High Acreage Yields Push 1958 Crops' Production to Record High, Says Report

WASHINGTON, Dec. 18 (AP)—Crop production this year reached an all-time high—11.1 per cent larger than the previous record. Reporting this yesterday in its final crop estimate for the year, the agriculture department said high yields per acre were mainly responsible as the harvested acreage was the third lowest in over 20 years. All crop production was estimated at 118 per cent of the 1947-48 average.

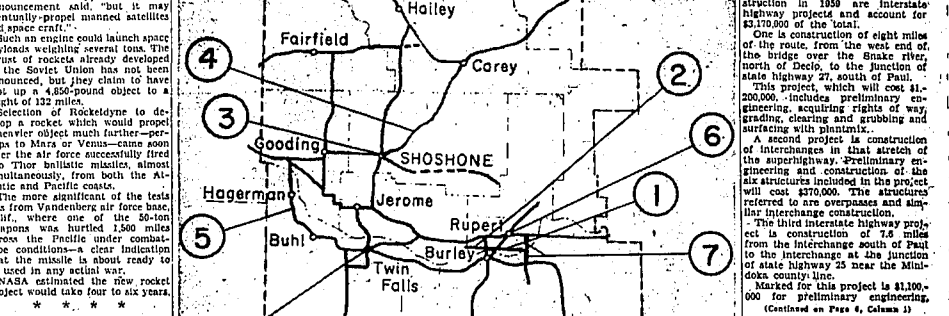

\$4,671,000 in Highway Projects Are Okayed for Magic Valley Next Year

WASHINGTON, Dec. 18 (AP)—The state highway department today announced that it has approved \$4,671,000 worth of highway projects for 1959. The projects are included in a summary of the state's 1959 highway program which was released today. In addition, three county projects, totaling \$350,000, carried over from the 1957-58 budgets, and \$17,400 worth of proposed betterment or minor construction for Magic Valley, are included in the program. Also approved are preliminary engineering and right-of-way acquisition on \$20,806,000 worth of highway projects in the district, and reconnaissance surveys on \$6,500,000 worth of proposed projects. The major portion of all highway work authorized in the program is in the interstate highway system. Three projects approved for construction in 1959 are interstate highway projects and total \$3,100,000 in the amount.

Highway Projects Approved



Eight highway construction projects totaling \$4,671,000 have been approved by the state highway department in district 2 (Magic Valley) for 1959. In addition, three county projects, totaling \$350,000, carried over from the 1957-58 budgets, and \$17,400 worth of proposed betterment or minor construction for Magic Valley, are included in the program. Also approved are preliminary engineering and right-of-way acquisition on \$20,806,000 worth of highway projects in the district, and reconnaissance surveys on \$6,500,000 worth of proposed projects. The major portion of all highway work authorized in the program is in the interstate highway system. Three projects approved for construction in 1959 are interstate highway projects and total \$3,100,000 in the amount.

The project will cost \$1,200,000, including preliminary engineering, acquiring rights of way, grading, clearing, grubbing and surfacing with plantings. The White House staged the first of two dinners for the heads of 83 of the 78 nations last night. There were 10 "extra" men and Ambassadors Menshikov was one of them.

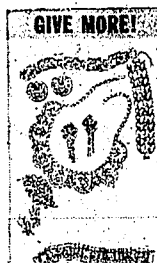

Missionary Back From Tibet Says That Abominable Snowmen Are Nude Priests

REGENSBURG, Germany, Dec. 18 (UPI) — A German missionary of the "abominable snowmen" of the Himalayas are really native priests living in the icy wilderness of a nearly inaccessible mountain range.

The missionary, the Rev. Franz Schöner, reported he had photographed one of the priests. The picture has been published in the official organ of the Roman Catholic Episcopate of Regensburg which said it was the first authentic photograph of an "abominable snowman," the newspaper, the Regensburger Anzeiger (Regensburg diocese newspaper) published Father Eich-

inger's story of his meeting with one of the priests nine years ago on a trip through a desolate mountain range. The headline on the story was "meeting with the snowman of the Himalayas."

