BOISE, Feb. 4 (AP)—Gov. Robert E. Smylie asked the Idaho legislature today to give big out-of-state investors a tax break. "Idaho is obliged to import capital. This is not a matter of choice," the governor declared in a major message delivered to both chambers. Unless tax laws are changed, Smylie warned, "many prime sources of investment can be sure asked along that the legal-consumption of alcoholic liquor. 

#### GOP SELF-EXAMINATION

Like any defeated political organization, the Republican party has been almost continuously in the threes of self-examination since the last election. In the recent Des Moines meeting this inward look produced some sharp clashes over the issue of the GOP's difficulties.

Both President Eisenhower and Vice President Nixon told the party it has to make a better, steadier effort between elections if it wants to be rewarded at the polls.

Rep. Richard Simpson of Pennsylvania snapped back that the White House could well follow this advice itself, saying the party needed to understand what it stood for so it could present a clearer image to the people.

In large measure a dispute of this sort represents a cleavage between liberal and conservative viewpoints within Republican ranks. Probably this gap is not going to be closed any more than are the northern-southern differences of the Democrats likely to be re-

The one distinction is that with all their problems the Democrats are winning, while the Republicans are not. The latter have won just two of seven presidential elections from 1932 on, and two of 14 congressional elections in the same period.

The two presidential victories were of course Mr. Eisenhower's. One of the congressional triumphs came in 1946, reflecting the voters' accumulated postwar gripes, and the other came narrowly in 1952 at the time of the President's initial success.

The record strongly suggests, then, that the GOP has not had a real grip on the voters' hearts and minds for a long time.

Today's arguments, naturally, go to the matter of why. Yet a detached onlooker, listening to the give and take, must fairly say that most of it has been said before, some of it, in fact, more than 20 years ago.

is very possible that the self-examina tion has not dug deep enough. This is a task only the Republicans can perform for themselves. Painful as it may be, they must realize in 1959 the penalty for not digging out the truth. It is written in the dismal statistics of their election showings for the past two and a half decades.

#### REASONS FOR DOUBT

We have no business being glib, overconfident or boastful about our standing in the missile-space race with the Soviet union. On the other hand, we don't have to swallow Russian claims whole, either.

There is good reason to doubt, for instance that when the Russians fired the missile which they said went into orbit around the

sun the project went according to plan.

The eager propagandists in the Soviet
union's Washington embassy may have tipped the mitt. Their initial news release was sprinkled with many references to the rocket as having embarked on a "preplotted course toward the moon "

And, as everybody remembers, the Russians this\_stage were calling their newest\_shot "lunik."

Only when they realized the rocket was going to bypass the moon by several thousand miles did they start trumpeting about their marvelous "satellite of the sun."

A good many scientists didn't swallow this and evidently with good reason. The odds would seem to be very heavily against their claim that a "sun shot" was really their original and only purpose.

The chief reason they're pretty sure of this lies beyond the published evidence of Soviet intent. It is simply that firing a rocket out into the wilds of space requires great thrust-ing power but little else. And the world already has seen ample demonstration of Russian proficiency in this regard.

To put a missile into orbit around the moon, however, calls for a high degree of precision in electronic control. Only with such guidance can a rocket be deliberately placed in orbit around an object spinning

220,000 miles distant from the earth. Our scientists and missile men believe we are considerably ahead of Russia in the matter of guidance, and may yet be first to succeed in the delicate task of making a moon

#### shot effective. FINANCIAL EQUALIZER
