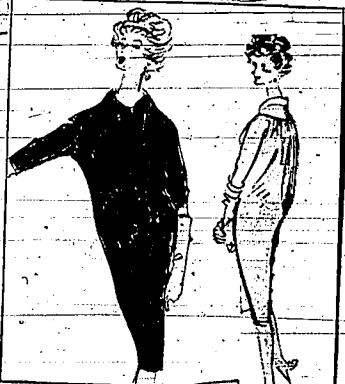
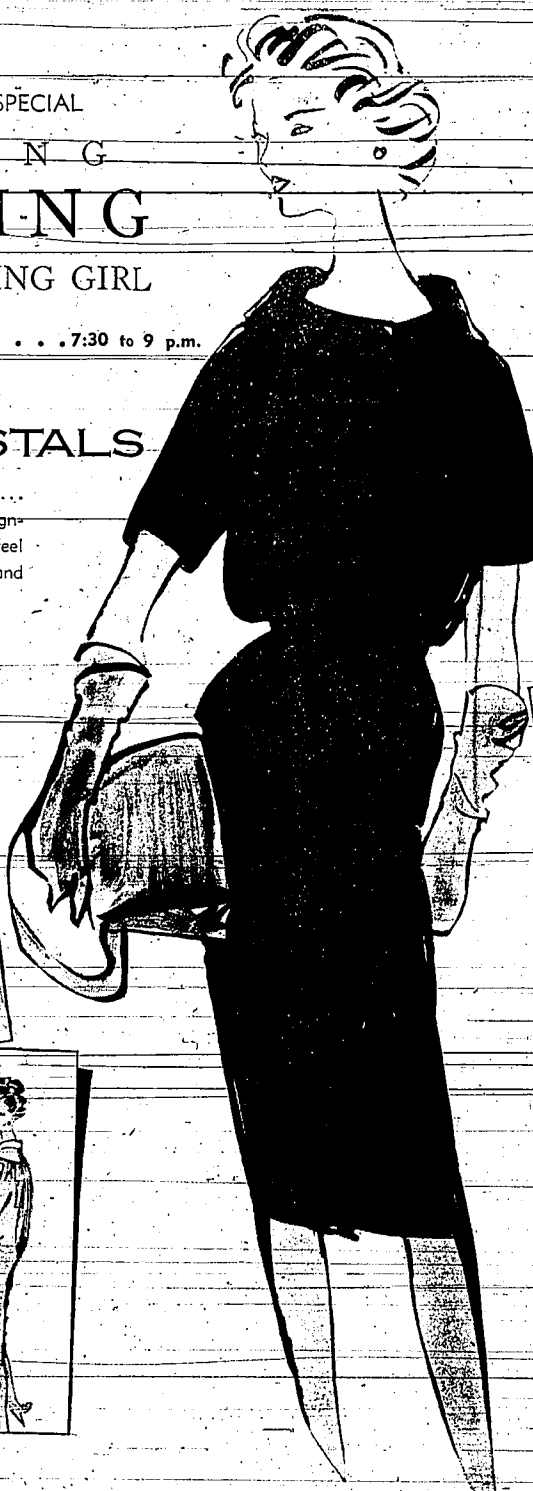

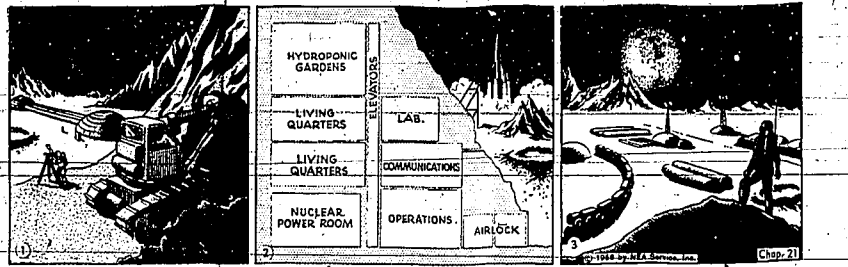

(3) The absence of atmosphere and the danger from cosmic rays and falling meteorites, plus the absence of a magnetic field, make the lunar colony a most difficult proposition. While excavations are under way above, ten-ply domes shelter the workers.

Inventory to Check Use of Brainpower

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 10 (UPI)—An inventory of U. S. brainpower will be launched here today to determine whether our knowledge is being checked in the best national interests. The study will attempt to gauge the nation's personnel requirements for the needs in the cultural, scientific, technical, economic, political, military, and other fields.

Once the brain-inventory is completed the project will seek means—within the framework of existing legislation—to areas where it is needed most, and to areas where it is needed least.

Directing the study of men and minds is the American Academy of Political and Social Science, headed by Dr. James G. Charlesworth, professor of political science at the University of Pennsylvania.

The plan is to bring together about 20 of the top people in the country in the fields of education, scientific and professional fields to discuss a national personnel policy, explains Dr. Charlesworth.

\$10,000 Grant on Hand

"Once a qualitative brain-inventory study has been made, we will then seek a means of balancing the available supply of men and minds with the needs that have been defined by the conference.

