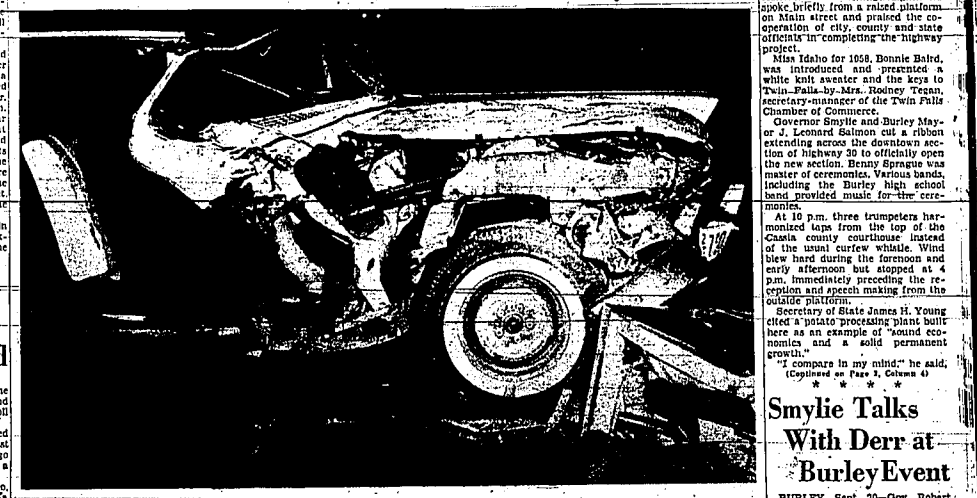

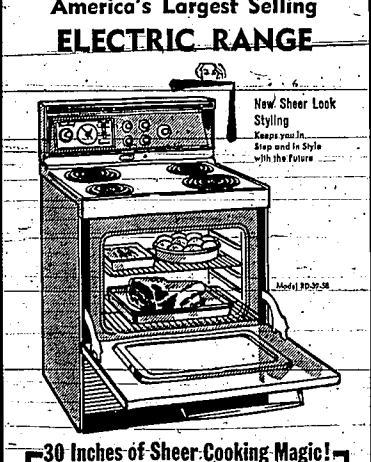

### "Rare Blood" Rushed From Boise by Idaho's Police Saved Life of Man, 36

On the night of Sept. 6, state police made a dramatic race with death from Boise to Twin Falls to deliver to Magic Valley Memorial hospital a rare type blood. The emergency run was made in record time and the blood saved the life of Harlan Miracle, 36, Boise, on whom a "colostomy" had been performed and later complicated by acute gastric hemorrhaging. Miracle's story began on Aug. 26 when he became ill while visiting his parents, Mr. and Mrs. A. R. Miracle, Route 1, Buhl. A "colostomy" operation was performed and the necessity of obtaining B-negative type blood became apparent. The local hospital had two pints on hand. On the night the blood was rushed from the Red Cross blood bank at Boise. Miracle's blood, hemorrhaging badly, only B-negative or O-negative type could save his life. An emergency call was made and at 10:30 p.m. a state police car started out with the blood. Miracle's physician said he pressed the prompt action of state police and the blood bank and stressed the importance that the rare type blood was available. "The blood definitely saved his life. The O-type is considered a 'universal type' and can be given to anyone. That is why it is one of the most sought types when a blood drawing is held. Only about 4.4 per cent of the population has such blood. The B-negative blood which Miracle needed is even more rare. About 12 per cent of the people have a B-type and 1.2 per cent of that group is B-negative. Miracle is now resting comfortably at the local hospital and awaiting transfer to the veterans hospital at Boise where he will recuperate from his experience. "The father of four boys, Miracle says, 'I sure do owe a lot to the blood program. "People don't think too much about this blood program until they begin to realize how important it is. He said he has never participated in a blood drawing held by the Red Cross but is quite certain that when he gets well and is permitted to participate, he will do so without hesitation. "Altogether, Miracle needed 12 pints of the rare blood. After the emergency run by state police, another supply was brought down by bus and later delivered from the bus to the hospital by city police. Residents of Twin Falls will have a chance from 2 to 6 p.m. Monday to assist in keeping the blood bank filled with a quota of 150 pints will be sought at the American Legion hall. Filer residents will have the same opportunity on Tuesday from 9 to 6 p.m. at the Filer-American Legion hall. All O-negative or B-negative blood donors are especially urged to donate. Wednesday, the bloodmobile will be at the Legion hall in Woodell between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m.

## Firm Had Rough Time Getting Started, Now Marketing Product in Three States

A small Twin Falls business now marketing its product in three states had a rough time getting started there only two years ago. About two years ago a woman entered the newly opened Pizza Oven, 300 Main avenue north, and asked Mrs. Jack Chitwood for an apple pie.

"We sell only pizza pies," Mrs. Chitwood informed the customer, trying to explain that the Italian delicacy which had been a rage in the East for several years was not quite the same as the pie the woman was accustomed to buying in a bakery.

"Give me one of them, then," the customer requested.

"I'll have to bake it first," Mrs. Chitwood replied.

