Armed Forces To Stage Feat

Atomic Battle

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 3 (UPI)—Wednesday is a day for 25,000 soldiers and sailors who will participate in an amphibious assault on the central California coast in a full-scale test of atomic age battle tactics.

Called Exercise Rocky Shoals, the maneuver will feature the first landing of army troops by helicopters from ships at sea.

Division Always Ready
The main beach assault troops of the 13,000 soldiers participating are members of the crack fourth infantry division at Ft. Lewis. It is one of four pentomic divisions always ready to be air or sea lifted: any where in the world.

The two battle groups have been on route from Puget Sound in navy transports since last Wednesday. Twelve transport ships, including 40 navy ships, including the world's first helicopter assault carrier, the *Thetis Bay*, will be busy putting the troops ashore along a 30-mile stretch of coastline near the little community of San Bincen on Wednesday morning.

It will be the biggest army-navy amphibious exercise ever—115,000 troops.

Tests Modern Warfare
The landing will test an ultra-modern concept of amphibious "vertical envelopment." Under this strategy, troops borne by helicopters surround enemy units and destroy them with low yield atomic weapons.

Following the assault landing, troops will move into the hills of Hunter Liggett military reservation at Camp Roberts. Maneuvers will continue through five days until Nov. 10 when re-embarkation begins. Re-embarkation will be by the amphibious assault groups—troops armed with tactical atomic weapons have landed Mexico and the West coast to the Columbia river.

The "friendly" forces all south from Puget Sound to land in central California and strike at the "enemy's" weakest link in his supply line.

Committee Notes

Trend to Secrecy

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3 (UPI)—The house information subcommittee charged today some military officials with "worship at the shrine of secrecy." It hinted Congress will not stand idly by if the situation persists.

The statement came as the subcommittee prepared to hold two days of hearings next week involving the air force and charges of withholding information from congress.

The subcommittee said in a report on the years of inquisitive action aimed at furthering freedom of information in government, "as the eyes of the public are turned to the federal government has been unfolded in subcommittee hearings, the subcommittee is asked to protect the right of access to information in specific areas."

However, the subcommittee said congressional action in specific areas does not mean "federal officials are free to set themselves up as censors in areas where the law may be silent."

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3 (AP)—Eddie Cantor has said the move for right-to-work laws is a threat to minority rule, like that which destroyed freedom in Nazi Germany, fascist Italy and communist Russia.

The veteran entertainer urged defeat of right-to-work proposals on the ballot next Tuesday in six states—California, Ohio, Washington, Colorado, Kansas and Idaho.

New Pope John XXIII Is Both Unlike and Similar to Pius XII

VATICAN CITY, Nov. 3 (UPI)—The Vatican square resounded with the approval when Pope John XXIII stepped to the balcony of St. Peter's basilica to give his first blessing to the city of Rome and the world.

In the narrow streets of Sotto il Monte—which means under the mountain—children danced and shouted, "Long live to Bonatti. Long live the pope."

For it was in this little Italian Alpine town of 1,800 people that the 262nd pontiff of the Roman Catholic church was born Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli nearly 77 years ago. He was the child of a poor farmer.

The Roncalli were patriarchy, the Roncalli humble country folk. The now most famous son has sometimes been called a countryman. It is a quality that has endeared him to many.

The quasi-loyalty common to his native Bergamo province more than anything else immediately marks the distance between Pope John and his predecessor, the aristocratic Roman who for 19 years guided the church through an extremely difficult war and postwar period.

Few men looked less alike. Pius, slender, frail, ascetic; John, a 210-pounder with a robustness befitting his years, a heritage of his peasant background.

But there are many similarities, dedication to the church from early life, intimate experience with Vatican administration years in the church's diplomatic service, association with foreign government heads as a papal ambassador, deep awareness of communism's threat to Catholicism, staunch defender of morality, devotion to study, research and scholarship.

The new pope was one of twelve children, his father a sharecropper.

In 1918 when he became patriarch of Venice, he told his parishioners, "I was born of poor parents, providing me with a very narrow native hamlet and led me to travel the roads of the world, from east to west, passing me in contact with the most serious social and political problems."

"Now... my long experience has convinced me that the church must be open to the world."
