### Russian-Born American Sits At Arms Meet

GENEVA, Nov. 12 (UPI) — One of the top Russian-born scientists at the West conference on the occasion of surprise attendance at the Western side considered it a "big thing out of the ordinary." The man is tall, prize-winning scientist expert Dr. George D. Kistiakowsky, who has lived in the United States since 1926.

Kistiakowsky, a nationalized American, is one of the top three U. S. experts at the conference and the most distinguished of technical delegates.

Has No Hesitancy, however, in his own opinion, however, he has no hesitancy about sitting at the Western side at the conference table.

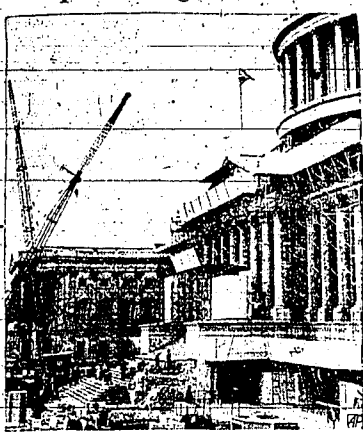
In the habitually measured words he used in his conversation, he said Kistiakowsky told United Press International he felt the conference was dealing with some very difficult problems.

He said, however, his outlook was not that of any other American, either native or foreign born, and he was nonetheless hopeful that the meeting would make some progress.

Kistiakowsky is a chemistry professor at Harvard since 1950, Kistiakowsky has conducted constant research in scientific and technical work, particularly that at Los Alamos, N. M., where he received the British medal in 1946 for his work on the atomic bomb. He was awarded the degree of doctor of science in 1949 from the University of the U. S. in that year as an international research fellow at Princeton.

As soon as this Democrat beat Republican William Knowland in Tuesday's election, his headquarters bombarded Washington newsmen with airmail, special delivery letters on his victory, and power and splendid qualities.

Brown's win over Knowland pushed him into national prominence for the first time; he hasn't yet moved into the governor's office.

What he can do, but three letters were like telling the big-name political lions in his party to "make way, boys, for a lion."

The lions may be impressed or they may think that for sheer gall, no man has ever done that. The man is in a class by himself.

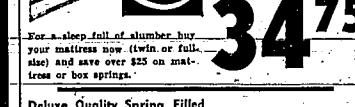

Experts Talk

About Heavy Space Traffic

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., Nov. 12 (UPI)—The time is when space traffic will be as heavy that it will be necessary to have fleets of rescue spacecraft ready to dash to the rescue of astronauts in the event of a disaster between Earth and the moon.

Norman V. Petersen, Lockheed Aircraft corporation, said there will be a fleet of rescue spacecraft to perform emergency rescues of astronauts in space shuttles, assuming crew malfunctions, malfunctioning or isolated rescue spacecraft and space vehicles.

So far man has been unable to land on the moon for a few pounds of man-made matter as far as the moon is concerned. But that hasn't prevented Petersen and other space experts from looking ahead to the possibility of interplanetary travel.

Ideas Presented at Meet

Petersen presented his ideas, complete with graphs and complicated calculations, on how to make space travel safe, at the second annual symposium on space medicine and medicine being conducted at the University of Texas.

Paul A. Campbell, air force colonel, said the declaration that space is an ethical democracy, "is an anachronism or an expedition will be sent into space by our nation until there is a reasonable chance of a safe journey and of safe return in case of accident."

Major M. Mayo, chief safety engineer, Douglas Aircraft Co., said that the theme with respect to space is "the space traveler who is not adequately prepared to handle the stresses and strains of space flight."

Space Safety—Seen Possible

Experts agreed that, though space is "hostile" something can be done to improve man's chances of surviving in space. Campbell said that survival odds can be raised to acceptable values.

Petersen probed deeply into the risks of space travel, and into the possibilities of returning from space.

He said a stalled spacecraft may be able to pull a man out of space, but that has run out of gas. You can't figure out the trajectory of a man in space.

John Error Becomes Big

In space travel you can't depend on a fundamental equation. A man can't get out of space unless he has a way to get back.

Among things that could happen in space, Petersen listed accidents involving the moon, loss of power, falling in the empty gulf of solar space.

Petersen thinks the worst traffic accidents will occur in satellite systems to 10,000 miles from the Earth. Satellites in that region would be subject to weather conditions, communication craft, rockets, rockets and assembly platforms, and other bases for interplanetary travel.

