PIONEER'S SIGNIFICANCE: With our new Pioneer IV satellite racing out toward an orbit about the sun, we have given fresh notice that the great East-West struggle in outer space is just as competitive as on the earth itself.

When the Russians put what they briefly called 'Lunik and now call Moelia' into space early this year, the achievement was admittedly a stunner. Never before had man thrust an earth object out beyond the pull of the earth's gravity...

Now space experts in America doubt we would shortly be matching the distance aspect of this feat, as we now seem to have done 'some of our earlier "moonshots" had missed by fractions attaining the needed speed to escape the earth's pull...

In fact, the Russians' ability to develop a powerful thrust and loss objects of substantial weight into space seems to be their chief superiority right now in the space-mischievous field.

Scientists believe we will eventually catch up in the matter and that meantime ourselves are showing consistent superiority in the equally vital field of guidance and control of missiles.

To be sure, we did not this time succeed in an immensely delicate task of timing required to launch a rocket into orbit around the moon. But the sober, uncomplacent betting among U.S. space specialists is that we probably have the best chance of being first at succeeding.

Son of T. F. Couple Receives Award for Study of Kidneys

Dr. Gordon D. Haynie, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. C. Haynie, 311 1/2 Sprague street, north, Twin Falls, Idaho, has received the Distinguished Fellowship from the Medical Foundation, Inc., a United Fund agency, for the purpose of investigating the function of the kidneys at the New England Center hospital, Boston, the "firefighter" role of the kidneys.

Under healthy conditions, the main assignment of the kidneys is to convey oxygen to the blood and to extract from it carbon dioxide, which is exhaled as a gas. When the lungs are not up to this emergency, the kidneys come to their aid by helping to "neutralize" carbon dioxide in the blood.

"To support Dr. Haynie in his efforts to discover new facts about the kidneys, and the way they back up the lungs during respiratory ailments, the Medical Foundation has awarded him a three-year fellowship for basic research."

Dr. Haynie, a native of Twin Falls, went to Boston from the University of Oregon medical school at Portland. He is associated with Dr. William B. Swartz, professor of medicine at the Tufts university school of medicine and a specialist in kidney diseases.

In order to test certain theories pertaining to the kidney, Dr. Haynie will conduct experiments on laboratory animals which have been kept for several months in an atmosphere of higher than normal amounts of carbon dioxide.

He will make precise measurements of their respiration, the level of carbon dioxide and bicarbonate in the blood and uric acid and their excretion of uric acid and other body chemicals.

This area of research is taking on increasing importance in view of mounting evidence that the excretory functions of the kidneys are really a by-product of their principal role. That is the regulation of the concentration and amounts of body chemicals and fluids.

Radars Net to Warn Against Red Missiles

MOLDAID SPRINGS, Colo., March 12—The American air defense command reported Thursday a long-range radar network built to warn against Soviet missile attacks. The network is being constructed as part of the Alaska and Greenland and will cover the Soviet land mass from the Pacific coast to the Atlantic.

The radar station chain is known as the ballistic early warning system (BEWFS). It contains one billion dollars worth of equipment, including Alaska and four at Clear, Greenland and two at the Cape. The system will be ready for operation next year and includes three radar centers at Clear, Alaska, and four at Tuck, Greenland. It also has a 3,000-mile range. They are intended to pick up Soviet missile launches 15 to 30 minutes in advance of launch. Both NORAD headquarters and the main air command at O'Hare will receive information on distance, speed and course of the missile.

The missiles would require about 30 minutes in flight to reach United States territory. The radar network would give the President or whoever has the command decision to launch in 30 minutes to decide whether a counter-attack would be made. Officials said they will use SAC bombers armed with hydrogen bombs.

Kiwanis Gets Service View On Proposal

U.S. forest service views on the proposed national wilderness areas were discussed by Twin Falls Kiwanis club members during their regular weekly luncheon meeting Thursday at the American Legion hall.

Three principal changes in the proposed bill are favored by forest service officials: the group was told by Fred Baugh, Sawtooth national forest staff officer.

The service proposes establishing a national wilderness preservation council to administer the act, believes that private areas now in national forests should be temporarily included in the wilderness system, but should remain there only if the secretary of agriculture determines them to be predominantly wilderness within 10 years, and holds that entry of the forest service into the areas to combat insects and forest diseases should be permitted without presidential authorization.

The bill has three objectives, Baugh said, first, it establishes a wilderness preservation congressional policy, applying this policy to areas of federal land where wilderness fits in with other programs; second, it makes it impossible for a bureau chief or cabinet officer to abolish a wilderness area, reduce its size or add to it by merely signing an executive order; third, it gives the public a voice in saying what will be done with wilderness areas through public hearings and making their officials in congress whopos of the system.

Also speaking to the group Thursday was Jim Johnston, Twin Falls future farmer of America student, who will compete in the state FFA speaking contest later this month. Johnston spoke to the group about "Careers in agriculture."

Included among guests at Thursday's meeting were Harry Turner, Ted Scott and William J. Lantz, the representatives in the state legislature.

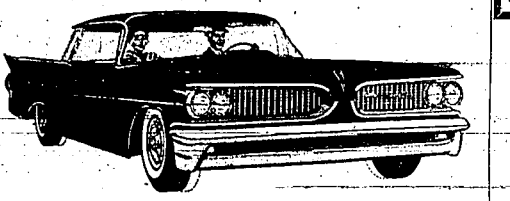
