Race for Space Named Biggest '58 News Story

By The Associated Press

The race into space, clinched by the launching of the mighty four-ton American satellite that apparently gave the United States the lead over Russia, was the big news story of 1958.

It was the second year in a row that space and missiles—those thrilling and chilling harbingers of a hopeful and menacing future—were the top choice of the nation's news editors in the annual Associated Press poll.

But, while the stories covered the same field, there was a significant difference.

Last year, the page one headlines recorded spectacular Russian successes and the American frustrations. The Russians indeed were the space leaders in 1957.

This year, however, American successes far outweighed the failures while announcements of important satellite launches followed behind the Iron Curtain were few and far between.

The first launch was launched by the air force Dec. 18, by far the biggest instrument carrying satellite yet fired, much larger than the Russians' Sputnik III, which weighed 11,000 lbs.

In addition to the monster Atlas the United States fired three satellites and Explorer satellites and the Navy added a tiny 60-pound Vanguard, which may stay up 200 days.

Some of the American failures proved spectacular. The air force's Pioneer moonshot in October failed to reach the moon but it fired the world's heaviest satellite by rising 70,000 miles, man's farthest penetration into space.

The big development in the missile field was the first successful launching of an American intercontinental ballistic missile, an air force Atlas, which soared more than 6,000 miles into the Atlantic, giving the United States a powerful new weapon for its preponderant arsenal.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 26 (UPI)—Food markets, in this between-holiday week-end, are prepared to adapt to a wide variety of food shoppers needs whichever you're filling-in around the left-overs for Christmas or in the market for more substantial fare.

Turkeys are the big feature, with prices still unusually attractive to buyers. If you prefer a change, look to pork—prices are coming down, as marketings increase.

Fruit counters still offer a colorful, crowded array. Leading the list are apples and various citrus fruits—lemons, oranges and grapefruit.

Two staple items—potatoes and cabbage—are top attractions at the vegetable counters. Check lettuce and celery, too, for good buys.

Among the list offerings, you'll find good buys in canned tuna, shrimp and luncheon.

Those are the highlights of the national picture. Now, here's what the situation looks like in the West—(Arizona, California, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, Washington and Wyoming).

Beef, pork and poultry are in good supply in food markets, but price changes are few and consumers will have to shop carefully to find their best buys. Supplies of calf, veal and lamb are adequate.

Egg prices are slightly higher this week in the Northwest and Los Angeles area, but one to two cents a dozen lower in the San Francisco area. Ample supplies of butter are unchanged in price.

Fresh fruits and vegetables in plentiful supply include apples, avocados, grapefruit, small oranges, tangerines, cabbage, cauliflower, celery, lettuce and tomatoes. In good supply are lemons, winter pears, broccoli, carrots, onions, green beans and squash.

Best fish buys are fish sticks, salmon, dugoneese crabs, crabfish, and spiny lobster.

New Program For Wheat Is Getting Study

WASHINGTON, Dec. 25 (AP)—The new program for wheat has been approved by the committee on agriculture of the House of Representatives. It would extend the price support program and reduce price supports and acreage control until the program is terminated.

The plan has been considered such a plan has been considered with another that would greatly increase production controls and price supports to a lesser extent. This latter plan would be approved until the surplus were reduced.

The plan has \$1.25 Price per bushel. The wheat support would be reduced to around 75 percent of parity compared to the present minimum of 75 percent. A support would be around 75 percent of parity with the present support.

The plan is a standard for measuring farm prices. It is designed to farm prices to their cost.

Under the tightened control plan, the acreage of wheat would be cut from the present 55 million acres minimum to around 40 million acres.

No Indication Made

Administration farm leaders have not yet indicated what they will recommend to Congress. Legislation will be required for either approach.

Under the plan that would end acreage control, the surplus would be used to export programs financed largely by the government. None of the surplus would be permitted to move to domestic markets or into regular export channels.

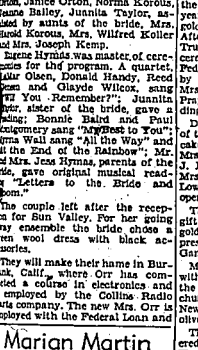

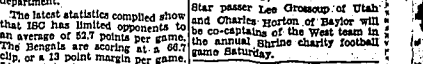