"Bake it?" the customer exclaimed. "You mean you expect to stay in business when you don't have your pies baked and ready to go?"

Before Mrs. Chitwood could explain it takes only five minutes to bake a pizza in the 400-degree oven and that pizza is supposed to be baked on order, the woman rushed from the establishment, thoroughly disgusted.

Such were some of the obstacles Mrs. and Mrs. Chitwood had to overcome when they arrived in Twin Falls during the fall of 1956 and opened the third pizzeria in Idaho. Others operating at the time were at Pocatello and Boise. Now there are about 20 pizzerias in Idaho, Chitwood says.

During the past two years Magic

Valley residents have been educated to accept the unusual pie and today the Pizza Oven not only does a large-scale retail business, but also sells frozen pizza through the Albertson grocery store chain in Idaho, Oregon and Utah.

Today, besides Mr. and Mrs. Chitwood, the only pizzerias in Twin Falls hire two additional persons and turns out about 20 dozen pies for the wholesale market while providing for the tastes of the retail customers. In addition, many churches and organizations in the valley are beginning to hold pizza sales instead of the more common pie appears.

Should Mrs. Chitwood's woman customer return to the Pizza Oven today and ask for a pie, she probably would know better than ask for apple, and instead would ask for cheese, oyster, mushroom, anchovy, onion or any one of a dozen varieties. There can be as many different kinds of pizza as there are tastes.

Principal ingredients of the pizza, besides the Italian bread crust, are a tomato sauce, various spices and the topping. It is the topping which can change the flavor of the pie. Although cheese is the main topping offered, it is possible to order others such as those mentioned. Originally, in Italy, the Italian sausage was the desired flavor. Other toppings offered are ham, garlic, hamburger, shrimp, pepperoni or any combination of these. Prices of the pies can vary from 60 cents

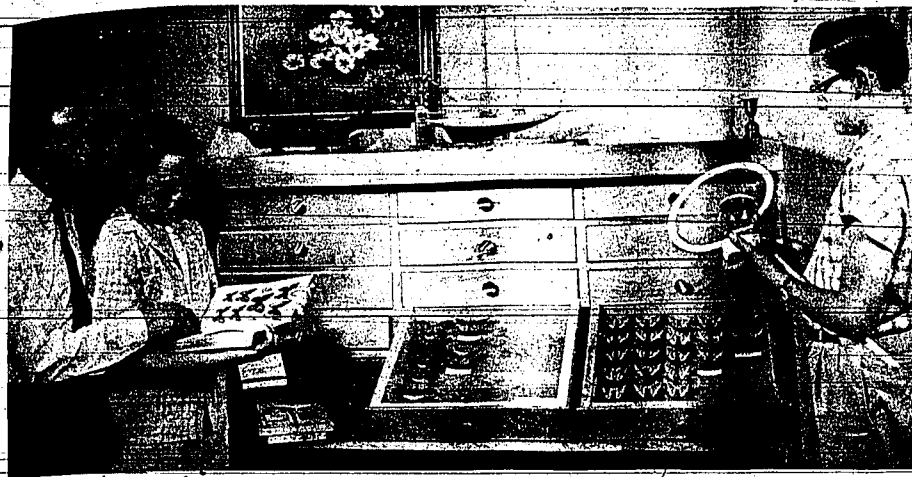

# Buhl Man and Sons Are Serious Collectors of Idaho Butterflies

## Butterfly Collection Is Hobby of Buhl Man, Two Sons; They Started in 1957

Robert W. Coad, Buhl, and his two sons, Luman and Francis, collect, classify and file butterflies. It was in July, 1957, when the Coads began to work seriously on their collection. Before that, they had little interest in them, and looked upon a butterfly as most people do, just another insect.

However, Coad recalls the beginning interest. "My son had to have some top biology class, so we started from that. Now the family has between 400 and 500 of the insects."

Coad says he used to catch butterflies when he was school-age. So it was easy for him to regain his former interest, and through him he soon decided they'd go along to catch them for fun. Later they found they enjoyed it as much as their father.

Whenever the Coads have free time, they are examining or just out for a walk, they take their butterfly nets and stalk butterflies. "A few are real good ones and plenty," Coad says.

But rewards are well worth the time, according to Coad. "Occasionally he finds a rather rare

specimen, and that adds to the delight of butterfly chasing.

There are about 30,000 kinds of butterflies in the world. North America north of Mexico has about 700 different species. Idaho has about 150 varieties at one time or another in the year.

Since some butterflies migrate, certain kinds are found only during certain months. Furthermore, some of the insects live only a few hours, a few days or a few weeks after hatching from the chrysalis case or cocoon state. Average life span is four to five weeks.

"This makes the butterfly collector's task difficult. It is easy to catch common varieties, and most collectors do so with speed. But to make a collection complete and to provide more enjoyment from working with the insects, it takes much skill and effort to find, catch and transport scarce kinds."

Once a butterfly is spotted, the collector stalks it until close enough to flip the net over the insect. But the collector's problems just begin when one is captured. It must be taken to his house for classifying and preserving.

Coad notes this latter task is the hardest of all. He says it is extremely difficult to preserve the insects without injuring them. When drying and classifying is finished, many times mice and muscuss weevils nest to the specimens and destroy them.

