Study Shows American Drink Custom Leading to Alcoholism

The report found that the "drinkers" behavior of "fastidious" shows a variety of protections against some dangerous effects of alcoholic beverages. But when Italians become Americans these protections are lost.
The study traced increasing degrees of loss in first, second, and third generation Italo-Americans.
It gave emphasis to the psychological side of American drinking. In Italy, this side is minor, since wine is a "room" like any food.
But in America, "the custom of using alcoholic beverages separately from other food items—namely at the cocktail hour—is linked with a search for the psychological effects of alcohol. And this 'cannot fail to cover those conditions which are conducive to intoxication and the excessive use of alcohol.'

New Recorder Machine Made

PALE ALTO, Calif., Nov. 11 (UPI)—Lockheed scientists announced today they have developed a rugged electronic tape recorder able to store three million pieces of sensitive data—and yet small enough to be held in one hand.
The compact unit, weighing only eight pounds and measuring nine inches long, was developed at Lockheed's missile systems division's research laboratory here.
Mark Sierra, research scientist in the telecommunications department, said the recorder could be mounted on a probe, manned and unmanned spacecraft, and for interplanetary vehicles.
It can record and store vital data at a universe during long interplanetary trips as an interplanetary space unit is out of direct radio contact with the earth. It can upload the accumulated information in one flash the time it takes to record it.
Sierra said Lockheed is now developing an easily changeable cartridge containing a 600-foot endless tape which records two tracks of information simultaneously.

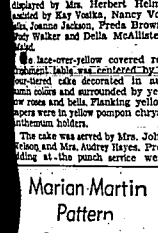

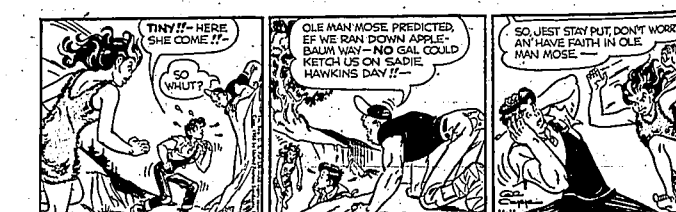
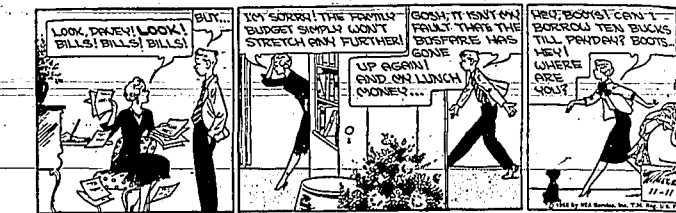

### Each LDS Missionary Spends Many Hours for Each Convert

Hundreds of hours of work, miles of walking from house to house, thousands of words spoken, and the results are one new believer.

This is the routine task being carried on by about 5,000 polished, gracious young men and women who earn not a cent and who even pay their own expenses.

Their one aim, and only compensation is bringing others into the church.

For each convert, it takes an average 500 man hours of work.

"Even to bring one person to the truth is worth all the effort, no matter what it takes," said Apostle Harold B. Lee, Salt Lake City, one of the ruling council of 12 of the LDS church.

The Mormon effort invested in the job, in terms of the proportion of full-time evangelists efforts by members, is unsurpassed among the larger churches.

Most Mormon young men, at age 20, become missionaries for two years. So do many Mormon young women, at age 23. Replacements each year keep the force up to strength.

The young ministers, sent out two by two as Jesus dispatched his disciples, are busy in cities throughout the United States and in most foreign countries. The job is not an easy one.

Working down to dark five days a week, each missionary averages winning four converts per year—ones in three months—but the total for the whole movement is a weighty one—about 20,000 new members annually.

"It takes dedication, physical stamina and mental alertness to do the work," said Theodore C. Jacobson, president of the Church's Eastern States mission, with headquarters in New York City.

"It also takes a lot of persever-

ance and humility. There's no way to reach the human heart without being humble about it."

Mormon method used is the personal visit, on a house-to-house basis. A two-member team will approach a home, knock on the door.

When it is answered, one of them will say something like, "We're ministers from the LDS church. We have a message about God to leave with you. May we come in?"

Sometimes, the response is a snarl and a promptly shut door. Sometimes it is polite interest. Whatever it is, the missionaries are schooled to take it with a kindly smile. Sometimes people are ready to listen.

"Our purpose is to offer a message, not inflict it; to provide an opportunity, not impose it," said Apostle Spencer W. Kimball, Salt Lake City.

Kimball, vice chairman of the church's missionary program, said the evangelizing efforts are bringing such rapid growth that new chapels are opening at an average rate of more than one a day.

The church, once confined largely to Utah, now has more than 2 1/2 million members, with wards (congregations) and stakes (regional organizations) in nearly every state and major city.

Membership is double that of 25 years ago.

Kawerka passed the auto and pulled in front of it, slowing the car to a halt by using his rear bumper. Mrs. Gensler said the brakes on her car failed at the top of the incline.
