"When we were young," said Ruth Hazy, "money and security were the big problems—money meant security."

"The younger generation now is also interested in security. But to it a real world peace—something that stands for security."

"We had to learn to be imaginative. The young people of today were born in a world without boundaries—and they know it."

"They are often more interested in international than national problems. Hope for peace which seem possible to them."

Miss Hazy, a dark-haired, handsome, grandmotherly, financial chairman of the National Student Association and producer-moderator of the ABC-TV Sunday network show, College News Conference.

"The White House has become a kid's. Two more are in the vice president's office. The state department has six. Fourteen are working as administrative or legislative assistants to senators."

"Her knowledge, not one of the 1,000-plus student leaders has become an adult delinquent. None has been arrested for forging a check, holding up a bank, or driving a mayor."

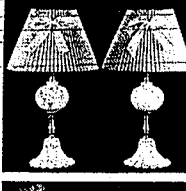

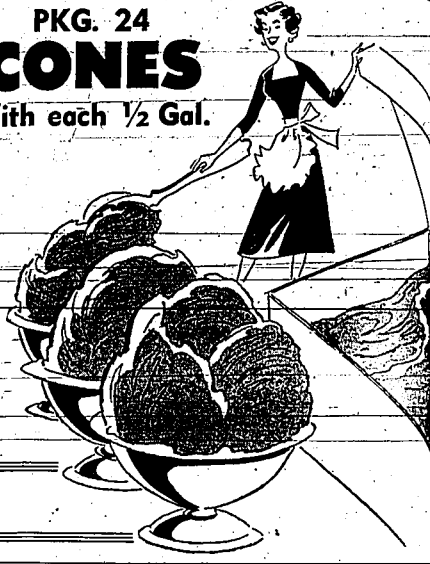
