The project, a pioneer gas-cooled reactor, was submitted to the atomic energy commission just before expiration of a deadline fixed by congress for private industry to act.

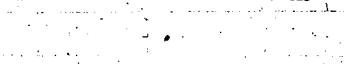

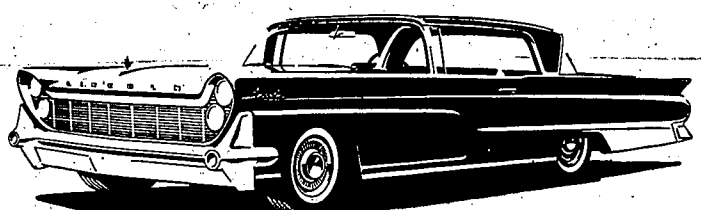

ATLANTA, Nov. 21 (UPI)—Parents of a 7-year-old girl suffering from tuberculosis of the bone have secured a court order to show cause why the child should not receive medical attention.

The parents who hold authorization for their child's medical treatment, whisked the girl out of town last week and she still has not been located. Officers said they believed she might be with relatives in Chicago.

Detective J. J. Sikes secured a subpoena Wednesday on the father, Otha Gillespie, a truck freight handler. He quoted Gillespie as saying, "I'll not in jail before I change my viewpoint."

Sikes Cause Attention

The father of the little girl, Gillespie first brought the matter to the attention of authorities.

One woman who lives next door told me they had never heard anything about anything in their life," said Sikes, who is carrying out much of the investigation through a personal interest in the case.

"The neighbor said the child's mother would say that she would like the Lord to help you and you'll be all right."

Sikes took the girl to a doctor without the parents' knowledge Sept. 20, and the diagnosis was tuberculosis of the bone.

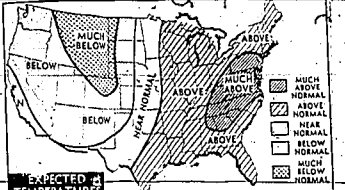

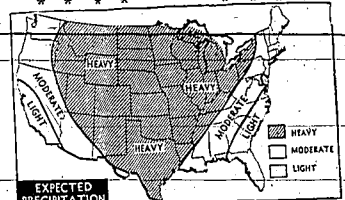
