That was nearly two months ago. Yesterday the San Mateo county grand jury indicted the driver, Earl A. Johnson, 34, and Garfield Hammond on charges of narcotics violation.

ST. PAUL, Minn., March 4 (AP)—Minnesota's presidential primary election, widely credited with launching Dwight D. Eisenhower's successful campaign for the presidency in 1952, was abolished yesterday by the Minnesota legislature.

A bill removing the primary law from state statutes was passed by the house without debate. It already had received approval Gov. Orville Freeman. It is expected to sign the measure.

Minnesota gave Eisenhower an astounding write-in vote in the state's first primary in 1952 and in 1956. Sen. Estes Kefauver, D-Tenn., was defeated by Eisenhower, who officially endorsed Democratic candidate. The primary law was enacted in 1949.

PORTLAND, March 4 (AP)—The Pacific Northwest Power Coordinating committee yesterday urged study of a plan which would intertie the electric power systems of the three West coast states.

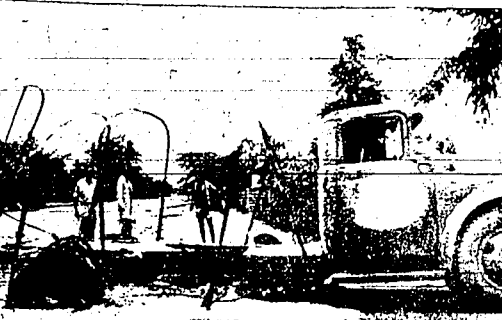
The committee was organized as an outgrowth of a plan announced last January in San Francisco for Bonneville Power administration to sell its excess power to California utilities.

Owen Ford, Kennecott, Wash., is chairman of the committee.

Ford said after the meeting that there was a growing supply of excess power in the Northwest for which an immediate and profitable market could be found in California. He said that an intertie also could result in firming up Pacific Northwest power supplies from the south in times of shortage.

The committee voted to testify at the congressional hearing on the intertie plan before the Senate committees on interior and interior affairs and public works next week.

"Why do people laugh at fat men? What's so funny about them?"

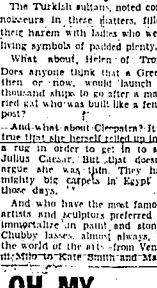

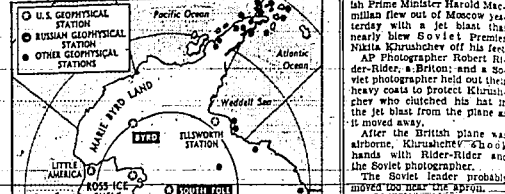

Many Letters Blast Solons' Hiring of Kin

WASHINGTON, March 4 (UPI)—A flood of letters are writing to congress to protest against members putting relatives on their payrolls. But congress over the years has become accustomed to this practice and doesn't plan to do it up.

Despite criticism stirred by recent publicity of politicians, a bill to root out a single member congress on far has introduced legislation for the lawbreaking relatives for their office staffs.

Any lawmaker who did sponsor such legislation would find himself unpopular with many of his colleagues.

Many Hire Kin
The available evidence indicates that at least one out of every seven members—possibly a much higher percentage—have employed relatives. Senate Dir. John J. Blumenthal's brother, Sam Houston Johnson, has worked on his staff for many years.

Twenty-three years ago a house member sponsored a bill to bar members from employing relatives on their office staff. It was called before a house committee to explain it to the Senate. The committee members berated the congressman as a publicity seeker.

Letters Not Ignored
Nevertheless the House and Senate are not receiving as many letters as they should be. House members are expected to have a bill to show each of the 436 members of the House a letter a year, boosting maximum individual payrolls over the \$50,000 mark.

Now the measure is being deflected into the storm blow over some members fear it may be scuttled altogether.

Some of the sharpest barbs from the writers are directed at Steven V. Carter, freshman Democrat from Iowa who in January paid his 16-year-old son on the payroll at \$11,872, although he was taking part-time classes as a college freshman.

Salaries Compared
The wife of a serviceman stationed at Boulder City, La., wrote Carter to complain that her husband gets only about \$1 an hour for defending the country.

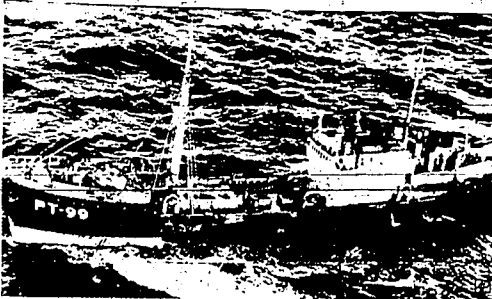

Ike Thinks Balanced Budget Is Best Answer for Inflation

WASHINGTON, March 4 (UPI)—How can Uncle Sam finance his record national debt without incurring a fiscal crisis or fueling the inflation he hopes to avoid? President Eisenhower and his cabinet members are looking for answers on money matters.

He was unquestionably thinking of the present reluctance of many people to have through-inflation in government securities (treasury I.O.U.'s) and (2) the push of money into the stock market.

Anderson and other administration policymakers have made the balanced budget a major article of faith because they believe even a small deficit would do great harm.

Eight now, because lenders are motivated by fear of rising interest rates and inflation, the treasury is to do more active borrowing for short terms.

