

Demos Claim Biggest Win In Colorado

Denver, Nov. 5 (AP)—Democrats won their biggest victory in Colorado history today as they defeated the Republicans in the state-wide election.

The Democrats' triumph was a surprise to many observers, who had expected a narrow Republican victory. The Democrats' lead was built on a combination of factors, including a strong performance in the urban areas and a significant gain in the rural areas.

The election results were as follows: Democrats won 100 seats in the state legislature, while the Republicans won 80 seats. The Democrats also won the governorship and the state senate.

In Next 2 Years Experts Will Try To Fit Voting Into Future

For the next two years the political savants will be trying to fit yesterday's election returns into the picture of the future, especially 1956.

It is not clear whether this does anybody any harm, except to the political pundit who is trying to predict the future. The pundit's job is to predict the future, and he is doing it as best he can.

One reason for this is that the pundits are often confused by the fact that they take for trends only a series of coincidences. This is especially true of non-presidential elections, when people are voting for someone to represent them, not someone to represent the nation as a whole.

Take the so-called foreign policy debate during the campaign just ended. For one part, the critics have been trying to impugn or reduce the reputation of their party's candidates for "hardcore" international affairs.

For the other part, they have been playing to particularly Republican thought and prejudice. The result represents a decision on an action level. The representatives in Congress chosen after such debates have been elected primarily on the basis of local issues, in general they will follow the decisions of the more experienced leaders in their parties and in the administration.

There has been, however, one extremely interesting development in the past campaign which could affect both policy and politics during the next two years.

Secretary Dulles and President Eisenhower were doing all they could to tone down the foreign policy debate when Vice President Nixon decided he had to get into it. He was not to meet Democrats.

The President didn't like it at first, but then reversed himself to Nixon-bait his way.

To that degree, Nixon assumed a portion of the political leadership usually pertaining to the presidency. The next question is whether Nixon, leading candidate at present for the Republican nomination in the next election, will assume further political leadership in the next two years to shape the party for his own benefit.

The President might even like that—to have his last two years undisturbed by the national politics which he has so often sought to evade.

In this situation, the germ of a non-partisan presidency with the political work left in the vice president's hands may be a possibility.

Jackson Wins Again; 'Work' Issue Beaten

Seattle, Nov. 5 (AP)—William B. Egan early today conceded defeat in his first major election since the 1948 field, an attempt to unseat Democratic Sen. Henry M. Jackson.

Battle former U. S. attorney for the western district of Washington, lost in the lowest at 12:30 p.m. of the day—the result of a 154,000 vote margin showed he was trailing Jackson 180,548-89,928.

While giving up Jackson an overwhelming vote of confidence, Washington voters at the same time gave a resounding thumbs-down to Egan's right-to-work legislation.

The right-to-work initiative, with 129 of 152 precincts counted, had drawn only 105,269 affirmative votes while 189,229 ballots were cast.

Republicans were leading in all congressional races, except in the seventh district, the Republicans in the First and Fifth districts were assured of election and the Democrats in the seventh district appeared to be home free.

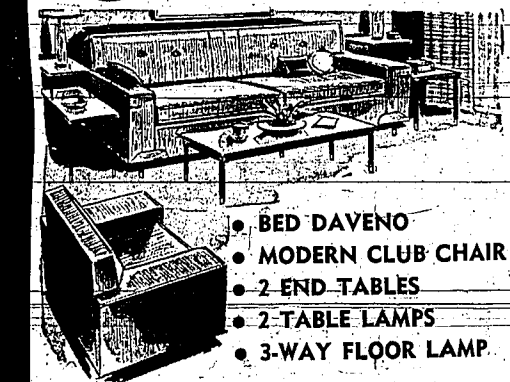

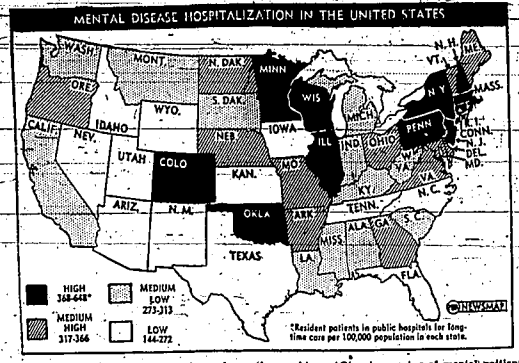
A strong favorable vote went to an amendment which would have authorized a property exemption for household furnishings and equipment in houses they own and occupy.

