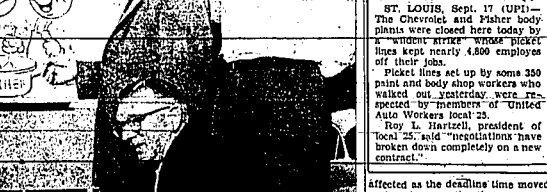

Machine Made That Reads to Blind Persons

WASHINGTON, Sept. 17 (UPI)—The Federal Communications Commission today announced a machine it will develop to help blind people read printed material.

The sound of the device gives off a tone similar to the words of ordinary speech, but patterns of an irregular shape are printed on the paper. The machine reads these sounds into letters and words.

Based on tests during the last year, the FCC said a trained person could reach a reading rate of 100 words a minute. It is estimated that both the device and training methods for its use must be developed further before it can be used.

The machine is about the size of a portable radio. It is a long, narrow, rectangular box with a line of lights on the top. The lights are arranged in a pattern which corresponds to the letters of the alphabet. The machine reads the words on the paper and sends out a tone which is similar to the words of ordinary speech. The tone is produced by a speaker which is built into the machine.

Alterations in County Dairy Testing Noted

Some changes in testing arrangements were made among members of the Twin Falls County Dairy Testing Association during the month of August, reports County Agent C. W. DeWitt.

The herd owners from around the county are now members of unit two of the association in the east end of the Twin Falls tract. All of the herds in unit one in the west end of the county are now members of unit two.

DeWitt said the association made the change because Mr. and Mrs. Marshall Adam, Piler, testing supervisors for nearly eight years, have moved to the town of Piler, and are now being tested by Harley King, Twin Falls, Dugh explains.

During August, King tested 31 units in unit one and Virgil Workman, center for unit two, also tested 31 herds. The total number of herds in unit one was 966 of which 57 were dry. They had an average yield of 82 pounds of milk, which contained 20 pounds of butterfat. In unit two, 417 cows, of which 120 were dry, had a butterfat production of 81 from 810 pounds of milk.

Unit three had 511 individual herds and had a production of 40 or more pounds of butterfat, only five herds were above that figure.

Three registered Holsteins, owned by L. J. Tenckhoff, Twin Falls, were high in both milk and butterfat production. The best milk yield was 1290 pounds, and the best butterfat test, made 17 pounds of butterfat.

In second place were the eight registered Holsteins, all milked by Rudolph Peterson and on Bull. The average milk production was 118 pounds while tested 11 to 431 pounds of butterfat.

Twenty-one registered and grade herds, owned by Dean Smith, Bull, with two dry, averaged 42.8 pounds of butterfat, and Ed Wright, Bull, also with a Jersey herd, had a production of 40.8 pounds of butterfat from 22 cows.

Tim Simons, Bull, had an average of 40.3 pounds of butterfat from 10 registered and grade Holsteins, with two dry.

Close to the 40-pound average are the eight cows of mixed breeds, with two dry, owned by Alvis Partin, Bull, that made 39.8 pounds of butterfat. Sore Hesse, Bull, Castleford, had 39.7 pounds of butterfat from 21 cows, mostly Holsteins, with two dry.

Unit four had an average of 37.2 pounds of butterfat. Farm Twin Falls, 20 41 grade Holsteins, with seven dry, averaged 37.3, and Von Nebeker, Bull, made a yield of 36.6 pounds of butterfat from 23 grade Holsteins, 10 cows and 13 dry.

Gay Carter, Twin Falls, with three 41, all milking, averaged 36.1, and had also two Twin Falls, with grade Holsteins.

Unit five, 315 E. J. Morgan, Hansen, Bull, 41 grade Holsteins, with two dry, averaged 34.9.

W. F. Chatham, Bull, is a new member in unit one. His 12-cow herd was tested for the first time in the official in August.