"Preserving them is an art and skill to test the best of reflexes," says Coad. "It is necessary to spread wings without tearing them; replace any antennae that have broken off and pin the insects to cork-bottomed filing drawers."

He mounts them on a special entomology pin coated with enamel. He pins each insect to a drying board and it dries in about a week. Then he puts each butterfly into its neat, airtight cabinet. It has 30 filing drawers, the bottoms of which are lined with cork.

Coad built the cabinet himself. If someone had done it for him, he figures the cost would have been about \$500. However, he constructed it himself and it cost less than half that cost.

As he built each drawer, Coad put DDT into the glue used to make

chances of hitching are small. Ants and spiders make feasts of them, according to Coad.

Phenomenon of butterfly migration out of its pupal case, there are many varieties. Most vibrant, pumple-mottled with its abdomen forces liquid glue into the hollow cells between upper and lower membranes.

"When the glue hardens, the vein, some containing the membrane are bound together permanently. As hardening takes place, the wings and scales assume color and shape and there is a new-born, full-grown butterfly."

Tensues of butterflies may be four or five inches in length, according to Coad. He says they have been adapted to a high degree of usefulness to the birds. When not in use, the butterfly's tongue coils up like "the hot springs of water," observes the collector.

The butterfly catcher calls attention to the insect's habit of migration. Some are known to move thousands of miles as birds do.

Monarch or milkweed butterfly is best known of the migrants. They start south about the end of August from northern points in Canada. By November, involving 1000 miles, the insects reach the Gulf states and remain in semi-hibernation until March.

While in the southern states, the Monarchs remain in groups reaching the millions. However, as migrations begin northward, each insect travels more or less independently.

Other migrating butterflies have been known to travel in groups of thousands or even millions. One of these, and once in Oregon, a 15-mile path of them passed overhead for seven hours.

Another migration in Africa during 1929 continued for 16 weeks and perhaps longer before it was interrupted. The observers got tired of watching for the insects, and it last known for certain how long the flight lasted, according to Coad.

Reasons for migrations aren't known for sure. It could be weather, starvation, overcrowding or one of other unexplained causes. Coad notes it may be an instinct, but evidence is mixed whether or not this is true.

One instinct the insects do have is flight in a straight direction. They have been known to fly through long railway tunnels and into windows of rooms. They proceed out the other side if there is a window open.

Otherwise, the butterfly will battle itself against the wall of the building until it dies, rather than deviate from its fixed course.

But what does it know why the butterfly does this, nor how he can maintain a straight-line path, according to Coad.

There aren't too many people collecting butterflies with any seriousness, notes Buhl's collector. The world's largest collection takes a good sized building, relates Coad. The butterfly enthusiast has about half of all butterflies found in Idaho. He hopes to find most of the others in the not-too-distant future. They are hardly noticeable once they light on the right tree.

Cocoons of some butterflies are similar to tree buds. Some caterpillars spin dummy chrysalis cases to fool the enemy.

Most butterfly caterpillars do not spin cocoons. Instead, they bury themselves in the ground under leaves and logs. Butterfly cases usually are laid on leaves and

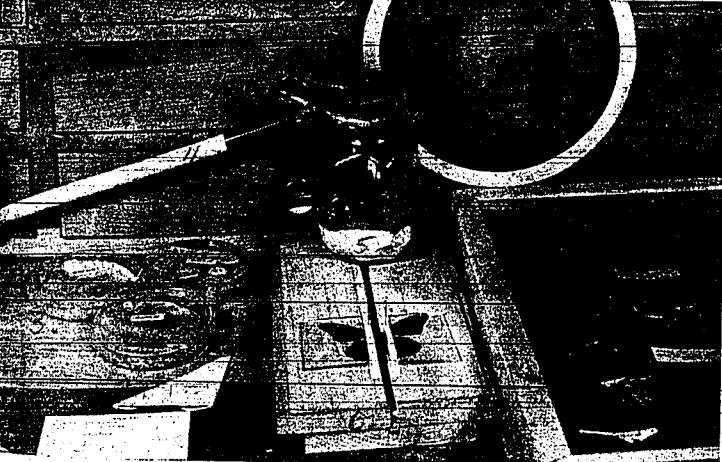

Recent an eastern magazine reporter asked several sports-minded people what "sound" they considered most thrilling—answered varied, from the sound of a gopher tearing off to the cry of a loon on a quiet summer evening. A good gamble would be that 50,000 Idaho hunters will go right down the line for the king of the western mountains—the piercing whistle of a bull elk.

If you don't believe that, find yourself a lot to sit on near a small crowd in the Chamberlain Basin country—some evening about the middle of September. Hire a good hunter or better yet, try your hand on calling with one of the homemade whistles hunters often use. 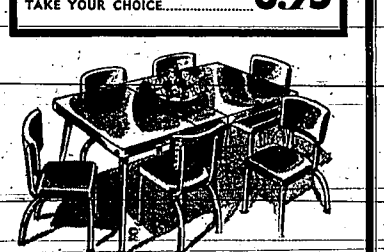
