City officials in reply to questions about sidewalk construction, the highway men pointed out the state contractor assumes responsibility for sidewalk work except where it involves deepening sidewalks. J. H. LaFolore, city manager, suggested two methods for completing sidewalks in the improvement district, requiring signatures of 60 per cent of owners who are allowing the contractor to contract the work as a group. The latter course would be desirable, LaFolore stated, if the property owners would all agree on the project. Curbs and gutters will be included in the highway department phase of the work, Olney stated. He said the raised curb allowing for right turn movements at intersections will be from Fifth points east, 250 feet east from Blue Lake boulevard to Ash street; at Locust street, 250 feet in each direction; at Eastland drive, 200 feet on the west side and past the cemeteries on the east.  "We were interested to learn what the pamphlet written by Dr. Wilkinson (Ernest L. Wilkinson, president of Brigham Young university and administrator of the church's board of education) said about Rexburg and for that reason planned to attend the meeting in Rigby," said Matson.
 "We were certainly surprised to learn that instructions enclosed in the Wilkinson pamphlet instructed the Rigby officers to limit the meeting to church members and we were denied admittance."
 Permission Denied
 The Rexburg chamber had asked permission to allow a Rexburg representative to present the Rexburg side of the case, he said, but this was denied.
 Wilkinson explained that meetings held in 10 LDS church stakes, the meetings were conducted in church stakes in the Ricks college district at Rexburg, and dealt with the transfer of the school to Idaho Falls, he said.
 Dr. Wilkinson said it is "normal procedure with LDS church procedure to restrict the meetings to the president, bishops and officers of the stake in which the meeting is being held."

Helen Traubel Regrets Acting As Margaret Truman Adviser

NEW YORK, Dec. 24 (U.S. Press)—Helen Traubel says her three years as Margaret Truman's singing adviser cost her stature "in the eyes of the musical world for ever having my name connected with such a quaint soprano."

"If a republishing consideration of her memoirs appearing in the January issue of the Ladies' Home Journal, the former Metropolitan opera star says she consented to the adviser's role to help when she found the girl's voice 'inexperienced and really rather bad.'"

"My first, greatest and unquerable difficulty with Margaret's voice was simply keeping her on

neither her pupil nor her protégée, she insists—with a definite understanding that Margaret would not appear in public concerts for at least five years.

Soon, however, Miss Truman had signed for some concert appearances, and a reluctant Miss Traubel was persuaded to backstop her.

After the first few concerts, however, Miss Traubel appealed to President Truman, reminding him of the agreement about five years of study, and the remainder of the concert series was canceled.

"Then," she says, "Miss Truman signed for a series of radio broadcasts but after a 'hammer and anvil' argument, gave those up too. In the fall of 1935, Miss Traubel withdrew completely. Her husband and manager, William Bass, telephoned President Truman at the White House to tell him of Miss Traubel's decision, and Truman terminated the conversation by slam-

ming down the telephone, Miss Traubel reports.

Before that, President Truman's paternal interest in Margaret's career caught headlines when he wrote a highly seasoned letter to a Washington music critic, Paul Hume.

"After he had written his famous note to the music critic who had dared say that Margaret had little talent," Miss Traubel writes, "he confided to me, 'I should never have written that letter. But now it will stand by itself!'"

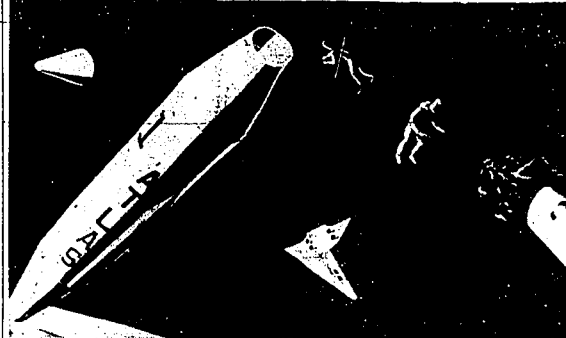

We'd All Live Better if Russ, U. S. Were to Bury Hatchets

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24 (AP)—Americans and Russians on the same day this week got a little notice in their Christmas stockings. It was an announcement by both their governments on how much they expect to spend next year.

There was the one lesson to be learned, above all others, from the announcements.

If the two countries could learn to trust each other and stop their fantastic armaments race—running into billions upon billions of dollars—people in both countries could live better because their taxes would go down and they'd have more money.

By a coincidence of history these things happened on the same day. President-Eisenhower said his

budget for the next fiscal year, beginning July 1, would call for spending 77 billion dollars but he expected to get in the same amount in taxes, thus balancing the budget.

Therefore, he said, there will be no call for a general tax increase.

In Moscow, with Premier Nikita Khrushchev nodding approval in the background, Finance Minister Arseny G. Zverev pledged to boost the government's spending for industry, scientific research and social welfare next year. And he added, there would be no direct new taxes.

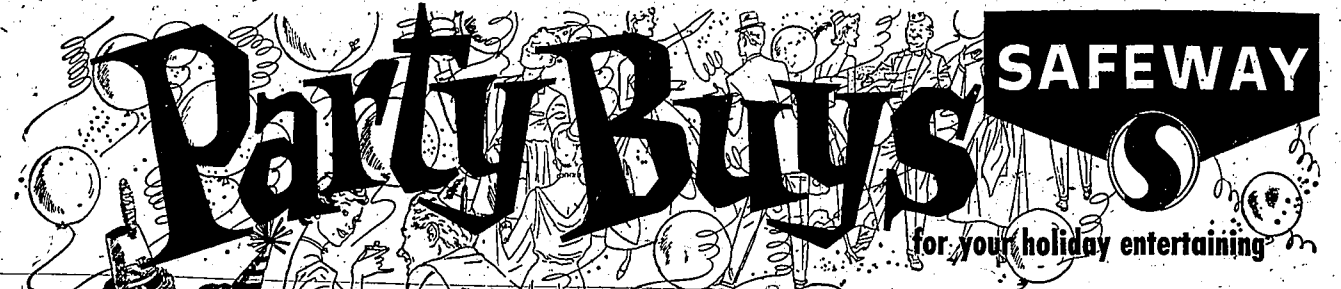

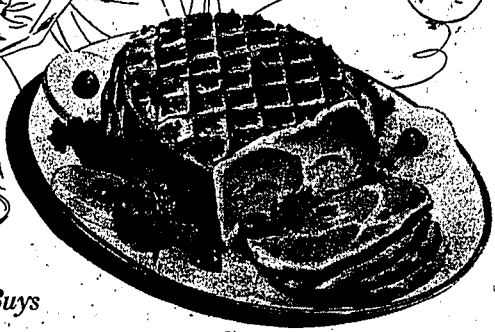
