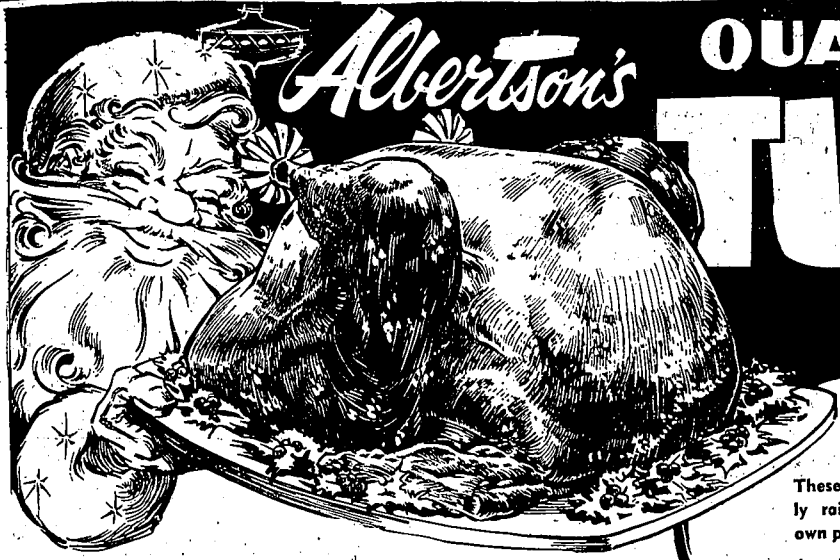

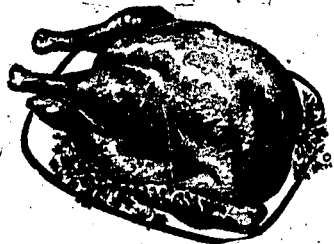

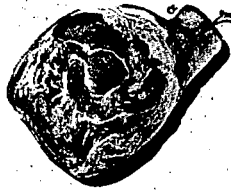

The radio and TV stations increased their news coverage by from 100 to 200 per cent which was happening in the Berlin area—and how negotiations on the strike were going.

But in subway, buses and trains, most New Yorkers sat grim-faced and bored, some of their neighbors for the first time in years, and missing very much the distributed each day in the city.

What show or movie to see? What Christmas presents to buy? What TV show to watch? These were some of the questions that were answered.

One enterprising department store went as far as to have printed sheets stapled on subway train windows reading: "There may be no newspapers, but there still are bargains at S. Klein's."

Other retailers bought time on radio TV stations—where time was available—to get their sales messages across. With the Christmas shopping season on the buyers were in the stores, but without sales to guide them they did not know where things were and what was on sale. Mail and telephone orders fell sharply.

The producers of a new play, "The Quaker," which opened during the strike, found it difficult to get TV time and read the reviews that newspaper critics had written but never printed.

The big Broadway hits were not affected, since they are usually sold out months in advance. Radio announcements turned to radio announcements.

TV stations stopped their own shows. TV Guide was quickly sold out throughout the city.

Newspapers like the World-Telegram and Sun used radio announcements to keep their readers and to remind them of what they were missing by missing the paper.

This New York Times, only paper with its own radio station, increased its news coverage by sending reporters from correspondents overseas and in Washington and other U.S. cities.

NEW YORK, Dec. 22—The paper part Sunday in an hour-long special issue in New York and Washington announced the names of the winners of the Pulitzer prizes.

WHEN—A leading independent station, which had been known to Columbia like Bob Condit and Charles Condit, read the paper to the column that never saw print in New York.

It was the only group that benefited from the strike was the city's sanitation men. With their members, the trash-baskets of New York were a lot emptier.

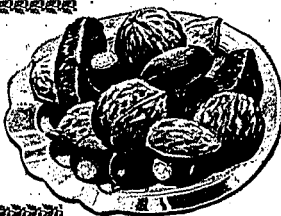

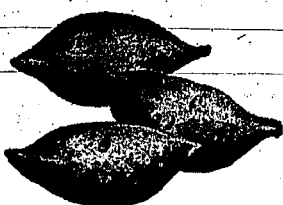

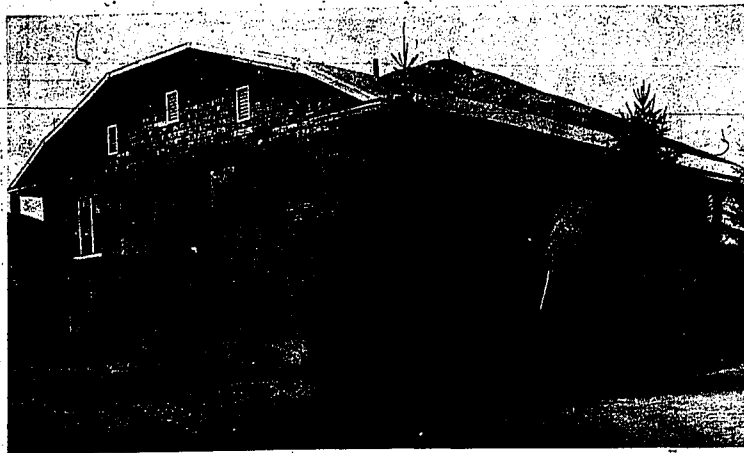

WASHINGTON, Dec. 22 (UPI)—Statements from northern and southern senators made clear today that a major civil rights battle is shaping for the new congress.

The northerners predicted the administration would call for more civil rights legislation and advocated federal action to help Southern states ease racial tensions.

Fillibuster Curb Doubled

Sen. Paul Douglas, D. Ill., called for federal action to free the South's "very able men for constructive service in solving racial problems."

Specifically mentioned Sen. Russell Long, D. La., and Richard B. Russell, D. Ga.

He said he would introduce legislation aimed at bringing about a more equal distribution of federal money to the nation. The bill would create a voluntary racial relations commission.

More Power Predicted

Sen. Clifford Case, R. N. J., said he expected the administration to call for extension of the life of the civil rights commission and strengthening of the justice department's power to file in civil rights violation cases. He said the administration also might call for an anti-bombing bill.

Sen. James O. Eastland, D. Miss., predicted efforts to curb the Senate filibuster rule would have little chance of success and advocated voluntary relocation of southern Negroes to northern states.

He was what the senators said in statements and radio and television interviews.

Dec. 22 (UPI)—After that when he came to British Columbia from eastern Canada 18 months ago, everyone told him the water was too cold for frogmen. He said he planned his swim down the Fraser to prove that there was a future for frogmen here.

Wealth Test

"Nowhere in the world are there bigger mammals, bigger logs, bigger woods, sharks or crabs than off the British Columbia coast," he said. "The water is too cold for us, but the minerals and food, but we know nothing about them. We have never seen them."

When asked what was the worst thing about his swim—the cold, the ice or the rapids, Journaux replied with another question:

"Would you rather be shot by a shotgun, hit by a cannonball or run over by a steamroller?"