Mrs. G. Serr, 30, Is Claimed by Death

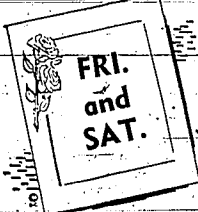

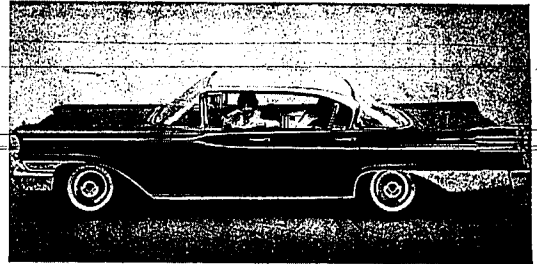

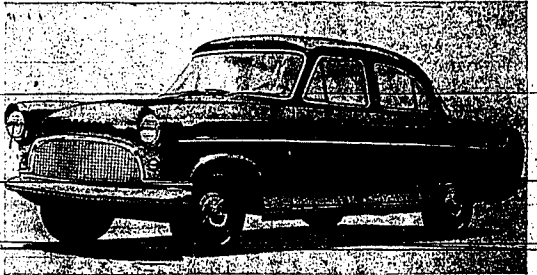

**Dulles Talk Is Set at Colombo Plan Meetings**

OTTAWA, Nov. 12 (UPI)—United States Secretary of State, John Foster Dulles, was in the "chat" today at meetings of the Colombo Plan conference continued at the ministerial level.

Dulles will address the final meeting of the ministerial delegates tomorrow.

Yesterday, Sidney Smith, external affairs minister for Canada, said his country plans a 15 million dollar a year increase in aid to Colombo plan nations.

Plans subject to OK

Smith said the plans, subject to approval of the Canadian parliament, would increase Canada's contribution to 30 million dollars a year.

Canada, he said, has contributed more than 200 million dollars for development in south and southeast Asia since inception of the Colombo plan in 1950.

The prospects of new resources were hailed by delegates. Allan Noble, minister of state for foreign affairs, United Kingdom, said his country welcomes ideas for extending the Colombo plan to other international banks and the international monetary funds.

He urged

"But in both cases," he said, "we felt that, as with other forms of aid, it is in the general interest that care should be taken to make the best use of these resources and that sound financial standards should be applied in making capital available, whether short term or long term."

Ambassadors or ministers of 18 nations and three colonies, Singapore, North Borneo and Sarawak, are attending the meetings which began Oct. 20.

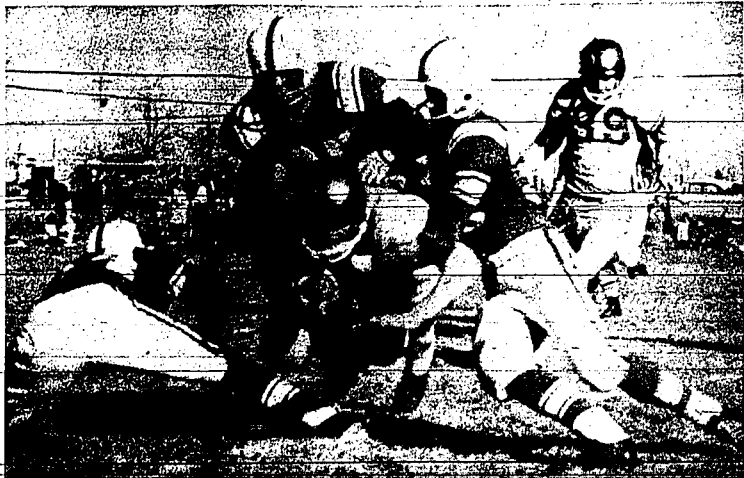
## Jerome Stuns Buhl With 3 First-Quarter Scores, Goes on to 33-7 Victory

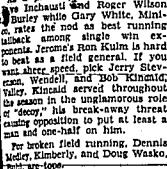
## Tigers Defeat Glenns Ferry By 20-0 Count

## LSU Appears Cinch For Sugar Bowl Bid

NEW ORLEANS, Nov. 12 (AP)—Unbeaten Louisiana State looks like a cinch for the host's role in the Sugar bowl on New Year's day, but an opponent for the speed-spurred Bayou Tigers is everybody's guess. LSU, rated the nation's top football team in the Associated Press poll for the past three weeks, has only Mississippi State and ancient rival Tulane blocking its first perfect season in 60 years. The Tigers have breezed past eight opponents with comparative ease and routed Duke 50-14 last Saturday. Guides Hoped for He said he hoped the hearings would provide information to guide him in drafting proposals for new steps against improper secondary boycotting.

The committee already has heard some testimony that firms having no labor disputes at their plants sometimes have been subjected to costly special tactics from labor unions designed to force them to cease handling products of some other company with which unions were at odds.

Witnesses Announced McClellan has announced only that witnesses from New York, Texas, Nebraska, Ohio and perhaps some other areas would testify. He has not disclosed which unions are under scrutiny.
