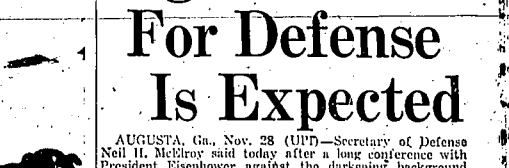

'48 Blockade Saw Line for Goods Mount

BERLIN, Nov. 28 (UPI)—The Anglo-American blockade that vaulted the city into the headlines for the 10th anniversary last night, during which it moved more than one ton of food and fuel for every one of the 2,200,000 persons living in the city.

Chinese Claim For Success Is Believed True

TOKYO, Nov. 28 (AP)—Red China claims it is winning a tight struggle and drought.

Some outside observers believe the claims are well founded. Zhou Enlai, a Japanese agricultural expert who recently returned from a visit to communist China, says the mainland is rapidly becoming "a world's leading agricultural nation at a surprisingly rapid rate."

Red China's agricultural production this year, he said, will double that of last year.

An Indian Cabinet minister, Dr. Pankaj Prasad Deshmukh, who made a five-week tour of China and Japan, also reported that many of the things the communists are saying about their "new forward" campaign in agriculture appear to be true.

Elimination of weeds, greater use of fertilizer and liberal employment of insecticides are some of the factors in the increased production, he reported.

Q. T. Irigoin, professor of agriculture and technology at Tokyo university, said the rapid agricultural development of China is being aided by irrigation and water control projects.

Thor Missiles Now Prepared To Start Duty

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28 (AP)—The Thor missile, already a useful booster for space probes, is about ready to assume its primary function as an intermediate range ballistic weapon.

Some of the missiles already have been sent to Britain, where they are to become operational next month. A Royal air force Thor missile squadron is undergoing training in this country.

Under a U. S.-British agreement signed last February, four Thor squadrons—with 15 missiles to a squadron—are to be stationed in Britain as a defense against surprise enemy attack.

The Thor, 62 feet tall and nine feet in diameter, has a designed range of more than 1,700 miles. Manufactured by Douglas Aircraft company, Santa Monica, Calif., it is 100,000-pound thrust. Rocket engine hurls the 50-ton rocket up through the Earth's atmosphere and sends the nuclear nose some 100 miles at a velocity of 10,000 miles an hour.

Since the start of the Thor flight testing program at Cape Canaveral, Fla., Jan. 27, 1957, there have been about 27 Thor launches. These included six in combination with the Vanguard rocket second stage and 21 Thor launches alone. One Thor Pioneer space probe on a 44-hour flight 79,120 miles out into space.