Father Eichinger described the priest as a primitive human being living in the nude in the sub-zero temperatures and wearing a crude breech cloth only when he approached travelers.

"In a way which we cannot understand, they are immune from the influences of nature and the needs of human life," Father Eichinger said.

The picture published by the newspaper showed the snowman in a cloth with wild hair and eyes

toprograph what the natives call a "nude Lanna."

"We were living near the tent of the 'Prince of the Thousand' (chief of the tribe)."

"One morning, a torn flax tent was standing next to ours, on a spot where the evening before only ice and snow had been covering the frozen ground. The temperature had fallen to 22 centigrade below zero (-8 F.)."

"In the light of the rising sun, a human being as never seen before was standing in front of the tent."

"A thin, torn rag was hanging from his otherwise bare body. This was his only covering. He was wearing fur coats. I was told he only wears the rag when it is very cold."

"I fetched my camera immediately. But the stranger did not want to be photographed. I asked the always helpful Prince of the

thousand to negotiate permission, but the prince refused under some pretext."

"He said later the nomads had called in the stranger to help cure some members of the tribe who had fallen ill and told his benediction was necessary. The nomads told the snowman the priest was a medical expert. In exchange for medicine the snowman permitted himself to be photographed."

"But he covered his eyes because he made it known that the eyes had only been given to him so he could look at the heavens and respond to the looks of suffering humans," the priest said.

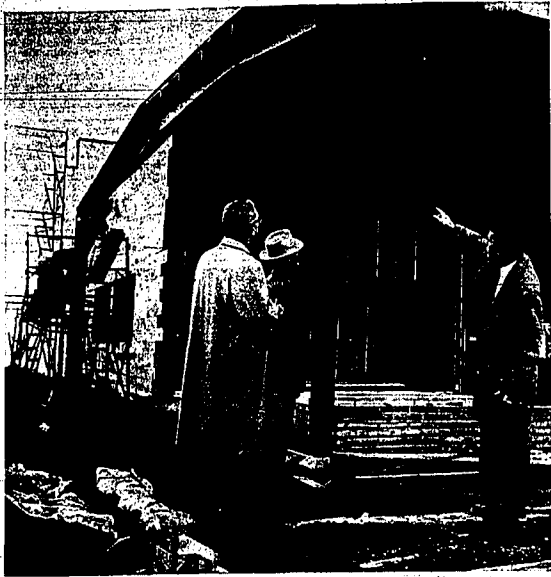

The 50-million-dollar program brings to 615 million the amount spent by Sears since World War II to build new retail and mail order plants, the firm said.

New stores to replace existing facilities will be built in the following communities, among others: Longview and Plainview, Texas; Honolulu, T. H.; Idaho Falls, and Ogden, Utah. A smaller store will be built in Dallas-Pleasant Grove, Texas.

46 Catalogue Offices Planned

In addition, 46 new catalogue sales offices will open in 1959.

Sears currently operates 728 retail stores, 11 mail order plants and 840 catalogue sales offices. The number of square feet of selling space has doubled since 1946, company officials said.

Sales for fiscal 1957 topped 33,600,000,000.