DeWitt said the herds who were tested in unit one and are now in unit two are Dan Knuff, Lynn Erick and Son, Hayden, Carl Leonard, Walter Matthews, Lawrence Kraft, Vernon Ross, Ross Vincent, and Harting and son, all Piler, and H. J. Clancy, Bull.

Just Short Walk in Damascus Streets Crosses 20 Centuries

BY HERMAN MORIN

"Go into the street called straight."

It runs straight as an arrow through the bozar to the terminus of the city's old east wall. How old? Nobody knows.

Damascus, they say, is the oldest inhabited city in the world. This street, surely, must have been seen by ancient Egyptians, and by forgotten kings even before them.

"And inquire in the house of Ju-

das."

In that house, the story says, a man named Saul lay sightless, stumped by what he had seen. Nobody knows what it was.

You try to picture how the street looked at that time. Probably very much as it does today.

It is narrow and choked with people. A man in long, loose robes rides past on a little white donkey. A dark-eyed woman veils her face. Day and night they mill through the street, buying, bargaining, haggling, or merely gossiping with cratmen and storekeepers.

The shops are open-fronted, without windows or doors. From the

of his hammer, shaping a handle for a lad's whip. There are stone cutters and carpenters, cobblers, tailors, leather-workers and murr-chants, jammed together in a great, buzzing, honeycomb. The air smells of spice, fruit and ancient dust.

You can buy everything here—gold, silver, precious gems, a sarsen's armor, a spotted lamb or a yellow melon.

It is a very, very worldly street.

"And inquire for one called Saul of Tarsus."

It is a very mysterious story and after nearly 2,000 years, men still puzzle over the meaning, and dis-

pute the truth of it.

On the road to Damascus, the man named Saul heard a voice calling his name. Some powerful force swept over him. It left him blind and helpless. They had to lead him by the hand into the street called straight.

For three days, he lay there stunned, unable to eat or drink.

Was it a hallucination, something Saul of Tarsus imagined?

The road to Damascus passes through blank and forbidding mountains. Heat waves rise from the tortured rocks. The mirage floats across the desert floor. It would be easy to see strange things here in

the heat of day.

Yet, the historical record seems clear.

This man had been a destroyer, savage and implacable. The disciples themselves were afraid of him. Then in that blinding moment on the desert, he changed. And the story says he became a totally different man. All that heard him were amazed.

You walk along the street called straight, remembering the story.

But this is not all. You come to the east end of the street. There stands the ruin of the old Roman gate. The story says that, after his

mysterious transformation, Saul's enemies determined to kill him and they watched the gates, day and night. When the disciples look him by night and let him down the wall in a basket. So he escaped. Not far from the Roman gate, at a segment of the old wall, there is a kind of shrine and a sign.

"At this spot, St. Paul escaped from the city, having been let down the wall in a basket."



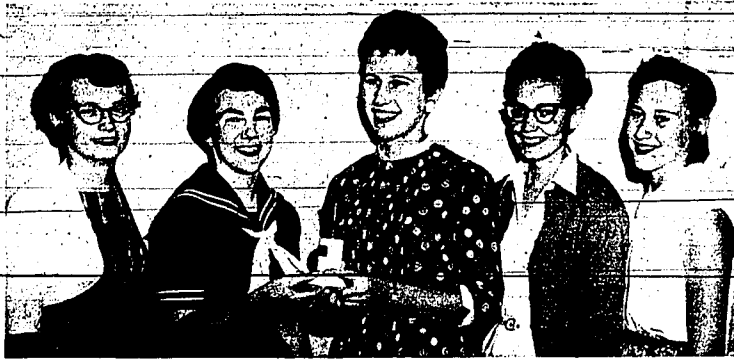

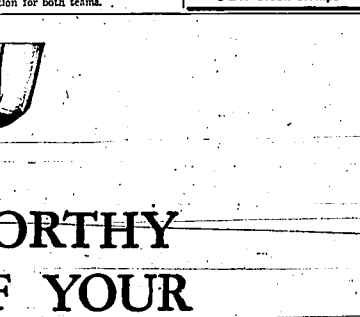
