WASHINGTON, Nov. 10 (UPI)—Civil rights emerged today as a major issue facing the incoming congressional session. Its omission from a legislative 12-point program proposed by Senate Democratic Leader Lyndon B. Johnson.

Sen. John F. Judge Backs High Court's New Rulings

NEW YORK, Nov. 10 (UPI)—U. S. supreme court Justice William O. Douglas said Saturday the court will not "take a back seat" to demands that its powers be curbed.

Declaring that "despite dispute as to independent judiciary," Douglas said the American democratic system is stable because the judiciary was like a "great rock" unmovable by storms breaking over it, even when they lead to attempts to nullify its decisions.

Douglas made the first such forthright public defense of the high court by one of its members in a speech to the Columbia law school at a meeting celebrating its 100th anniversary.

There have been a number of attacks on the supreme court in recent months for allegedly usurping the law-making powers of congress and the states in decisions on racial segregation and subversion.

Douglas acknowledged that courts in interpreting laws, do take on a kind of law-making power. But he said in such cases the legislature has the final word and "if the congressional will is clear, the courts must be overruled by an amendment of the law."

He legislated constant legislative review of laws, as interpreted by the courts, a "healthy practice."

Rockefeller's Election Marks Change in View Toward Name

NEW YORK, Nov. 10 (UPI)—Election of Nelson A. Rockefeller as governor of New York marks a complete revolution in the public attitude toward the family name.

Half a century ago the name was feared and hated as a symbol of the ruthless power of Standard Oil, notorious in those years for cutthroat competition.

Labor's Plan May Net GOP More Worries

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10 (UPI)—Those Republicans who are already scared the growing political power of labor may find further cause for alarm before the election of 1960.

The AFL-CIO merger, consolidations reached by the political strategists of the AFL-CIO after last Tuesday's elections, was the organized labor's effort, largely in support of Democratic candidates, was mainly less successful in states where the AFL and CIO state organizations have not yet completed the merger already achieved at the national level.

Mergers Scheduled

These state mergers are scheduled for completion before the end of this year and in any case are expected to be in effect by the 1960 election.

They will involve 10 of the largest states which play a critical part in national elections—New York, New Jersey, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania and California.

Labor officials believe a more unified front by labor movement in several of these states would have elected more "labor-backed" candidates in congress.

California apparently was an exception to the finding that the labor effort was relatively weak in states where the AFL and CIO have not yet merged. However labor was united in that state by its opposition to the right-to-work proposition, which was defeated.

Reds Develop Tough Rulings Over Children

A new and tougher form of control over school children being developed in the USSR through organization of labor brigades in the eighth- and ninth-grades.

The campaign to organize these brigades of boys and girls 15 to 17 is pushed by Nikita Khrushchev himself.

"Study While Working"

The new type of organization is intended as an integral part of the "study while you work" plan advocated by Khrushchev.

Most Soviet school pupils will have to work at fulltime jobs beginning after the seventh grade and continuing their studies only at night schools and through correspondence courses.

As this system has been working in Stavropol region the brigades average about 80 young people. At mid-October there were 25,000 brigade members in the district.

Farm Work Is Done

Most are being used on farm work and have definite plots of land for which they are responsible. Hours are set aside for work in the fields so as not to interfere with school work. The brigades also work all vacations and holidays.

Khrushchev says the brigade system is good for the young people because it teaches them to work and they are getting used to discipline.

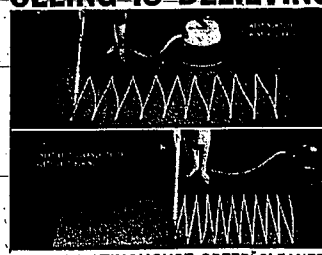

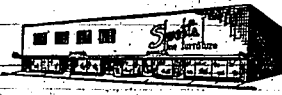