Long-term loans generally are much less attractive because smaller proportion of long-term money is provided by the banks. Bank credit means inflation of the money supply.

Since last July, the treasury has gotten only one loan which comes due in more than five years. It borrowed \$85 million dollars in January on a 14-year bond priced to yield 4.67 per cent interest.

Interest on the debt now totals more than eight billion dollars a year and is second only to defense as the largest single category of federal spending.

The administration wants to hold a snapshoot over the interest-calling—however, if the treasury has to continue relying on short term loans, and sees real trouble ahead, an increase may be requested.

Another suggestion is to have the federal reserve system peg the price of government securities at pre-determined levels. When prices fall below the level the reserve system would buy; if prices rose, it would sell.

While this would increase confidence in the stability of bond prices, it might also touch off an inflationary rise in bank credit if the federal reserve were forced to buy vast amounts of treasury securities.

The treasury is opposed to this plan. Anderson and his aides hope, in fact, that a dollar would find a drastic solution. They say they are optimistic the problem won't get as acute as it seems.

Mitchell Says Ike's Plan for Labor Is Best

WASHINGTON, March 4—Secretary of Labor James P. Mitchell urged congress today to continue control legislation that is "neither too heavy-handed nor too lenient."

Mitchell, opening two days of scheduled testimony before a house labor subcommittee, said in a prepared statement by legislation can try to do too much and cause new problems. It can do existing problems and leave the public unprotected.

The plan backed by the Eisenhower administration's labor law proposals fill the bill.

Mitchell was the major question got under way in the house.

The main concern of the administration in developing this program, Mitchell said, "has been the protection of the individual rights of the working men and women and the interests of the public in the industry which will aid and not hinder the furtherance of the growth of legitimate trade unions."

Other bills filed

The subcommittee also is considering a house version of the senate bill drafted by Sen. John F. Kennedy, D. Mass., and a far-reaching labor control bill by Chairman Charles McNamara, D. N. C., of the labor committee.

Barden's proposals, Mitchell argued in effect, go too far; Kennedy's not far enough.

Mitchell particularly criticized the Kennedy measure for what he termed its "failure to deal with the matters of blackmail picketing and the boycotts—in the secondary boycott provision."

Blackmail picketing is the term used to describe picketing designed to coerce an employer to recognize a certain union or his employees to join it against their will.

A secondary boycott occurs when a union involved in a labor dispute applies pressure to a third party in an effort to win concessions from the employer being struck.

Better Pictures Of Papers Urged

STANFORD, Calif., March 4 (UPI)—A Stanford university research team said today suburban newspaper executives should establish a citizens' advisory council to promote "better" understanding between the hometown press and public.

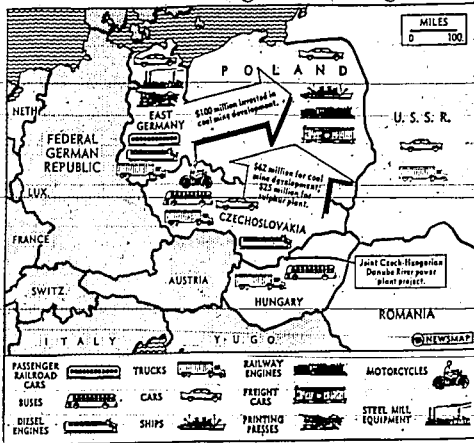
The team said a four-state survey showed readers have an "appalling ignorance" of their newspaper's objectives and motives of their daily newspapers—and editorial executives have little idea of what the public thinks of their products.

The test, with 86 questions, was printed by newspapers in seven communities in Washington, Oregon, California and Texas. Circulation of the newspapers ranged on a sliding scale from 218,000 daily to 19,000 daily.

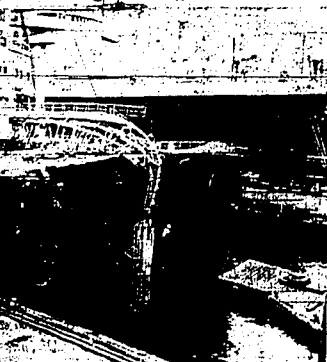
Most Mechanized Postoffice In World Is Started in East

The London Times commented: "With the Atlantic wind came a declining force, the German chancellor an old, unshiny man, and the British prime minister a man preoccupied with other problems, the responsibility falling on the British voters minister to lead the alliance sensibly and yet strongly in the weeks ahead is paramount."

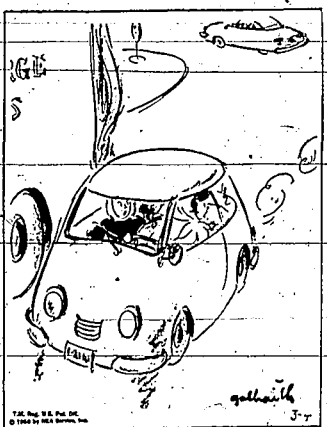

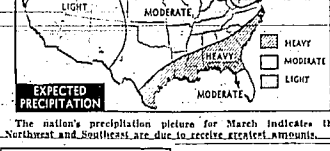
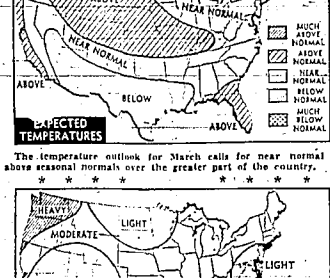