NEW YORK, Nov. 5 (UPI)—All persons concerned about their inability to remember what happened at cocktail parties and that must number a majority of persons who drink them, can put their worries at rest on the word of a scientific authority on the odd ins and outs of human behavior.

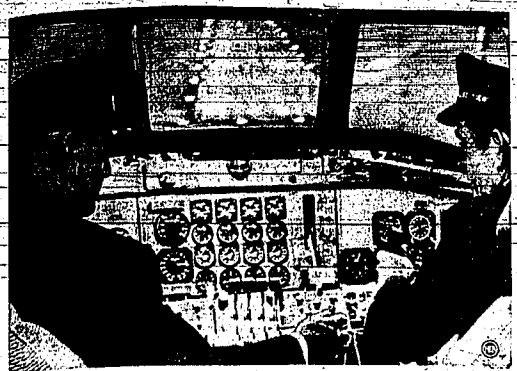

Shivering Over Jet Travel? No Need; Pilots Well Trained

DENVER, Colo. (UPI)—The flying high-how of airline jet pilots is expected to be \$27,000,000 this year, according to a survey by the National Airlines Association. The survey shows that pilots are better trained than the public realizes. The expert opinion of airline officials who are doing everything possible to eliminate human error from the operation of the new commercial jet passenger ships. An Air Transport Association official in Washington explains that the job of flying the planes at speed capable of lifting you from New York to Paris in six and a half hours is given to pilots with plenty of flying experience. These are the airlines' senior pilots who are usually over 40 years old and who have been haul-

Thus, regular pilots can actually relate to the speed, height and angle at which he is supposed to be without ever leaving the ground. They can learn how to handle the plane, successfully under all emergency conditions. The simulator training is made even more realistic by the use of a closed circuit television system. TV cameras in another room flash an exact replica of a DC-8 cockpit in front of the cockpit. The pilot practices, takes off and lands. The picture changes in-

The intense training, scheduled for commercial jet pilots is only one of many safety guarantees that the airlines are providing their future customers. Air transport association officials say that the time spent by pilot training plus that used in the developing and testing of the aircraft will total "millions" of man-hours where commercial jets finally start carrying passengers. They explain that the planes have received about every conceivable type of structural and mechanical test to make sure that they are trustworthy. Plans are also under consideration at Uncle Sam's civil aeronautics administration to minimize the possibility of air collisions by setting up a series of high altitude flight lanes for commercial jets. Air traffic flying in these lanes would operate on instruments and be controlled from the ground. Another safety regulation recently announced by the U. S. civil aeronautics board requires commercial jets to provide extra oxygen equipment for each passenger just in case something should go wrong with a plane's pressurizing system.

