New York state, which recently passed a new governor who never before had sought elective office, now has a new higher schedule of personal income taxes and a new political experiment to watch.

Nelson A. Rockefeller, millionaire grandson of the founder of Standard Oil, was elected last fall over Averell Harriman, another millionaire heir to one of the great fortunes left over from the days of the nation's pioneering expansion.

Rockefeller, who is immediately recognized as a potential opponent of Vice President Richard M. Nixon, for the Republican nomination in 1960.

Then Rockefeller made a decision. He said he had found the state's income to be far below its output.

To meet fixed obligations and services which he felt could not be provided, he faced the highest budget in the history—more than 20 billion dollars.

Rockefeller said, "All right, we've got to meet these bills. And at the same time we've got to balance the budget."

Guterman, a shadow figure who made his fortune in the Great Lakes in America and built an amazing industrial pyramid of holding companies, was indicted on charges of other illicit and three corporations.

The charges against Guterman were: Robert J. Kestel, former president, treasurer and member of the board of directors of the Jacobs Company. Guterman, Inc. a firm allegedly controlled by Guterman and Kestel, and Chatham Corporation, also already controlled by Guterman.

The grand jury also charged Guterman with the New York Stock Exchange and the SEC in not submitting reports about the Jacobs Company. The SEC recently suspended trading in the company's stock.

Yale Social Gate Closed After Brawl

NEW HAVEN, Conn., March 17 (AP)—Yale university officials closed the gates indefinitely yesterday to the public and indefinitely to the press.

The action came in the form of a memorandum placing the entire undergraduate body, about 3,000 students, on general probation. It followed two outbreaks within the last week in which 40 undergraduates were arrested.

The prohibition against and immediate expulsion for any undergraduate who publishes libelous material in the future. It did not, however, curtail any on-campus social functions.

Investigation Starts

Three Yale deans issued a statement saying that "a vigorous investigation" was under way to fix individual responsibility for the incident. A group of Yale students met with police and motorists Thursday and a Jersey Brawl with police Saturday. Patrick's day parade.

Yale officials are still considering the action to be taken on the more thorny problem of what to do with the 40 undergraduates who are due for court appearance tomorrow and 24 others.

It did say checks showed that Derabin was "thoroughly reliable, trustworthy and in full respect bona fide" and has rendered invaluable services to the United States.

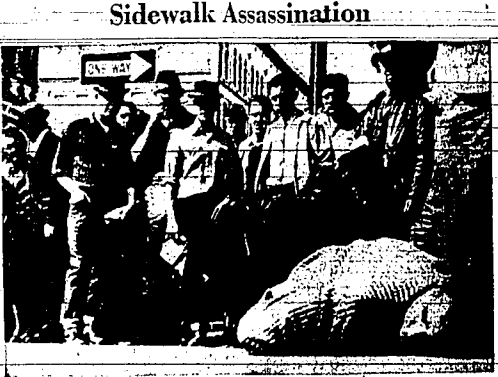
At the time of his flight to the West, Derabin was a Soviet intelligence officer in Vienna.

Asked by Richard Arent, committee staff director, whether the Soviet intelligence system used "phony detectors" to infiltrate foreign countries, Derabin said, "they use them very often."

Recruiting Spies Is Hard

"It is very hard now for Soviets to put their own agents inside the United States or other western countries," he testified. "It is very hard to recruit, actually, American people to be Soviet spies."

"For this reason they are using their own agents—they order them to go to the United States under political asylum, ask for political asylum, and then become Soviet spies. Through them they are going to find methods of American intelligence, how they are working."

WASHINGTON, March 17 (AP)—Jazz came to Washington last night under the most respectable auspices in town.

The list of patrons for the "Washington Jazz Jubilee" — a benefit for a well known settlement house here — started with Mrs. Dwight D. Eisenhower and Mrs. Richard M. Nixon and included 72 other persons of almost equal eminence.

Names Lent
Not all of them were present for the concert, but they lent their names willingly to the fund-raising affair.

The jazz program, a black tie occasion with a bottle of champagne at each table, was the brain child of Mrs. Richard Bolling, vice-presidential wife of the Democratic congressman from Missouri.

She made her plans carefully. A lecture by jazz historian Marshall Stearns early in March set the stage, followed by an exhibit called "The Seven Ages of Jazz" at the Library of Congress.

Board Convinced
By emphasizing "the cultural aspect" of jazz, she convinced the conservative board of trustees of Friendship house that a jazz concert might be suitable for raising money for the settlement.

Mrs. Bolling has been interested in jazz since girlhood in Kansas City. One time she made his mark and where the legendary Dennis Miller influenced a whole generation of jazz musicians.

She explained that her mother was very musical, but her motherly Willis Conover, jazz disc jockey for the Voice of America, wrote and narrated program notes for the show, carrying out the theme of a history of jazz "from Congo square (New Orleans) to Carnegie hall."
