Russia Leads U.S. in Study Of Language

The number of pupils in American schools studying any foreign language is a small fraction of the comparable Soviet statistics. The United States State Department reported today that about 12 million students in the USSR during the school year 1957-58 were enrolled in five through eighth grades in foreign-language classes. In the United States during the school year 1954-55, the latest year for which figures are available, only about 1,400,000 pupils were roughly 14,000,000 in all grades of elementary and secondary schools of the country receiving a foreign language.

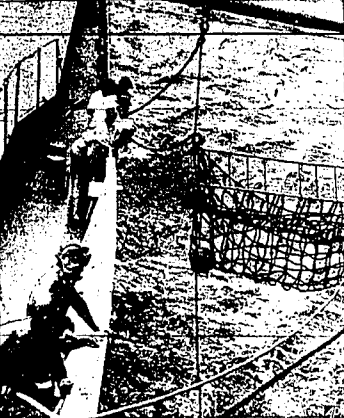
Foreign language instruction in the United States is available in 10,300 schools, the most in any country. Germany has the most foreign language instruction, with 14,000 schools. In the United States, 10,300 schools are giving instruction in 10 languages.

In the United States, in elementary and secondary schools in 1954-55, about 40,000 pupils were studying French, the second most popular language in Soviet schools, 10,300 students in 10,300 schools. In comparison, in the United States, only 1,400,000 pupils were studying in the same schools over there only a dozen secondary schools are giving instruction in Russian language instruction.

With the increased interest in Russian since Sputnik, the number of schools giving Russian language instruction has jumped this year to approximately 10,300, according to reports.

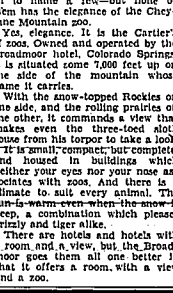
I didn't recognize Charlie, he having grown from a snarling, cuddly eight- or nine-pounder, into 475 pounds of muscle and Princeton colors.

Hagerty Says 'Leak' Given Some Writers

NEW YORK, Nov. 17 (UPI)—Presidential Press Secretary James C. Hagerty conceded last night that information to favored reporters leaked to cover President Eisenhower's health.

He spoke from Washington with French minister of information, Jacques Soustelle, in Paris, journalist, Malcolm Muggeridge in London, and Edward R. Murrow in New York.

Hagerty asked Hagerty at one point if you had your heart that you ever deliberately arranged a leak.

"Of course I can't and I wouldn't," Hagerty replied. He then declined to say more.

General Criticizes Truman, Others in Scorching Volume

NEW YORK, Nov. 17 (UPI)—The book which headed the allied forces in the China theater of operations during the second half of World War II says the Truman administration was largely to blame for the loss of China to the communists.

In a book sharply critical of United States leadership during World War II and in its immediate aftermath, Gen. Albert C. Wedemeyer says the Truman administration's reluctance to give Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek solid support in the postwar showdown with the communists.

"The Chinese government," Wedemeyer wrote in his book "Wedemeyer Reports," published today, "if assisted in establishing the internal modern Democratic state which can guarantee, would eventually have been able to progress toward the modern Democratic state which we are now trying to establish."

In a scorching volume, which leaves few leaders of the allied powers untouched by his criticism, Wedemeyer calls World War II "the war nobody won," and includes other critical appraisals.

Ordeal at Sea Is Ended OK In U.S. Prison

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 17 (UPI)—Don Cooper, 27, broke into Terminal Island federal penitentiary yesterday to end an ordeal in which his salt boat sank and he was forced to spend seven hours in cold ocean waters.

Cooper, a scientist at space technology laboratory, gave the only two life preservers in his floundering 21-foot boat to two of his three companions, then began swimming through rough seas to shore eight miles away.

He estimated he swam for two hours in the wind-swept Pacific in the darkness into Saturday night reaching a buoy, to which he clung.

Partners rescued

"I could see both," said Russell Dawkins, John Broward and Myron Owen and I fell relieved," Cooper said. "But, brother, was I cold."

Cooper said he stayed at the buoy for "three hours in 40-degree temperatures. He removed his trousers and tied them around the buoy light, hoping someone would notice the light was out and come to his aid."

"Some boats came near and I reached down and grabbed the clapper of the buoy's bell. I rang it so hard that I actually worked up a sweat, even in that cold," he said.

"Finally it started to rain and I began to swim toward Terminal Island again where I thought the coast guard station was located."

He swam for about two more hours before he splashed ashore after midnight, still exhausted on the beach. He remained there for some time before being rescued.

Official Predicts Farm Income Drop, Hike in Total U.S. Wage

WASHINGTON, Nov. 17 (UPI)—An agriculture department official said today that segments of the nation's economy except agriculture can expect significant growth in 1959.

Nathan M. Kofsky, chief of the department's farm income branch, said the total U. S. wage and salary income probably will increase about 5 percent next year—although some part of the increase may be offset by some drop in farmers' income from farmings.

Department economists have forecast a drop of five to 10 percent in farm income during 1959.

In another economic signpost, the commerce and labor departments predicted building in the United States will increase next year to a new all-time high. The construction industry often is regarded as a bellwether of the economy.

The report forecast total spending of \$23,000,000,000 on construction of all kinds in 1959, the first time such spending has passed the \$20 billion dollar mark.

"Residential building and highways will account for four-fifths of the rise over 1958, the survey said. It predicted work will begin next year on 1,200,000 new homes and apartments compared with 1,170,000 estimated for this year.

Kofsky made his predictions in a statement prepared for the 30th annual agricultural outlook—conference. The conference brings together agriculture extension workers from every state, Hawaii and Puerto Rico for a five-day meeting to discuss the national and international economic outlook, long-range agricultural trends and the immediate outlook for agriculture.

Dr. Max M. Yrizar, administrator of the foreign agricultural service, said the recent recession in the United States appeared not to spread to other countries sufficiently to slow down their purchases of U. S. farm exports.