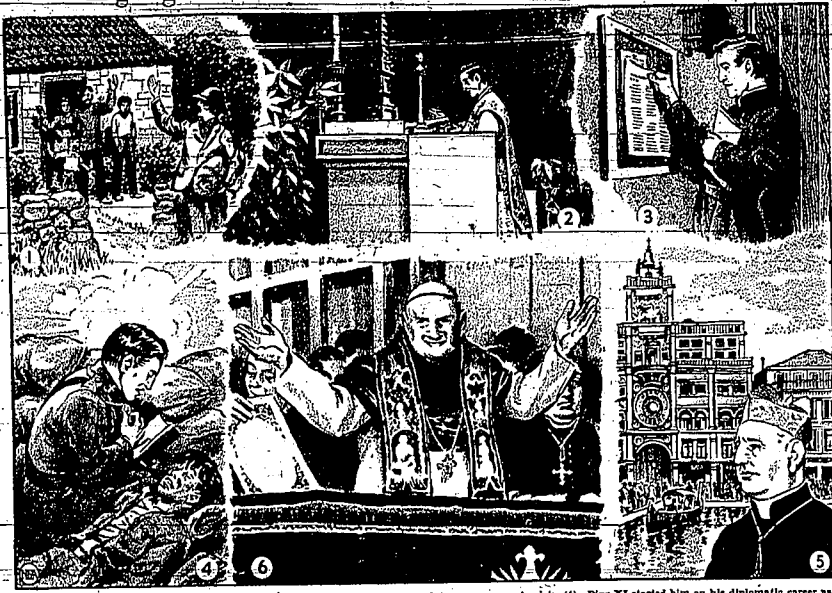

His great love of parish work was first evidenced when, as assistant to the bishop of Bergamo, 1905-14, he instituted (3) the then daring innovation of publishing parish news bulletins. Drafted into the Italian army at outbreak of World War I, he served first in the medical corps, later as an army chaplain (4). Pius XI started him on his diplomatic career as apostolic visitor to Bulgaria in 1925. Appointed nuncio to Paris in December, 1944, he served there in the difficult postwar years. Elevated to the cardinalate in 1953, he became (5) patriarch of Venice. On Oct. 28, 1958, Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli took the name of Pope John XXIII, after being elected by the Sacred College of Cardinals to become the 262nd leader (6) of the Roman Catholic church, the 43rd consecutive Italian pope in 435 years.

DEVON (UPI)—The atomic energy commission has finished the search for uranium prospectors in the area of the plateau in 1958 and has ruled that no more amateur prospectors are to be licensed. The commission has ruled that only those prospectors who have been licensed by the U. S. Democratic gains a strong challenge to pick up three or more Republican seats in California. A gain of three would reverse control of the 30-man house delegation from 19-13 Republican to 15-14 Democratic.

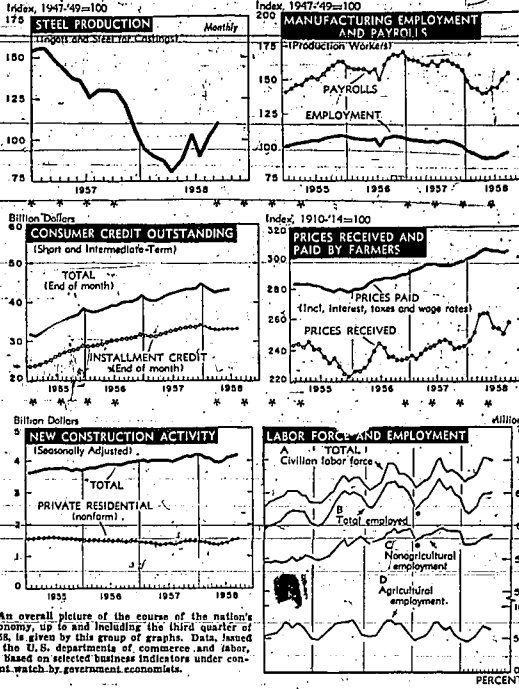

During Science Year Several Experts Study Ocean's Floor

BRITISH (UPI)—While some scientists have spent this International Geophysical Year hurling nuclear bombs—others—dedicated to the study of the ocean's floor.

The scientists hope to find there a question that the men of science have been asking since the discovery of the Atlantic Ocean: "What happened to the sea bed?"

The British scientists get their clues from rocks and mud and lime they haul up from the sea bottom in tubes rammed 21 feet into the sea bed from miniature surveys and from the study of temperatures at the sea bottom.

in length, plus modern sounding devices, and one of their number, Dr. A. S. Laughlin, formerly of Cambridge, is a specialist in underwater photography. His flashlight photos expose the secrets of the depths.

"We think you can learn about the bottom of the sea without going down in a bathyscope," Hill said. "He said the business of charting the ocean bed is in its infancy, a science that interested nobody until World War II."

J. C. Swallow, National Institute of Oceanography, is aboard Discovery II studying currents.

"He has an ingenious new method for determining the flow of deep currents—an apparatus is lowered to a set depth and then floats will be suspended in the water column which operators in the ship pick up, enabling the course of the apparatus to be checked."

Swallow has established that in some places the vast deep sea water mass 15,000 feet below the surface sometimes moves as much as three miles in a day, but usually less.

There seems to be no set pattern for its movement. It varies from place to place in both speed and direction and measurements made in the same area several weeks apart show marked changes.

Ask Swallow what practical application this knowledge has and the answers:

"None immediately. It helps indirectly to an understanding of fishery problems because the deep waters are rich in the nutrients on which fish depend. It also helps—perhaps to further our understanding of climatic conditions because of the influence of water on air temperatures."

Why then a lifetime of dedication in the study of water on the ocean floor?

"Well," said Swallow, "we scientists like to know as much about the world as possible and one never knows what one is going to stumble across next."

