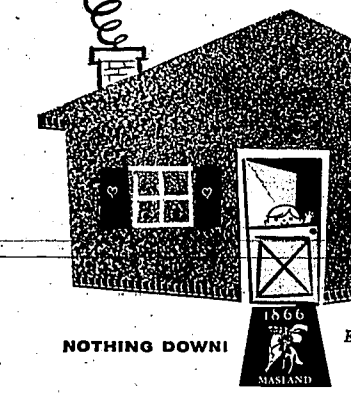

Dock Workers Around World Start Boycotts

AMSTERDAM, Dec. 1 (UPI)—Dock workers around the world began a "flap" of conferences today to discuss ways to tie up the world's shipping lanes.

The International Dockworkers Federation called the boycott at midnight to draw attention to the problem of control of government and to secure wage and working conditions on all such ships.

The federation claims seven million members in 62 nations, including the United States, where 100,000 to 200,000 dockworkers are employed.

However, not all nations will take part in the action.

Several shipping companies in different port cities obtained injunctions to prevent dockers from boycotting their ships. In other ports, the world dock unions refused to join the boycott because they were threatened to sue for compensation.

The American unions, who backed the action 100 per cent, sent out a warning to the nations to be boycotted. Picketing also was planned to prevent any worker from going on the vessels.

Union leaders said foreign ships registered their ships with the three nations involved for tax, but Costa Rica also was considered a flag of convenience but it canceled its 230 licensed vessels as of Dec. 31.

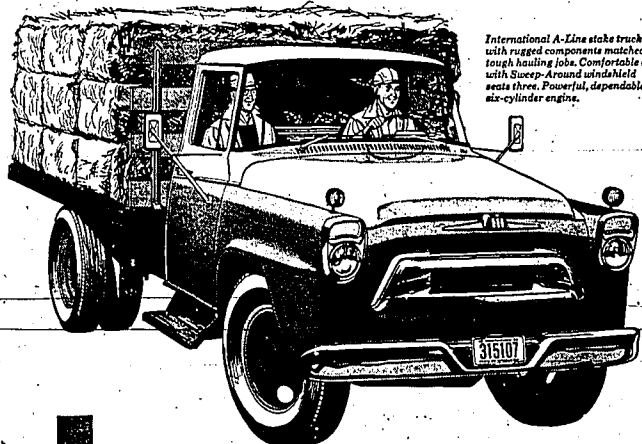

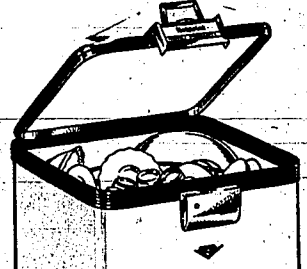
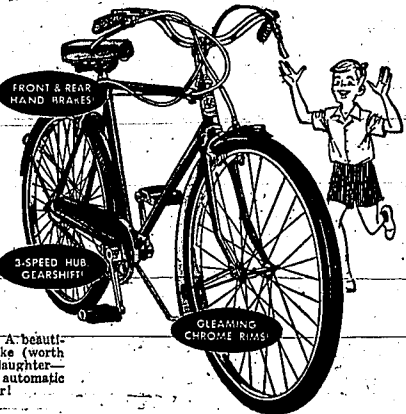

The heaviest quake, which was recorded in San Francisco, occurred about 10:30 p.m. and lasted for about 10 seconds. After shocks still continue to be felt throughout the day, seismologists in California and Nevada.

Dr. Charles F. Richter, seismologist of the California Institute of Technology, Pasadena, Calif., said the large shocks hit at 7:21 p.m. and 10:30 p.m. The damage reported was to the extent of broken windows in the Los Angeles area and cracked plaster in some homes and businesses were reported in Los Angeles.

Dr. Richter said the center of the quake was in the San Francisco Bay area, a rich agricultural area lying inland from the ocean about 100 miles and extending north to San Francisco. A series of quakes noted this area in 1940, causing at least eight deaths and millions of dollars damage.

New State Auditor Has Plans To Get Accounting Equipment

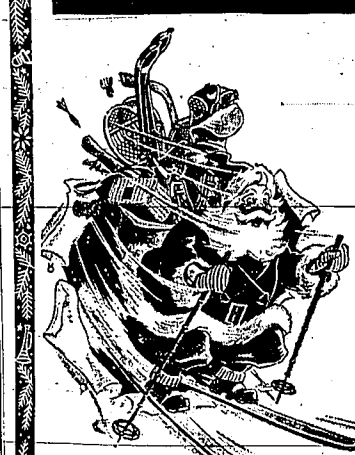
