. "Is that not true?"

"That is correct, yes," Anderson replied.

### Grandma-Painter Has Anniversary

EAGLE BRIDGE, N. Y., Sept. 8 (UPI)—Grandma-Painter Grandma Moses, 82, died today in a nursing home and suffering from arthritis.

She spent her 82nd birthday anniversary yesterday carefully guarded from the public.

Grandma was taken to an underground spot for the day. Love her, a son, said it was done to protect her from excitement and from the curious who might try to visit her.

Mrs. Anna Mary Robertson Moses—Grandma's real name—gained world renown in her late years with paintings of scenes in this rural area close to the Vermont state line where she has lived all her life.

### Princeton School To Raise Tuition

PRINCETON, N. J., Sept. 8 (UPI)—Tuition fees will be raised \$250 at Princeton university in the 1959-60 school year, it was announced yesterday.

Undergraduate rates will be \$1,450 and graduate rates will be \$1,000.

The higher tuition will enable faculty members to receive annual increases. President Robert F. Goheen said. In addition, he said, students will be eligible for increased loans.

WARSAW, Poland, Sept. 8 (UPI)—Returning to his native Poland for the first time in 19 years, opera singer Jan Kiepura crossed two iron curtains frontiers yesterday without a passport.

At the East Berlin airport the singer reported that his passport had been stolen. The authorities told him he could not continue his trip.

"But I am Jan Kiepura," said the singer.

"It is only you who tells us this, please prove it to us," the official replied.

"I can sing to you," said Kiepura, and did.

The official let him pass.