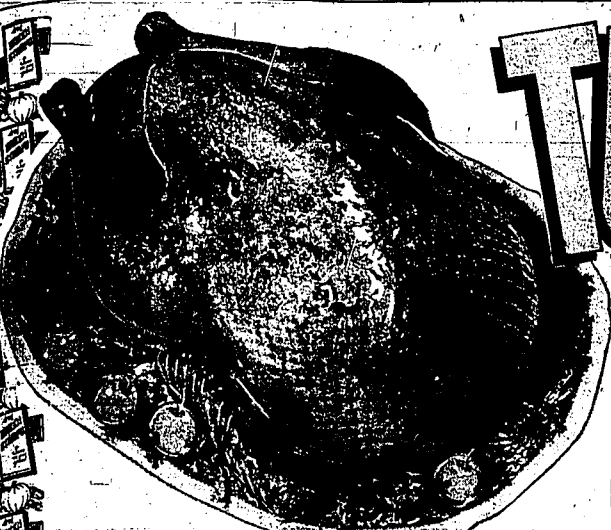

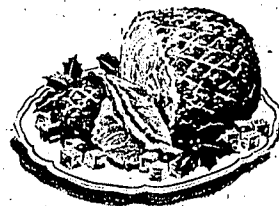

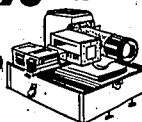

Some Grocery Stores Having Gobbler Buys

By The Associated Press
Housewives who can't decide when to buy Christmas turkey won't get much help from supermarket and grocery store advertisements this week.

Some stores offer gobblers now while others will unveil their special prices early next week. For housewives who don't want turkey there are special bargains on pork loin, ham, beef, lamb and chicken. Items such as rock cornish hen and Minnesota goose. The shopper who wants to save a bit now can prepare for next week can usually find chuck roast.

Lamb prices are four cents a pound lower in some areas this week while other meats are about unchanged. Eggs reversed trend and rose two to eight cents a dozen over a wide area. Bumper supplies of soybean oil, cottonseed oil, peanut oil and corn will have pushed shortening prices down to their lowest levels since January, 1958.

Department of agriculture says supplies of winter vegetables will be substantially greater than last year, assuming more normal weather, particularly in Florida.

Canned vegetable supplies will be slightly larger than last season and frozen, however, will be considerably above the average of recent years.

Outstanding vegetable buys this week are potatoes, radishes, fopped beets, turnips and rutabagas. Good buys are sweet corn, eggplant, endive, escarole, sweet potatoes, spinach and Idaho potatoes.

Many cabbage prices rose sharply this week, but still were rated a good buy as are onions.

Apples are at bargain levels. Florida citrus is moderately priced despite the annual moratorium on shipments, a move designed to clear abundant supplies on hand early in the season. Limes and avocados are reasonable, along with California citrus and northwest pears.

Violent Khrushchev Attacks Show He Still Has Opposition

The violence of Nikita Khrushchev's attack in Moscow on the "anti-party group" indicates he still is encountering strong opposition within the Communist party.

Khrushchev is not given to flogging dead horses. He is now sounding off with a more detailed indictment of the views and policies of Georgi Malenkov, V. M. Molotov, L. M. Kaganovich, Dmitri Shepilov and Nikolai Bulganin, he must have good reason.

It looks as if there are many Soviet communist who in one or another degree share the dim views of the radical changes in the Soviet system which Khrushchev is making.

Khrushchev defeated this group decisively in June, 1951. He ousted them from leadership and either exiled them to the remote provinces or else expelled them from public life.

In Moscow currently the Central committee of the Communist party

is meeting to prepare the way for a new congress of the party. This new congress at the end of January will elect a new Central committee.

Therefore, this is a time for political jockeying—and this is what Khrushchev by his blast against the opposition is doing. He is attributing to its members all of the most unpopular agricultural policies of the last decade in the USSR.

There is some measure of justice in this since there is no doubt some members of the "anti-party" group—in particular Molotov and Kaganovich—have all along taken a thoroughly negative attitude toward any changes in the pre-1953 system of management of agriculture. But the only possible reason for bringing

this up at this particular time is political.

It seems to suggest that not only does an opposition to Khrushchev continue to exist but also that it is somewhat stronger than most observers of the Soviet scene inside and outside Moscow have previously considered.

By removing his leading opponents from public office Khrushchev has apparently managed to make the resistance lose its overt leadership, but he has apparently not destroyed the resistance to his reforms.
