FRANKFURT, Ky., March 18 (AP)—A Pike county coal operator and 18 prisoners in the area today today to send military aid to the situation in the struck coalfields is under control. The operator, Robert H. McElroy, sent the telegram claiming roving mobs of "United Mine Workers" thugs have taken over Pike county. Tests conducted by the health department laboratories here have not indicated the virus causing the illness, said A. W. Klotz, laboratory chief.

"Check" Prisoners May Get Release Under New Ruling

BOISE, March 18 (AP)—Prisoners serving terms in the Idaho state penitentiary on check charges may be given release as a result of a new law enacted by the Legislature. The law, which was signed yesterday, provides that prisoners on check charges may be given release if they wish to do so. The law reduces from a felony to a misdemeanor the writing of a check except on third offense. Persons convicted of check charges county-wide but not to the state prison. Clapp said the state board of pardons will hold a special session in April or early in May to consider possible release justified cases. He said 100 prisoners are serving sentences for check-law violations and in addition there are 70 others on parole who might be eligible for release. Clapp said the board is "reticent" to keep a person in prison for offenses which no longer is punishable by a prison term. He said he is asking an attorney general's opinion as to whether that law matters what the ruling of the board of pardons has to do with the law. He said he would grant parole if it wishes to do so. Atty. Gen. Frank Benson will be asked to issue a writ of habeas corpus retroactive to cover inmates now in prison. He said Benson also will be asked to issue a writ of habeas corpus retroactive to cover inmates who are on parole. Clapp emphasized there will be no release of "check" prisoners. The board will consider each case individually, and determine whether release is warranted. Clapp announced also that 20 applications for clemency have been received by the board for consideration by the board at its regular meeting beginning April 1.

Basic Prices For Support Of Grain Set

The minimum basic price support rate on 1959 crop wheat in Twin Falls county has been set at 65¢ per bushel according to Carl Byrum, chairman of the county agricultural stabilization and conservation committee.

The basic county rate is for No. 1 grade wheat. It is further adjusted up or down for grade and quality to determine the support price for the individual farmer. Most premiums and discounts for 1959 crop wheat support are the same as those in the 1958 program.

The discount of two cents per bushel on western red and white wheat classes (other than hard and durum) is being eliminated for 1959.

It will be previous years, the farmer will be able to obtain price support on his 1959 crop when either by getting a loan on farm-stored or warehouse-stored grain or by entering a government purchase agreement.

March Is Writing Off Last of Recession; Jobless Cut Seen

NEW YORK, March 18 (AP)—March is writing the last of the recession off many official statistics—such as industrial output—and pointing toward new records.

It undoubtedly is setting new highs in others such as personal incomes today.

With each day comes more hope that soon there will be ending in the total of the jobless. Outdoors jobs will be opening up.

That March is wiping out the recession's last mark in total industrial output can be assumed from these things:

1. In February the federal reserve board's index was up to 144 per cent of the 1927-1929 average, only one point under the pre-recession figure of August, 1927, and two points below the record high set just two years before.

2. This month increased activity along many lines all but assures a further advance. Steel mills are setting new tonnage records week by week.

"Demand for copper" exceeds the supply. Aluminum companies report an encouraging jump in demand in recent weeks. Rubber consumption by factories is in a sharp rise. Some railroads are reporting increased freight traffic.

3. Spurred by fears of summer strikes, company after company is laying in inventories. The only way the federal reserve industrial output index can go in March is up.

That the total of personal income will set a new record this month seems just as sure.

The commerce department reports that in February the annual rate hit a peak of 364½ billion dollars. This topped the year ago figure by 17 billion dollars. At that time it was the low for the recession.

Part of the rise in incomes will be absorbed away by rising taxes at many local and state levels.

While it is hoped that retail prices will stay fairly steady, the steady but sure rise in the cost of strikes is set to continue. That will whittle away some more of the income gain.

Also it can't be ignored that much of the industrial activity is more in fear than in hope. Major strikes could bring on shortages and raise the material costs.

That's why businessmen are building up stocks. When they're built high enough, orders may dwindle.