Only U. S. Man In Pro Hockey Wears Helmet

COLUMBUS, O., Nov. 5 (UPI)—Fair weather fans at Ohio State have erected a campus monument to coach Woody Hayes. The "monument" was a stuffed dummy with a rope about its neck, dangling solemnly from a tree limb. A dagger was plunged into the dummy's chest, near the heart. A sign on the monument reads—"Hayes—we lost." A football spot card was pinned to the figure.

A courageous group of students braved the daylight hours yesterday to hang Hayes in effigy, undoubtedly as a result of the Buckeyes' 21-0 loss to Northwestern last Saturday. Hayes, wearing a black tie and a scarf to match, declined comment on the "hanging." He apparently consoled himself with his old motto—"when you're winning, you don't need friends. And when you're losing, you don't have any."

Bob White, the Buckeyes' leading scorer, voiced the team's opinion with "Gee, I sure hate to hear that. We didn't know it at practice last night. I didn't see it and I don't think anybody on the team saw it either."

"I hate to hear it," he repeated. "Hayes apparently was unaware that he had been 'strung up' until the last minute. He went through the usual Monday practice and made his usual victory prediction for Saturday's game with Northwestern."

"How is this about Ohio's loss except to say that I'm a fan?" said one of the students. "Of his team, he said only that end Jim Houston was magnificent. In fact, 'He's the best and we've had eight years,' Hayes said."

His only shift in the lineup for the game was 240-pound Dan James of Cincinnati replace guard Oscar Hater, a sophomore who has played 10 full 60 minutes in four of the Buckeye six games.

When word of the "hanging" first came, said Dan James, he was downtown Columbus, opinion was divided. But most main street youngsters defended the hanging. "You can't knock success," one noted. "And old Woody sure has had success."

That was putting it mildly. The Northwestern loss was Ohio's first in 10 years. The last time Wisconsin was left only one blow-out TCU beat the Bucks 17-14 in the 1947 season.

Hayes' seven-year reign at the football-mad school has produced two Heisman award winners and two national champions—1954 and 1957—and three Big Ten titles in the past four years.

U.S. Case on Tax Evading Is Dismissed

MOSCOW, Nov. 15 (U.S. News) - An income tax indictment against Theodore Avastis, a Wallace, Idaho, garage owner, was dismissed Tuesday after the surprising testimony of an internal revenue agent.

Agent Walter Kallias of Tacoma, Wash., testified that he helped Avastis prepare his 1953 return that this government had questioned and that the indictment was dismissed.

Woolfin Patton of Seattle, a defense attorney, said Kallias said he thought there was something wrong with his books.

Kallias, a government witness, admitted that he had met Avastis in taxes for the years 1951, 1952 and 1953. But the government said it would show the taxpayer that for the three years would amount to about \$70,000.

The sudden end of the two-day trial stunned the jury and the government attorneys were obviously surprised.

Avastias had pleaded innocent and said if there was any discrepancy in his returns, it was simply an honest bookkeeping error.

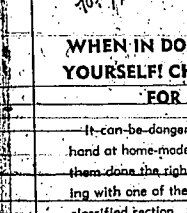

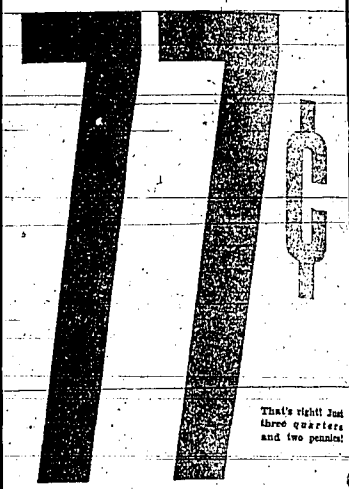
I wonder if it takes much capital to start a magazine. If it doesn't, look out for a new one. Something like "Gentlemen's Home Gazette."

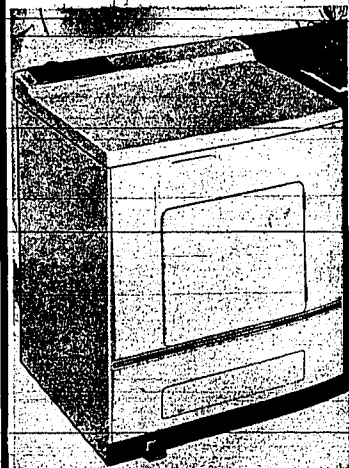
