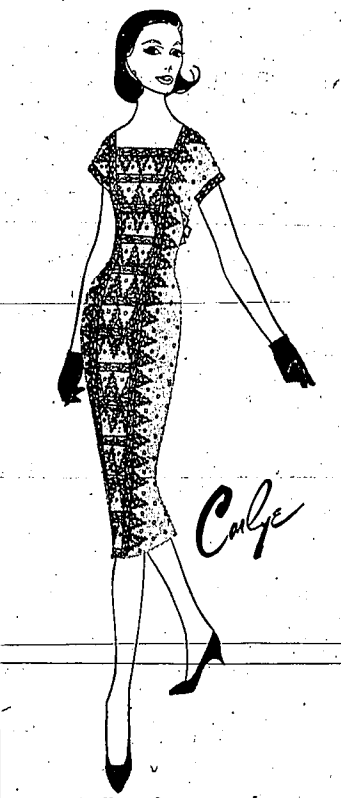

### New Portable Reactors Will Last 3 Years

**IDAHO FALLS, Dec. 2 (AP)**—The first test run of an out-of-the-ordinary type of the South Pole, the new low power reactor may be used to give you all the heat and electricity you need, and it's portable.

Weights 25,000 Pounds

You can't carry it in your car, but you can ship it. It weighs 25,000 pounds, but you can ship it down, ship it up, and let it run for three years with hardly any attention.

As little as 100 horsepower is required to run the reactor, as compared with the 10,000 horsepower of a steam boiler. The reactor is made with an eye for the future. It is designed to run on a fuel system which will give you all the heat and electricity you need, and it's portable.

Reason Explained

The reason the water is necessary to run the reactor is that it keeps the reactor cool. If you have a "dry" reactor, you are not knowing down of neutrons and hence no more fission.

The Argonne National Laboratory, near Chicago, has developed this reactor. It is designed this reactor, which is the first of its kind, to be used in the atomic energy program.

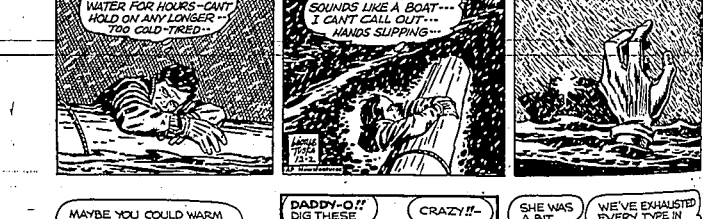

# Drivers With Emotional Maladjustment Should Be Barred, Safety Expert Claims

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 2—Drivers whose records indicate emotional maladjustment should be removed from the road until a medical authority certifies their mental stability, one of the nation's leading traffic safety specialists told some 40 Rotarians here today.

Marland K. Bireser, Pacific Coast association of casualty and surety companies, said a "significantly dangerous group emotionally maladjusted persons constitutes a working menace to our safety on the highways that we cannot continue to tolerate."

"They must have their driving privileges withdrawn completely until such time as they show evidence of correction of their emotional problems. This must be required just as a medical certificate is required from a person showing evidence of a physical problem."

"Such a forward step will require rare personal fortitude," the speaker admitted, "for there are those who will say I am suggesting a state psychosis on a grand scale, which is ridiculous."

"If anything in our society is tragically failing, it is the highways so far to bar from the highways the mixed up people who have, for example, the following records:

"1. A woman was convicted of assault with a deadly weapon when she tried to kill her husband with an automobile.

"2. A high school senior who had driven successfully for two years had a series of arrests for moving violations and misdemeanors. He was a non-athletic and his driving problem started only when his sophomore brother became a high school football star.

"3. One problem driver has a record of more than 40 traffic convictions over a period of years during which time he suffered the usual fines, suspensions and revocations.

"4. A driver, somewhat under the influence, made five attempts to run down a police officer.

"5. A young driver stopped on a railroad track to prove that he was not "chicken." The engineer was forced to bring the train to a complete stop.

"6. A young lady committed 17 moving violations in a wild early morning chase by traffic officers in a large city. She had quarreled with

her boy friend whose car she was introducing a red herring that will prolong the day when we must face the real problem."

Bireser said that, while true traffic safety can be achieved only through a rounded program in various important fields, one of the most promising areas of effective action is driver licensing—which can eliminate maladjusted drivers from the highway before another unnecessary accident.

"We have learned to build roads that virtually eliminate engineering barriers to safe driving."

"We have learned, through crash injury research, the means of creating an environment for human survival in the face of almost total destruction of the vehicle."

"But the catalyst that unites the elements that result in a traffic accident is still and always will be the man behind the wheel. We can license him, educate him, enforce him, analyze him and, to use up-to-the-minute terminology, 'improve him.' But with all this attention, there still remains a large group of drivers who fail to act in a responsible manner behind the wheel at all times.

"For many of these people their failure is due to the fact that they are psychologically maladjusted persons. We cannot justify the continued use of the highways by these emotionally irresponsible people merely by requiring evidence that they can pay for the damages they inflict. Financial responsibility is no genuine substitute for emotional responsibility. This serves only to

introduce a red herring that will prolong the day when we must face the real problem."

Bireser said his association espoused what he called a "rotating-attached safety. We don't fight for any particular approach or kind of a driver licensing. We are for whatever will work, and after studying this traffic safety problem since the advent of the automobile we know what has and will work. We can also spot the gimmicks and those who are ever ready to trade on safety."

Bireser reminded that auto insurance companies had lost hundreds of millions of dollars since the end of World War II, despite some rate increases. He said the only way these trends will be reversed is to cut down on the accidents.

"Safety has most often, during the past 40 years, suffered from chronic indecision and political neglect. Today, our greatest need in safety is more boldness and much more honesty."

"We will have to be both honest and bold to put the crackpots off the road, but they are going to continue to kill as long as we permit them," he added.

"I guess we were lit away that broke the camel's back," he declared.

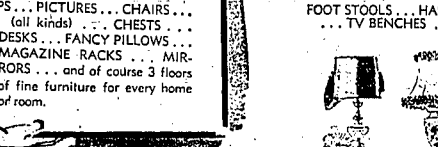

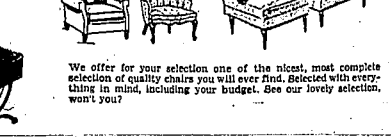

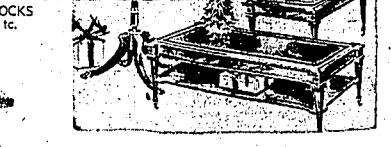
