A native of Iowa, Mrs. Peterson attended the Iowa State Teachers college and taught in Iowa schools from 1927 to 1931.

She was graduated from Northwest Christian college, Eugene, Ore., and was ordained in June, 1933.

Mrs. Peterson will return to the missionary field this fall.

Causes of Heart Sickness Listed

ALBANY, N. Y., Sept. 15 (UPI)—A high diastolic blood pressure, and elevated cholesterol may be factors in coronary heart disease, according to a team of Albany medical college physicians said yesterday.

After consumption and smoking are not found to be contributing factors to the disease, according to a team headed by Dr. Joseph T. Dyer, associate professor of medicine and director of the cardiovascular health center.

In their study of 1,900 middle-aged men, the team found that those who were "moderately" overweight, had a "moderately" high cholesterol, and suffered from coronary heart disease, but there is likelihood a person will get it if he is obese.