"To undertake the project, called 'Finding Freedom,' the academy has a \$10,000 grant from U. S. Sen. Joseph E. Clark, D. Pa., which covers it as part of the Philadelphia award he won in 1956 for advancing the interests of the country.

Charlesworth said the men invited to make the study will be "those who know American society as a whole," without any set prejudices regarding the impact of their own speciality on the economy.

November Start Planned

The study is unique, he says, because it will be the first undertaken at a national level to suggest ways of correcting imbalances in select manpower.

He said various agencies would be called upon to publish those fields which the study shows to be weak, and that government, industry and private foundations would be urged to cooperate in programs to make those vocations more attractive to young people.

The project is expected to start in November, with final reports scheduled for next June.

New Find May Help Frogmen Against Bends

CHICAGO, Conn., Sept. 10 (AP)—New research findings promise to allow navy frogmen to swim deeper and longer without danger of bends, a navy doctor reported today.

Capt. J. Duffner, senior medical officer of the navy's experimental diving unit in Washington, D. C., said the "most recent" results from experiments in which swimming divers breathe a mixture of the usual compressed air, which contains nitrogen and oxygen.

Frogmen to Get Mixture
He told the first International Symposium Submarine and Space Medicine last it is now proposed to furnish all frogmen with such a mixture. It would be carried, as compressed air now is, in a so-called "scuba" apparatus.

Scuba means "self contained underwater breathing apparatus."

The symposium is being sponsored by the American Institute of Biological Sciences with the support of the defense department.

Bubbles Cause Trouble
The condition known as the bends is technically called decompression sickness.

When a diver is deep in the water, the increased pressure from the water causes any inert gas in his breathing mixture—to be compressed into his tissues. When he ascends the gas in his tissues is under lower and lower pressure.

If he comes up too fast, the compressed gas will be released in the form of bubbles. They can get into his tissues, his joints and even his brain and lungs.

Army to Ask for 11,000 More Men

WASHINGTON, Sept. 10 (AP)—The Army will ask for 11,000 draftees during November.

This is the same monthly draft quota as for September and October. As usual, the navy, marine corps and air force made no requests to selective service.

The November call will bring the total to 2,387,272. The highest for this year was February through May, with calls of 13,000 each month.

The CAA will put the device into operation at Weir-Cook municipal airport here this month on its first full-time assignment in the nation.

The brain, developed by International Business Machines corporation, can keep track of planes, figure out when each is due at its destination, decide whether too many planes are due in at once and inform the staff so that necessary orders can be issued to the pilots.

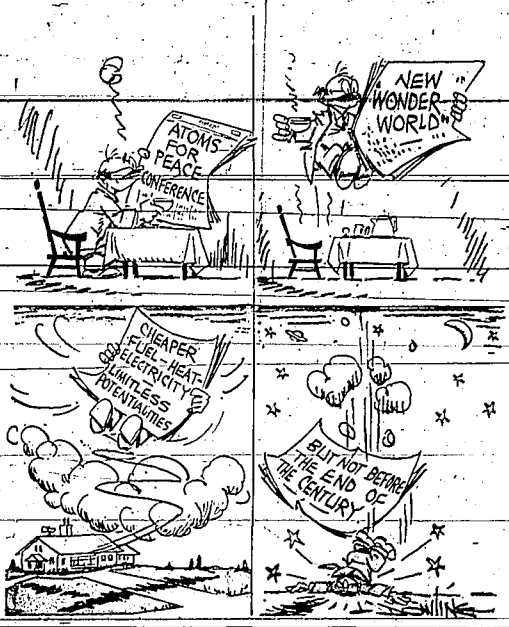

After 140 Years, Causes for 'Tobacco Amblyopia' Found

NEW YORK, Sept. 10 (UPI)—After about 140 years of trying, science seems to be solving the strange riddle in the disease called tobacco amblyopia.

"When you have that disease your vision gets dim and dimmer. Yet no cause for it can be found in the eyes. And if you have it, you're a smoker. Non-smokers don't have it. But only a relatively few smokers get it, and they may be light smokers who haven't been smoking long. On the other hand, vast numbers of the heaviest smokers never show a trace of tobacco amblyopia."

That's been the big riddle and scores of medical scientists have been trying to solve something of it since 1817 when the first case of it was described and studied scientifically.

In this century, another riddle had been solved by that same woman-looker to smoking in vast numbers, yet women rarely show up with "tobacco amblyopia." Why shouldn't they be as often affected as men?

Now, in 1958, science has what appears to be the answer. Tobacco deficiency is not the cause of the disease, but it can be the trigger. The cause is a deficiency of vitamin B-12 in body chemistry. That leads to the end result, of deficiency is B-12 in body chemistry.

These answers were obtained by three scientists of the University of Bristol, England, from 14 men who were proved by test to have tobacco amblyopia. "This is an important point because dimming of vision can be brought about by many other conditions."

"Minutely detailed studies demonstrated that all 14 had too little vitamin B-12 in their body chemistry to meet bodily needs for it. Vitamin B-12 is—labeled—vitamin B-12. It is a relatively new vitamin in point of discovery. It is essential for the proper function of nerves and for the maturing of certain blood cells. Deficiency is due to bodily inability to absorb and utilize it. And the end result, of deficiency is B-12 in body chemistry.
