Battle Takes Shape to Get Forestry Bill

SALT LAKE CITY, Nov. 14 (UPI)—A controversial proposal which would shape up forestry into a battle pitting cattlemen, miners, and lumber interests against conservationists and outdoormen. The battle lines were drawn Wednesday during a hearing conducted by the senate interior and insular affairs committee. Sen. James E. Eastland, D. Miss., chairman of the committee, heard testimony of 67 persons in a packed hearing room in the federal building.

Oppose Measure
More than 50 of those testifying opposed the measure on the grounds it would saddle multiple land uses on water development, provide inadequate administrative responsibility, prevent mining and gas sales, prevent mining and gas production, and limit livestock grazing on wilderness lands.

Supporters
Supporters on the other hand, argued the bill provided for orderly use of public lands, would prevent the loss of timber, and would protect the interests of communities served by the forests.

Witnesses
Witnesses from Utah, Idaho, Montana, Wyoming and North Dakota testified at the hearing. Testimony included a hearing would be held in Albuquerque, N. M., and a hearing in Salt Lake City.

Committee

Gains Against Cancer Noted By Authority

CHICAGO, Nov. 14 (UPI)—An official of the American Cancer Society has reported that approximately 800,000 persons in the United States have been cured of the disease and that present tests may cure every two cancer victims.

Mefford P. Runyon, New York, also left the door open for a society sponsored test of the control cancer drug, the organization provided the testing means "the recognized standards of the scientific community."

900,000 Are Observed.—Runyon, executive vice president of the cancer organization, said yesterday that in addition to the 800,000 survivors of cancer in America another 900,000 persons who have received treatment were undergoing five-year observation to determine if the cure has taken.

His prediction that 50 per cent success was possible hinged on the cancer organization's making the drug made available to doctors and early use of existing modern facilities.

Referring to the Krebsz controversy, Runyon said the society would like to see it settled "and the drug made available to doctors and the public if it is of value."

Approval Sought Often.—Krebsz's champion, Dr. Andrew C. Ivy, University of Illinois physician, has sought repeatedly for the society's approval of a testing.

His latest setback came last month when the group's board of directors turned down Ivy's proposal for a test with separate control groups. At that time, the board questioned the validity of such a test.

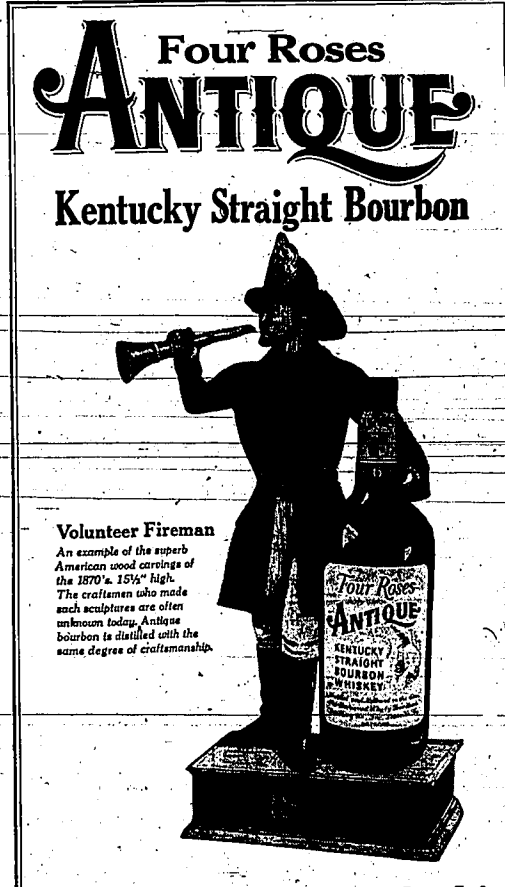
